ORDINANCE NO. 867 ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE RENTAL HABITABILITY ORDINANCE OF CHAMPAIGN COUNTY

WHEREAS, the Residential Tenants' Right to Repair Act (765 ILCS 742 et seq) allows a tenant to make minor repairs to rental property and to deduct the cost of the repair from the rent subject to specified requirements and limitations, if the repair is required under a local ordinance or regulation.

WHEREAS, Champaign County has not adopted a building code or a property maintenance code and therefore renters in unincorporated Champaign County have no local ordinance or regulation on which to rely for repairs under the Residential Tenants' Right to Repair Act.

WHEREAS, the Committee of the Whole has recommended adoption of the ordinance proposed herein;

WHEREAS, the Champaign County Board believes it is for the best interests of the County and for the public good and welfare to adopt the Rental Habitability Ordinance of Champaign County in a manner hereinafter provided;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Champaign County Board, Champaign County, Illinois, that the *Rental Habitability Ordinance of the County of Champaign*, *Illinois*, be adopted in the form attached hereto.

- 1. Title. This ordinance shall be known as the "Rental Habitability Ordinance of Champaign County, Illinois".
- 2. Purpose. The provisions of this ordinance shall apply to all residential rental properties and shall constitute the minimum maintenance requirements necessary to ensure adequate habitability of residential rental buildings except for any additional relevant requirements in the Champaign County Nuisance Ordinance.
- 3. Applicability. The provisions of this ordinance shall not apply to any of the requirements for residential rental property maintenance that are included herein that are identified as the <u>responsibility of the tenant</u> in a written lease except requirement 7.I. that is non-transferable by lease.
- 4. Enforcement. The minimum maintenance requirements for habitability established by this ordinance are not enforced by Champaign County but are specifically intended to be relevant to tenant claims under the Residential Tenants' Right to Repair Act (765 ILCS 742 et seq) and to further the authority granted by 55 ILCS 5/5-1063 related to building maintenance.
- 5. Standard of maintenance quality. Repairs, maintenance work, alterations or installations required by this ordinance shall be performed in a reasonable manner and in compliance with any relevant manufacturer's requirements.
- 6. Definitions.

HABITABLE is any space for human occupation and use such as vestibules, hallways, stairways, corridors, living rooms, bedrooms, kitchens, pantries, bathrooms, closets, and storage spaces.

RENTAL UNIT is any dwelling unit, rooming unit, dormitory room, guestroom, or portion of a building that is that is rented, leased, or let.

OWNER is an individual, firm, association, syndicate, partnership, corporation, company, organization, trust, or any other legal entity having a proprietary interest in a building, property, lot, or tract of land.

ROOM is any interior HABITABLE space that is larger than 70 square feet and with a minimum horizontal dimension of eight feet.

TENANT is the person or persons that occupy a RENTAL UNIT.

- 7. Minimum maintenance requirements for habitability. The OWNER of any RENTAL UNIT is hereby required to maintain the premises and to promptly perform all needed repairs to any building containing a RENTAL UNIT and to each RENTAL UNIT including but not limited to repairs, maintenance, and services of the following types:
 - A. Building exterior. The building exterior shall be maintained in a structurally sound and weatherproof condition and free from holes, or defects that allow rain or weather to enter.
 - B. Exterior and interior stairs. All stairways shall meet the minimum egress requirements of the Illinois State Fire Marshal's Life Safety Code and be structurally sound and maintained in good repair.
 - C. Doors. All exterior doors, door assemblies, and hardware shall be maintained in good condition. Locks at all entrances to any RENTAL UNIT shall tightly secure the door.
 - D. Deadbolt locks. Doors providing access to any RENTAL UNIT shall be equipped with a deadbolt lock. Deadbolt locks shall have a minimum lock throw of at least 1-inch. A sliding bolt shall not be considered an acceptable deadbolt lock. Deadbolt locks shall be properly installed according to manufacturer's specifications and maintained in good working condition. All required deadbolt locks shall be designed and installed in such a manner so as to be operable from inside of the RENTAL UNIT by only a knob.
 - E. Building interior.
 - (1) All HABITABLE interior areas shall be maintained in good repair, structurally sound and in a sanitary condition.
 - (2) All interior surfaces, including windows and doors, shall be maintained in good repair and sanitary condition.
 - (3) Paint that is peeling, chipping, flaking, or abraded shall be repaired.
 - (4) Cracked or loose surfaces shall be repaired.

- F. Windows and skylights. Windows and skylights shall be maintained in good repair, and shall be structurally sound and weather tight.
 - (1) Glazing. All glazing materials shall be maintained free from cracks and holes.
 - (2) Openable windows. Windows that are not fixed windows shall be easily openable and with hardware capable of holding the window in an open position.
 - (3) Insect screens. Between May 14 to September 15 of every year each openable window in each HABITABLE room shall be provided a tightly fitting screen of not less 16 mesh per inch.
- G. Garbage facilities and service.
 - (1) Every occupied RENTAL UNIT shall be provided covered outdoor garbage containers for use by the tenant however multiple tenants may be provided with a single covered container provided it is of adequate size.
 - (2) Every occupied RENTAL UNIT shall be provided with regular and timely removal (pickup) of normal daily household waste.
- H. Plumbing and plumbing fixtures.
 - (1) All plumbing shall meet the requirements of the Illinois Plumbing Code.
 - (2) Plumbing fixtures including hot water heaters shall be properly installed and maintained in good working condition, and shall be kept free from obstructions, leaks, and defects.
- I. Heating. Each RENTAL UNIT shall be supplied with heat during the period from September 15 to May 15 of every year and sufficient to maintain a temperature of not less than 65° in all habitable rooms. This requirement shall be non-transferable by lease.
- J. Appliances. All mechanical appliances, fireplaces, solid fuel-burning appliances, cooking appliances (including refrigerator), and water heating appliances shall be

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properly installed and maintained in a good working condition and all necessary services (gas, electrical, etc.) required for operation shall be provided and in good working order.

- K. Electrical system and equipment.
 - (1) Each RENTAL UNIT shall be provided with an electrical system including electrical equipment, wiring, and appliances that shall be properly installed and maintained in a safe working condition.
 - (2) Each occupied RENTAL UNIT shall be provided with a working electrical service.
 - (3) Electrical outlets. Each habitable space shall be served by at least two separate and remote receptacle outlets except only one outlet shall be required per bathroom.
- L. Each building containing a RENTAL UNIT and each RENTAL UNIT shall be provided with smoke and carbon monoxide detectors as required by the Illinois State Fire Marshal's Life Safety Code.
- M. Each RENTAL UNIT shall be provided with a mailbox meeting the requirements of the U.S. Postal Service.
- 8. Severability, Publication, and Effective Date.
 - A. Severability. Should any part of this ordinance be declared invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such declaration shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.
 - B. Publication. Within 15 days of the adoption of this ordinance the County Clerk shall cause notice to be published in a newspaper of general circulation within the County stating that this ordinance has been adopted including the effective date of the ordinance and the availability of copies in the office of the Zoning Administrator.
 - C. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect ten days after the date of the publication.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING APPLICATION FOR PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE UNDER SECTION 5311 OF THE FEDERAL TRANSIT ACT OF 1991, AS AMENDED (49 U.S.C. § 5311).

WHEREAS, The provision of public transit service is essential to the transportation of persons in the non-urbanized area; and

WHEREAS, Section 5311 of the Federal Transit Act of 1991, as amended (49 U.S.C. § 5311), makes funds available to help offset certain operating deficits and administrative expenses of a system providing public transit service in non-urbanized areas; and

WHEREAS, Grants for said funds will impose certain obligations upon the recipient, including the provision by it of the local share of funds necessary to cover costs not covered by funds provided under Section 5311 of the Federal Transit Act of 1991, as amended (49 U.S.C. § 5311);

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED By the County Board of Champaign County:

Section 1. That an application be made to the Division of Public Transportation, Department of Transportation, State of Illinois, for a financial assistance grant under Section 5311 of the Federal Transit Act of 1991, as amended (49 U.S.C. § 5311), for the purpose of offsetting a portion of the Public Transportation Program operating deficits of *Champaign County*; as well as with the State of Illinois in order to obtain grant assistance under the provisions of the Illinois Downstate Public Transportation Act (30 ILCS 740/2-1, et.seq.).

- Section 2. That while participating in said operating assistance program, *Champaign County* will provide all required local matching funds.
- Section 3. That the CEO of CRIS Rural Mass Transit District is hereby authorized and directed to execute and file on behalf of *Champaign County* such application.
- Section 4. That the CEO of CRIS Rural Mass Transit District is authorized to furnish such additional information as may be required by the Division of Public Transportation and the Federal Transit Administration in connection with the aforesaid application for said grant.
- Section 5. That the CEO of CRIS Rural Mass Transit District is hereby authorized and directed to execute and file on behalf of *Champaign County* all required Grant Agreements with the Illinois Department of Transportation, in order to obtain grant assistance under the provisions of the Section 5311 of the Federal Transit Act of 1991, as amended (49 U.S.C. § 5311) and with the State of Illinois in order to obtain grant assistance under the provisions of the Illinois Downstate Public Transportation Act (30 ILCS 740/2-1, et.seq.).

Section 6. That the CEO of CRIS Rural Mass Transit District is hereby authorized to provide such information and to file such documents as may be required to perform the Grant Agreement and to receive the grant.

RESOLUTION APPROVING ACCEPTANCE OF THE SPECIAL WARRANTY

WHEREAS, Section 5311 of the Federal Transit Act of 1964, as amended, makes funds available to help offset certain operating deficits of a system providing public transit service in non-urbanized areas; and

WHEREAS, A simplified process for assuring employee protections that accommodates the needs of participants in the Section 53ll program has been agreed upon by the U.S. Department of Labor and the U.S. Department of Transportation by allowing execution of a Special Section 5333(b) Warranty for Section 53ll projects (Special Warranty), which the Secretary of Labor certified on May 31, 1979;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED By the County Board of Champaign County:

Section 1. That an application be made to the Division of Public Transportation, Department of Transportation, State of Illinois, for a financial assistance grant under Section 5311 of the Federal Transit Act of 1964, as amended.

Section 2. As a condition of the receipt of Section 5311 funds, Champaign County hereby agrees in writing to the terms and conditions of the Special Warranty (attached) regarding fair and equitable arrangements to protect the interests of employees affected by such assistance.

SPECIAL SECTION 5333(b) WARRANTY FOR APPLICATION TO THE SMALL URBAN AND RURAL PROGRAM

The following language shall be made part of the contract of assistance with the State or other public body charged with allocation and administration of funds provided under 49 U.S.C. Section 5311:

A. General application

The Public Body ("Champaign County") agrees that, in the absence of waiver by the Department of Labor, the terms and conditions of this warranty, as set forth below, shall apply for the protection of the transportation related employees of any employer providing transportation services assisted by the Project ("Recipient"), and the transportation related employees of any other surface public transportation providers in the transportation service area of the Project.

The Public Body shall provide to the Department of Labor and maintain at all times during the Project an accurate, up-to-date listing of all existing transportation providers which are eligible Recipients of transportation assistance funded by the Project, in the transportation service area of the Project, and any labor organizations representing the employees of such providers.

Certification by the Public Body to the Department of Labor that the designated Recipients have indicated in writing acceptance of the terms and conditions of the warranty arrangement will be sufficient to permit the flow of Section 5311 funding in the absence of a finding of non-compliance by the Department of Labor.

B. Standard Terms and Conditions

(1) The Project shall be carried out in such a manner and upon such terms and conditions as will not adversely affect employees of the Recipient and of any other surface public transportation provider in the transportation service area of the Project. It shall be an obligation of the Recipient and any other legally responsible party designated by the Public Body to assure that any and all transportation services assisted by the Project are contracted for and operated in such a manner that they do not impair the rights and interests of affected employees. The term "Project," as used herein, shall not be limited to the particular facility, service or operation assisted by Federal funds, but shall include any changes, whether organizational, or otherwise, which are a result of the assistance provided. The phrase "as a result of the Project," shall when used in this arrangement, include events related to the Project occurring in anticipation of, during, and subsequent to the Project and any program of efficiencies or economies related thereto; provided, however, that volume rises and falls of business, or changes in volume and character of employment brought about by causes other than the Project (including any economies or efficiencies unrelated to the Project) are not within the purview of this arrangement.

compensation and expenses of the impartial third party, and any other jointly incurred expenses, shall be borne equally by the parties to the proceeding and all other expenses shall be paid by the party incurring them.

In the event of any dispute as to whether or not a particular employee was affected by the Project, it shall be his obligation to identify the Project and specify the pertinent facts of the Project relied upon. It shall then be the burden of either the Recipient or other party legally responsible for the application of these conditions to prove that factors other than the Project affected the employees. The claiming employee shall prevail if it is established that the Project had an effect upon the employee even if other factors may also have affected the employee.

- (5) The Recipient or other legally responsible party designated by the Public Body will be financially responsible for the application of these conditions and will make the necessary arrangements so that any employee covered by these arrangements, or the union representative of such employee, may file claim of violation of these arrangements with the Recipient within sixty (60) days of the date he is terminated or laid off as a result of the Project, or within eighteen (18) months of the date his position with respect to his employment is otherwise worsened as a result of the Project. In the latter case, if the events giving rise to the claim have occurred over an extended period, the 18-month limitation shall be measured from the last such event. No benefits shall be payable for any period prior to six (6) months from the date of the filing of any claim.
- (6) Nothing in this arrangement shall be construed as depriving any employee of any rights or benefits which such employee may have under existing employment or collective bargaining agreements, nor shall this arrangement be deemed a waiver of any rights or any union or of any represented employee derived from any other agreement or provision of federal, state or local law.
- (7) In the event any employee covered by these arrangements is terminated or laid off as a result of the Project, he shall be granted priority of employment or reemployment to fill any vacant position within the control of the Recipient for which he is, or by training or retraining within a reasonable period, can become qualified. In the event training or retraining is required by such employment or reemployment, the Recipient or other legally responsible party designated by the Public Body shall provide or provide for such training or retraining at no cost to the employee.
- (8) The Recipient will post, in a prominent and accessible place, a notice stating that the Recipient has received federal assistance under 49 U.S.C. Chapter 53 and has agreed to comply with the provisions of 49 U.S.C. Section 5333(b). This notice shall also specify the terms and conditions set forth herein for the protection of employees. The Recipient shall maintain and keep on file all relevant books and records in sufficient detail as to provide the basic information necessary to the proper application, administration, and enforcement of these arrangements and to the proper determination of any claims arising thereunder.
- (9) Any labor organization which is the collective bargaining representative of employees covered by these arrangements, may become a party to these

arrangements by serving written notice of its desire to do so upon the Recipient and the Department of Labor. In the event of any disagreement that such labor organization represents covered employees, or is otherwise eligible to become a party to these arrangements, as applied to the Project, the dispute as to whether such organization shall participate shall be determined by the Secretary of Labor.

(10) In the event the Project is approved for assistance under 49 U.S.C. Chapter 53, the foregoing terms and conditions shall be made part of the contract of assistance between the federal government and the Public Body or Recipient of federal funds; provided, however, that this arrangement shall not merge into the contract of assistance, but shall be independently binding and enforceable by an upon the parties thereto, and by any covered employee or his representative, in accordance with its terms, nor shall any other employee protective agreement merge into this arrangement, but each shall be independently binding and enforceable by and upon the parties thereto, in accordance with its terms.

C. Waiver

As part of the grant approval process, either the Recipient or other legally responsible party designated by the Public Body may in writing seek from the Secretary of Labor a waiver of the statutory required protections. The Secretary will waive these protections in cases, where at the time of the requested waiver, the Secretary determines that there are no employees of the Recipient or of any other surface public transportation providers in the transportation service area who could be potentially affected by the Project. A 30-day notice of proposed waiver will be given by the Department of Labor and in the absence of timely objection, the waiver will become final at the end of the 30-day notice period. In the event of timely objection, the Department of Labor will review the matter and determine whether a waiver shall be granted. In the absence of waiver, these protections shall apply to the Project.

¹Such protective arrangements shall include, without being limited to, such provisions as may be necessary for (1) the preservation of rights, privileges, and benefits (including continuation of pension rights and benefits) under existing collective bargaining agreements or otherwise; (2) the continuation of collective bargaining rights; (3) the protection of individual employees against a worsening of their positions with respect to their employment; (4) assurances of employment to employees of acquired mass transportation systems and priority of reemployment of employees terminated or laid off; and (5) paid training and retraining programs. Such arrangements shall include provisions protecting individual employees against a worsening of their positions with respect to their employments which shall in no event provide benefits less than those established pursuant to 49 U.S.C. Section 11347 [the codified citation of Section 5(2)(f) of the Act of February 4, 1887 (24 Stat. 379), as amended]. Return to original reference point.

- Section 4. That the CEO of CRIS Rural Mass Transit District is hereby authorized and directed to execute and file on behalf of the County of Champaign a Grant Application to the Illinois Department of Transportation.
- Section 5. That the CEO of CRIS Rural Mass Transit District is hereby authorized and directed to execute and file on behalf of the County of Champaign all required Grant Agreements with the Illinois Department of Transportation.

<u>FY2011 HEALTH INSURANCE PLAN</u>

RECOMMENDATION FOR FY2011 HEALTH INSURANCE PLAN

The following health insurance plan shall be made available to County employees, for FY2011:

Health Alliance POS-C250 Plan with Prescription drug benefit \$10/\$20/\$40

The County's contribution for health insurance for FY2011 shall be \$548/month, which is equal to the single premium cost for the POS-C250 Plan, for all non-bargaining employees with the exception of the non-bargaining employees of the Champaign County Nursing Home and Regional Planning Commission.

The County's contribution for health insurance for FY2011 shall be \$505.40/month for non-bargaining employees of the Champaign County Nursing Home.

The County's contribution for health insurance for FY2011 for non-bargaining employees of the Regional Planning Commission will be set by the Regional Planning Commission.

The County shall establish a Health Reimbursement Account (HRA) for every employee which will provide up to \$750 reimbursement per employee per year towards single out-of-pocket maximum costs in excess of \$1,500 or for the \$250 co-pay for MRI and CT scans, outpatient surgery, inpatient hospitalization or maternity care, as those expenses occur throughout the year. This reimbursement will be applied toward these expenses for the employee or their covered dependents, but is limited to \$750 per employee for FY2011.

Premium contributions for the County's bargaining employees will be consistent with current contract language.

RECOMMENDATION for FLEXIBLE SPENDING ACCOUNT LIMITS

The annual amount an employee may set aside in a flexible spending account for medical expenses will remain at \$3,600/year for FY2011.

RECOMMENDATION FOR FLEXIBLE SPENDING ACCOUNT/HEALTH REIMBURSEMENT ACCOUNT ADMINISTRATION

Champaign County Employee Flexible Spending Accounts will be administered by Benefit Planning Consultants, as the county's third party administrator for flexible spending and health reimbursement accounts for the plan year December 1, 2010 to November 30, 2011 at a rate of \$4.80/flexible spending account participant/month; and a rate of \$5.50/health reimbursement account participant/month. The total anticipated annual cost to the County is \$12,000.

RECOMMENDATION FOR FY2011 EMPLOYER PROVIDED LIFE INSURANCE

The life insurance benefit program for County Employees shall be through Lincoln Financial Group for the period December 1, 2010 to November 30, 2011 at a rate of \$.13 per \$1,000 of coverage per employee per month. The total anticipated annual cost to the County is \$21,600. The premium is paid by the County.

RECOMMENDATION FOR EMPLOYEE PAID OPTIONAL LIFE INSURANCE

The following optional life insurance program will be offered to county employees for FY2011, with the entire premium paid by the employee:

- 1. Optional Term Life insurance through Lincoln Financial Group premiums to be paid by the employee.
- 2. Optional Universal Life insurance through AllState Insurance Company premiums to be paid by the employee.

RECOMMENDATION FOR OPTIONAL VOLUNTARY INSURANCE

The following optional voluntary insurance programs will be offered to County employees for FY2011, with the entire premium paid by the employee:

- 1. Voluntary Group Accident insurance through AllState Insurance Company premiums to be paid by the employee.
- 2. Voluntary Group Cancer insurance through AllState Insurance Company premiums to be paid by the employee.

RECOMMENDATION FOR DENTAL INSURANCE

The dental insurance benefit program offered to County Employees shall be through Delta Dental with a two-year rate guarantee for the policy period January 1, 2011 to December 31, 2012. The entire premium is paid by the employee.

ORDINANCE NO. 872 ORDINANCE AMENDING ZONING ORDINANCE RECLASSIFYING CERTAIN PROPERTY

671-AM-10

WHEREAS, the Champaign County Zoning Board of Appeals held a public hearing, made a formal recommendation for approval, and forwarded to this Board Zoning Case Number 671-AM-10;

WHEREAS, the Champaign County Board believes it is for the best interests of the County and for the public good and welfare to amend the Champaign County Zoning Ordinance in a manner hereinafter provided;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Champaign County Board, Champaign County, Illinois, as follows:

1. That Resolution No. 971, *The Zoning Ordinance of the County of Champaign, Illinois*, be amended by reclassifying from AG-2 Agriculture to B-4 General Business the following described real estate:

Beginning at a point on the South line of the Southeast Quarter, in Section 33, in Township 22 North, Range 10 East of the Third Principal Meridian, Champaign County, lying 1330.55 feet West of the Southeast corner of said Southeast Quarter, Section 33; thence continuing West along said South line of Southeast Quarter, Section 33, 136.09 feet to the Centerline of the North to South Dillsburg Special Drainage Ditch; thence Northerly along the Centerline of said Drainage Ditch to a point on the South right-of-way line of the Illinois Central Railroad lying 1509.53 feet West of the East line of said Southeast Quarter, Section 33; thence Easterly along said south right-of-way line 160.75 feet to a point; thence Southerly 1291.03 feet to the point of beginning, excepting that portion of the right-of-way of State Bond Issue Route 119 along the South line of the above described tract, as shown in Deeds Records Book 557 at page 353 in the County Recorder's Office, Champaign County Courthouse, Urbana, Illinois, and lying in the Southeast Quarter of Section 33, in Township 22 North, Range 10 East of the Third Principal Meridian, Champaign County, Illinois.

- 2. That the reclassification of the above described real estate be subject to the following conditions:
 - A. The owners of the subject property hereby recognize and provide for the right of agricultural activities to continue on adjacent land consistent with the Right to Farm Resolution 3425.
 - B. Business use of the entire property shall not generate more wastewater than the equivalent of a three bedroom dwelling as specified in the Illinois Private Sewage

Disposal Licensing Code.

- C. The Zoning Administrator shall not approve a Zoning Use Permit on the subject property without a letter from the Champaign County Health Department certifying as follows:
 - (1) The proposed use will not generate more wastewater than a three bedroom dwelling; and
 - (2) In the case that a new onsite wastewater disposal system is installed, the owner has consulted with the County Health Department and has identified the most appropriate location on the property for a wastewater treatment and disposal system and said location will be fenced and protected during other construction activities.
 - (3) In the case that an existing wastewater treatment and disposal system is used, the owner has consulted with the County Health Department and has determined whether the existing system is adequate for the proposed use of the property, identified the location of the existing system, and that said location will be fenced and protected during construction activities.
- D. The Zoning Administrator shall not approve any Zoning Use Permit on the subject property unless the Zoning Use Permit Application includes floor plans for all buildings that explicitly indicate whether floor drains will be provided.
- E. The Zoning Administrator shall not approve a Zoning Compliance Certificate without the following documentation:
 - (1) Any floor drain must have been approved by the Illinois Plumbing Code Inspector.
 - (2) If the Certificate is approved after July 1, 2011, there must be a certification that the building complies with the 2006 edition of the International Building Code as required by 20 ILCS 3105/10.091.
- F. The petitioners shall provide IDOT with all information necessary to either approve the existing driveway for the proposed use or to determine what improvements are necessary to meet IDOT standards.
- G. The Zoning Administrator shall not approve a Zoning Use Permit for the subject property without documentation of IDOT's approval of either the existing driveway entrance or the existing driveway with necessary improvements.

- H. The Zoning Administrator shall not issue a Zoning Compliance Certificate without documentation of IDOT's approval of any newly constructed driveway entrance including any necessary as-built engineering drawings.
- 3. By changing the boundary lines of the Zoning Map in accordance with the provisions hereof.

RESOLUTION allocating qualified energy conservation bond volume cap received by The County of Champaign, Illinois.

* * *

WHEREAS, in October, 2008, as part of the Energy Improvement Extension Act of 2008, which was included in the Emergency Economic Stabilization Act of 2008 (the "Stabilization Act"), Congress enacted Section 54D of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), permitting State and local governments to issue qualified energy conservation bonds to finance qualified conservation purposes; and

WHEREAS, in February, 2009, as part of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (the "Recovery Act" and, together with the Stabilization Act, "Applicable Law"), Congress, inter alia, increased the volume limitation for qualified energy conservation bonds; and

WHEREAS, if such bonds meet certain conditions as set forth in the Applicable Law, qualified energy conservation bonds are eligible for a direct payment by the United States Treasury (the "*Treasury*") to the issuer of a portion of the interest coming due thereon, thereby affording potential economic benefits to the issuer of such bonds; and

WHEREAS, the proceeds of qualified energy conservation bonds must be used to pay for one or more "qualified conservation purposes" as defined in Applicable Law; and

WHEREAS, Applicable Law further requires that qualified energy conservation bonds can be issued by a State or unit of local government pursuant to an allocation by the Secretary of the Treasury (the "Secretary") of a portion of a nationwide volume limitation; and

WHEREAS, a State or unit of local government that receives a portion of the nationwide volume cap may allocate all or a portion of such volume cap to ultimate beneficiaries; and

WHEREAS, the Secretary has heretofore awarded the State of Illinois an allocation of \$133,846,000 for qualified energy conservation bonds; and

WHEREAS, the Governor's Office of Management and Budget has heretofore allocated a portion of its qualified energy conservation bond allocation in the amount of \$2,021,135 to The County of Champaign, Illinois (the "County") (being the "Champaign County QECB Allocation"); and

WHEREAS, the County Board of the County (the "Board") hereby deems it advisable, necessary and in the best interests of the County that the County allocate all or a portion of the Champaign County QECB Allocation to the school districts listed on Exhibit A attached hereto (collectively, the "School Districts") to be used for qualified conservation purposes under Applicable Law:

Now, Therefore, Be It and It Is Hereby Resolved by the County Board of The County of Champaign, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. Incorporation of Preambles. The Board hereby finds that all of the recitals contained in the preambles to this Resolution are full, true and correct and does incorporate them into this Resolution by this reference.

Section 2. Champaign County QECB Allocation. The Board hereby allocates the Champaign County QECB Allocation to the School Districts to be used for qualified conservation purposes under Applicable Law. A breakdown of the Champaign County QECB Allocation among the School Districts is set forth in Exhibit A.

Section 3. Severability. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Resolution shall be held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this Resolution.

RESOLUTION designating The County of Champaign, Illinois, as a recovery zone and allocating recovery zone economic development bond volume cap received by said County.

* * *

WHEREAS, in order to assist state and local governments in financing capital projects at lower borrowing costs and to stimulate the economy and create jobs, on the 17th day of February, 2009, President Obama signed the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (the "Stimulus Act") which Stimulus Act authorizes, *inter alia*, the issuance of "build America bonds" for the payment of capital expenditures; and

WHEREAS, if such bonds meet certain conditions as set forth in the Stimulus Act, "build America bonds" are eligible for a direct payment by the United States Treasury (the "*Treasury*") to the issuer of thirty-five percent (35%) of the interest coming due thereon, thereby affording potential economic benefits to the issuer of such bonds; and

WHEREAS, a bond that qualifies as a "build America bond" under the Stimulus Act may further qualify to be designated as a "recovery zone economic development bond;" and

WHEREAS, bonds which are designated at or prior to their issuance by the issuer as "recovery zone economic development bonds" are eligible for a direct payment by the United States Treasury to the issuer of forty-five percent (45%) of the interest coming due thereon instead of the thirty-five percent (35%) otherwise payable; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Stimulus Act the proceeds of recovery zone economic development bonds must be used to pay for one or more "qualified economic development purposes" in a "recovery zone" designated by the issuer, each as defined in the Stimulus Act; and

WHEREAS, "qualified economic development purposes," as defined in the Stimulus Act, include expenditures for public infrastructure and construction of public facilities; and

WHEREAS, the County Board of The County of Champaign, Illinois, has heretofore designated the County as a "recovery zone" for all purposes of and as provided in the Stimulus Act; and

WHEREAS, the Stimulus Act further requires that recovery zone economic development bonds can be issued by a State or unit of local government pursuant to an allocation by the Secretary of the Treasury (the "Secretary") of a portion of a nationwide volume limitation; and

WHEREAS, a State or unit of local government that receives a portion of the nationwide volume cap may allocate all or a portion of such volume cap to ultimate beneficiaries, in any reasonable manner such State or unit of local government shall determine in good faith, to be used for qualified economic development purposes under the Stimulus Act; and

WHEREAS, the Secretary has heretofore awarded the County an allocation of \$2,349,000 for recovery zone economic development bonds (being the "Recovery Zone Economic Development Bond Allocation"); and

WHEREAS, the Board hereby deems it advisable, necessary and in the best interests of the County that the County allocate a portion of the Recovery Zone Economic Development Bond Allocation to the school districts listed on *Exhibit A* attached hereto (collectively, the "School Districts") to be used for qualified economic development purposes under the Stimulus Act:

Now, Therefore, Be It and It Is Hereby Resolved by the County Board of The County of Champaign, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. Incorporation of Preambles. The Board hereby finds that all of the recitals contained in the preambles to this Resolution are full, true and correct and does incorporate them into this Resolution by this reference.

Section 2. Recovery Zone Economic Development Bond Allocation. The Board hereby allocates the Recovery Zone Economic Development Bond Allocation to the School Districts to

be used for qualified economic development purposes under the Stimulus Act. A breakdown of

the Recovery Zone Economic Development Bond Allocation among the School Districts is set

forth in Exhibit A.

Section 3. Severability. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this

Resolution shall be held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the invalidity or

unenforceability of such section, paragraph or provision shall not affect any of the remaining

provisions of this Resolution.

Payment shall be made within a reasonable period of time following the notice of the receiving Party of the actual costs incurred. "Costs" as referred to in this paragraph include the actual cost of the assistance provided, but, do not include any costs which are incurred under the indemnification provision, set forth in the following paragraph.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the County Board does hereby approve and authorize the amendment to Section 6.5 of the RECG Intergovernmental Agreement as a party to the agreement.
