located at 506 South Prairieview Road, Mahomet.

Petitioner: Parkhill Enterprises, LLC

STATUS

This item was left off of the Agenda for the June 6, 2012 ELUC meeting. It is hoped that the Board will suspend the rule requiring Agenda items to be referred from Committee and decide this amendment at the June 20 meeting so that the petitioner will not lose time due to the staff error regarding the ELUC Agenda.

At their May 16, 2013, meeting the Zoning Board of Appeals (ZBA) voted 5 to 0 with one member absent, to "**RECOMMEND ENACTMENT**" of this amendment to change the zoning district designation from the AG-2 Agriculture Zoning District to the B-3 Highway Business Zoning District on 0.877 acre to allow for the expansion of the existing Super Pantry Convenience Store at 506 South Prairieview Road, Mahomet.

The ZBA found that the proposed map amendment "WILL HELP ACHIEVE" the Champaign County Land Resource Management Plan and "IS CONSISTENT" with the *LaSalle* and *Sinclair* factors and "WILL HELP ACHIEVE" the Purpose of the Zoning Ordinance. The Summary Finding of Fact is attached.

The subject property is adjacent to the existing Super Pantry Convenience Store on Prairieview Road and is located in the "Contiguous Urban Growth Area" established in the Land Resource Management Plan and is already served by sanitary sewer and public water.

No best prime farmland will be used for this expansion of an existing business.

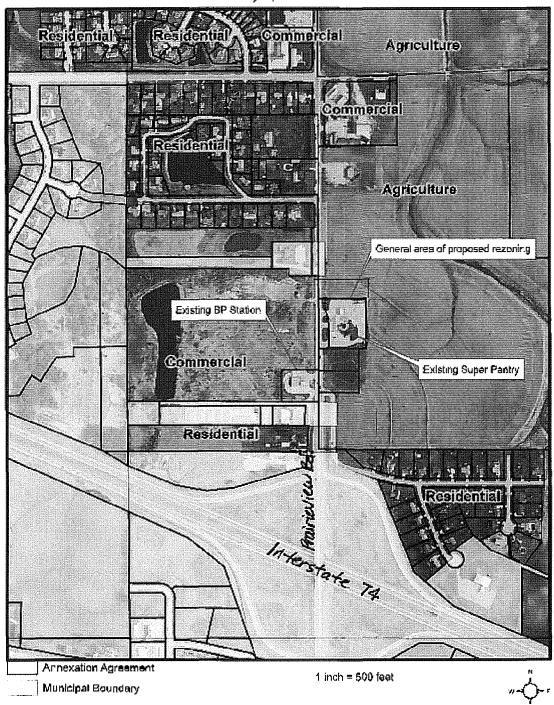
The Village of Mahomet Board has decided not to protest the map amendment. The Village will be reviewing (approving) a Plat of Subdivision for the project.

The ZBA recommended a special condition to ensure that storm water drainage and detention is not overlooked during platting and permitting. See the Draft Adopting Ordinance.

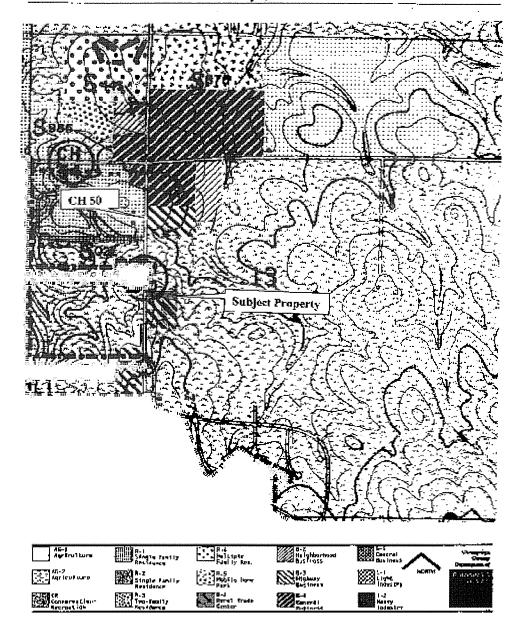

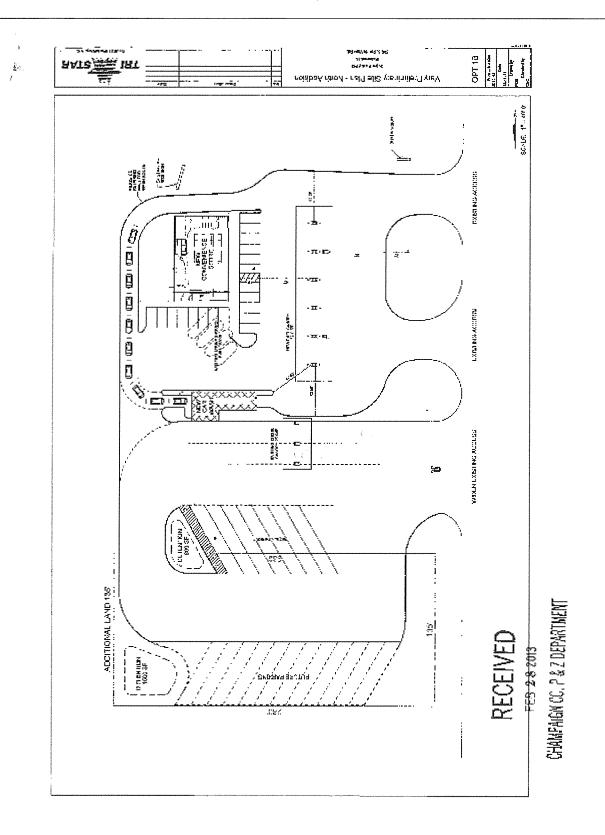
Attachment A: Land Use Map Case 746-AM-13 May 8, 2013

Attachment C. Summary Finding of Fact JUNE 12, 2013

SUMMARY FINDING OF FACT

From the documents of record and the testimony and exhibits received at the public hearing conducted on May 16, 2013, the Zoning Board of Appeals of Champaign County finds that:

- 1. The proposed amendment will **HELP ACHIEVE** the Land Resource Management Plan because of the following (objectives and policies are very briefly summarized):
 - A. The proposed map amendment will **HELP ACHIEVE** the following LRMP goals:

Goal 4 Agriculture because while it will either not impede or is not relevant to the other Objectives and Policies under this goal, it will HELP ACHIEVE the following:

- Objective 4.1 requiring minimization of the fragmentation of farmland, conservation of farmland, and stringent development standards on best prime farmland because it will HELP ACHIEVE the following:
 - Policy 4.1.1 requiring that other land uses only be accommodated under very restricted conditions or in areas of less productive soils (see Item 14.A.(1)).
 - Policy 4.1.6 requiring that the use, design, site and location are consistent with policies regarding suitability, adequacy of infrastructure and public services, conflict with agriculture, conversion of farmland, and disturbance of natural areas (see Item 14.A.(2)).
- Objective **4.2 requiring discretionary development to not interfere with agriculture** because it will **HELP ACHIEVE** the following:
 - Policy 4.2.1 requiring a proposed business in a rural area to support agriculture or provide a service that is better provided in the rural area (see Item 14.B.(1)).
 - Policy 4.2.2 requiring discretionary development in a rural area to not interfere with agriculture or negatively affect rural infrastructure (see Item 14.B.(2)).
- Objective 4.3 requiring any discretionary development to be on a suitable site because it will HELP ACHIEVE the following:
 - Policy 4.3.1 requiring a discretionary development on other than best prime farmland to be suited overall (see Item 14.C.(1)).
 - Policy 4.3.3 requiring existing public services be adequate to support the proposed development effectively and safely without undue public expense (see Item 14.C.(2)).
 - Policy 4.3.4 requiring existing public infrastructure be adequate to support the proposed development effectively and safely without undue public expense (see Item 14.C.(3)).

Goal 5 Urban Land Use because while it will either not impede or is not relevant to the other Objectives and Policies under this goal, it will **HELP ACHIEVE** the following:

- Objective 5.1 ensure that the population growth and economic development is accommodated by new urban development in or adjacent to existing population centers because it will HELP ACHIEVE the following:
 - Policy 5.1.3 consider municipal ETJ areas that are served or that are planned to be served by sanitary sewer as contiguous urban growth areas (Item 15.A.(1)).
- Objective 5.3 requiring the County to oppose new urban development unless adequate utilities infrastructure, and public services are provided because it will HELP ACHIEVE the following:
 - Policy 5.3.1 require new urban development in unincorporated areas to be sufficiently served by available public services without undue public expense and encouraging other jurisdictions to do the same (Item 15.B.(1)).
 - Policy 5.3.2 require new urban development to be adequately served by public infrastructure without undue public expense and encouraging other jurisdictions to do the same (Item 15.B.(2)).

Goal 8 Natural Resources because while it will either not impede or is not relevant to the other Objectives and Policies under this goal, it will **HELP ACHIEVE** the following:

- Objective **8.2 requiring the County to conserve its soil resources** because it will **HELP ACHIEVE** the following:
 - Policy 8.2.1 requiring the County to minimize the conversion of farmland to non-agricultural development with special consideration for best prime farmland (Item 18.A.(1)).
- B. The proposed amendment will **NOT IMPEDE** the following LRMP goal(s):
 - Goal 1 Planning and Public Involvement
 - Goal 2 Governmental Coordination
 - Goal 3 Prosperity
 - Goal 6 Public Health and Public Safety
 - Goal 7 Transportation
 - Goal 10 Cultural Amenities
- C. The proposed amendment is **NOT RELEVANT** to the following LRMP goal(s):
 - Goal 9 Energy Conservation

- 2. The proposed Zoning Ordinance map amendment **IS** consistent with the *LaSalle* and *Sinclair* factors because:
 - The subject property is suitable for the proposed use.
 - The proposed map amendment is in general conformance with the Village of Mahomet's Comprehensive Land Use Plan Map.
- 3. The proposed Zoning Ordinance map amendment will **HELP ACHIEVE** the purpose of the **Zoning Ordinance** because it is consistent with all of the purposes of the Zoning Ordinance.

AMENDMENT TO THE OCTOBER 2012 AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE INSTITUTE FOR LAW & POLICY PLANNING (ILPP) and THE COUNTY OF CHAMPAIGN, ILLINOIS

The Institute for Law & Policy Planning (ILPP) and the County of Champaign, Illinois, agree to amendment to the terms and conditions of the contract executed in October 2012 for a Comprehensive Jail Needs Assessment, as follows:

<u>Article 2 – Scope of Services</u>. The scope of services for the contract have been expanded to include additional work including review and integration of the Community Justice Task Force Report; additional integration and planning based on input received from the public, County Board and elected officials in response to the DRAFT ILPP Report; and additional public engagement related to the final report.

<u>Article 3 – Time of Performance</u>. The final report by ILPP will be provided in September 2013 (rather than within 25 weeks after onsite commencement.)

<u>Article 4 – Compensation</u>. Additional compensation in the amount of \$25,000 will be paid for the additional scope of services provided.

<u>Article 5 – Method of Payment</u>. A 20% payment of the original contract fee will be released to ILPP on June 21, 2013. The final 20% (less initial \$3,000 signing payment), and additional \$25,000 (as documented in this Amendment to the Contract) in compensation shall be paid upon delivery of the final report.

B. Prohibited VARIANCES

At no time shall the BOARD, the Hearing Office or the GOVERNING BODY grant a VARIANCE in the following instances:

- 1. To grant a VARIANCE to allow a USE not permissible under the terms of this ordinance in the DISTRICT involved, or any USE expressly or by implication prohibited by the terms of this ordinance in said DISTRICT.
- 2. To waive compliance with any municipal, state, or federal regulation incorporated into this ordinance except as authorized in Section 13.
- 3. To waive compliance with any procedural requirement contained in this ordinance.
- 4. To waive compliance with regulations pertaining to NONCONFORMING LOTS, STRUCTURES, or USES, except as specifically authorized in Section 8.
- 5. To authorize any USE or CONSTRUCTION prohibited by Section 13.2.1.
- 6. To authorize a SMALL WIND TURBINE TOWER rotor diameter larger than 75 feet.

C. VARIANCE Criteria

- 1. A VARIANCE from the terms of this ordinance shall not be granted by the BOARD, the Hearing Officer or the GOVERNING BODY unless a written application for a VARIANCE is submitted demonstrating all of the following:
 - that special conditions and circumstances exist
 which are peculiar to the land or STRUCTURE
 involved which are not applicable to other similarly
 situated land or STRUCTURES elsewhere in the
 same zoning DISTRICT;
 - b. that practical difficulties or hardships created by carrying out the strict letter of the regulations sought to be varied prevent reasonable and

- otherwise permitted USE of the land or STRUCTURES or CONSTRUCTION on the LOT;
- c. that the special conditions, circumstances, hardships, or practical difficulties do not result from actions of the applicant;
- d. that the granting of the VARIANCE is in harmony with the general purpose and intent of this ordinance;
- e. that the granting of the VARIANCE will not be injurious to the neighborhood, or otherwise detrimental to the public health, safety, or welfare.
- 2. No NONCONFORMING USE of the neighboring lands or STRUCTURES in the same DISTRICT, and no permitted USE of lands or STRUCTURES in other DISTRICTS shall be considered grounds for the issuance of a VARIANCE.

D. Findings

- 1. The BOARD, the Hearing Officer or the GOVERING BODY shall make findings that the requirements of Section 9.1.9C have been met by the applicant for a VARIANCE, and justify the granting of the VARIANCE.
- 2. The BOARD, the Hearing Officer or the GOVERING BODY shall further make a finding that the VARIANCE is the minimum variation that will make possible the reasonable use of the land or STRUCTURE.

E. Conditions

1. In granting any VARIANCE, the BOARD, the Hearing Officer the GOVERING BODY may prescribe appropriate conditions and safeguards in conformity with this ordinance. Violation of conditions under which the VARIANCE is granted shall be deemed a violation of this ordinance and punishable as provided in Section 11.2.3 of this ordinance.

F. Action of the GOVERNING BODY

1. In the case of a written protest against a VARIANCE on land which is located within a township with a plan commission, and the plan commission objects to the VARIANCE, the township board of trustees shall submit its written objections to the GOVERNING BODY within

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15 days after the public hearing at the Zoning Board of Appeals, and such VARIANCE shall not be approved except by the favorable vote of three-fourths of all members of the GOVERNING BODY.

2. Revise Section 9.2.2 to read as follows:

9.2.2 Action of the GOVERNING BODY

- A. In case of a written protest against any such action:
 - 1. signed by the OWNER or OWNERS of at least 20% of the land to be rezoned; or
 - 2. signed by the OWNER or OWNERS of land immediately touching, or immediately across the street, alley, or public right-of-way from, at least 20% of the perimeter of the land to be rezoned; and filed with the County Clerk, such action shall not be passed except by the favorable vote of three-fourths of all the members of the GOVERNING BODY.
- B. In the case of a written protest against any such action concerning the alteration of the Zoning classifications of land which lies within one and one-half miles of the limits of a ZONED MUNICIPALITY such written protest signed and acknowledged by the city/village council or president and board of trustees of a ZONED MUNICIPALITY nearest adjacent, and filed with the County Clerk, such amendment shall not be passed except by the favorable vote of three-fourths of all the members of the GOVERNING BODY.
- C. In the case of a written protest against any such text amendment or map amendment affecting an unincorporated area of a township with a plan commission, the township board of trustees shall submit its written objections to the GOVERNING BODY within 30 days after the public hearing at the Zoning Board of Appeals, and such amendment shall not be approved except by the favorable vote of three-fourths of all members of the GOVERNING BODY.

3. Revise Section 13 to read as follows:

SECTION 13 NON-INTERFERENCE WITH GREATER RESTRICTIONS OTHERWISE IMPOSED

13.1 It is not intended by this ordinance to interfere with, or abrogate or annul any easements, restrictions, covenants, or other agreements between parties, nor to

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interfere with, or abrogate or annul any ordinances other than expressly repealed hereby. Rules, regulations, or permits previously adopted or issued, and not in conflict with any of the provisions of this ordinance, or which shall be adopted or provided shall remain in full force and effect except that where this ordinance imposes a greater restriction upon the USE of land or STRUCTURES, or upon the HEIGHT of STRUCTURES, or BUFFER STRIPS, COURTS, LOT AREA, LOT AREA per DWELLING UNIT or LODGING UNIT, BUILDING AREA, LOT COVERAGE, PARKING SPACES, SETBACK LINE, LOT width, or LOT depth, or any similar restrictions, than are required by or imposed by such ordinances, rules, regulations, or permits, the provisions of this ordinance shall control.

- **13.2.1** The BOARD or the GOVERNING BODY shall not approve VARIANCES or SPECIAL USE Permits, and the Zoning Administrator shall not issue Zoning Use Permits or Zoning Compliance Certificates when:
 - A. The CONSTRUCTION or USE would violate:
 - 1. the Champaign County Special Flood Hazard Area Development Ordinance (Ord. No 209, as amended);
 - 2. the *Illinois Plat Act* (765 ILCS 205/0.01 *et seq.*);
 - 3. the *Champaign County Subdivision Regulations* (Ord. No. 44, as amended);
 - 4. the SUBDIVISION regulations of a municipality where the LOT is within the jurisdiction of a municipality which has enacted SUBDIVISION regulations except for the following:
 - CONSTRUCTION or change of USE to establish or a. enlarge a water treatment plant or related facilities owned and operated by a predominately rural water district when such improvements are deemed necessary to serve the public health, safety, and well being of the residents of Champaign County when that CONSTRUCTION or change of USE is required to comply with municipal SUBDIVISION regulations including the requirement for annexation to a municipality and that municipality is a nonhome rule municipality and has its own water treatment plant and related facilities. The GOVERNING BODY may authorize a VARIANCE from the requirement for compliance with the municipal SUBDIVISION regulations if the municipality will not consider plat approval without the requirement for annexation provided as follows:
 - (1) In addition to all other requirements of Section 9.1.9 the water district shall include with the application

for VARIANCE a copy of a SUBDIVISION Plat for the subject property that has been prepared by a Licensed Illinois Surveyor in compliance with the technical platting requirements of the relevant municipal SUBDIVISION requirements but perfect compliance with the technical platting requirements shall not be required for the VARIANCE.

- (2) The recommendation by the BOARD and the action by the GOVERNING BODY shall include a special condition that the VARIANCE shall not confer GOVERNING BODY approval or support for violation of the technical platting requirements of the relevant municipal SUBDIVISION requirements.
- (3) The Zoning Administrator shall provide notice to the relevant municipality of the public hearing and the final determination for the VARIANCE and copies of any related Zoning Use Permit or Zoning Compliance Certificate that are authorized.
- 5. the Champaign County Health Ordinance (Ord. No. 573);
- 6. the *Champaign County Public Nuisance Ordinance* (Ord. No. 468, as amended): or
- 7. any license ordinance of Champaign County.
- B. The CONSTRUCTION or USE is located on a LOT or LOTS created in violation of said *Illinois Plat Act, Champaign County Subdivision Regulations* or municipal SUBDIVISION regulations except as provided for in 13.2.1A.4.a.
- C. An outstanding violation of the *Zoning Ordinance* or any regulation listed in Section 13.2.1A exists on the LOT except when:
 - 1. the Zoning Use Permit or Zoning Compliance Certificate is the sole impediment to correcting the violation;
 - 2. the BOARD finds that granting a VARIANCE or SPECIAL USE Permit will facilitate correction of any non-*Zoning Ordinance* violations;
 - 3. the VARIANCE, SPECIAL USE Permit, Zoning Use Permit or Compliance Certificate is required to effect any stipulation, agreement or court order resolving the violation; or

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4. a municipality or the Champaign County Health Department has the legal authority to waive compliance with a regulation and stipulates in writing that it has no objection to issuing the VARIANCE, SPECIAL USE Permit, Zoning Use Permit or Zoning Compliance Certificate.

13.2.2 The above provisions not withstanding, no VARIANCE, SPECIAL USE Permit, Zoning Use Permit or Zoning Compliance Certificate shall be denied for USE or CONSTRUCTION on LOTS created prior to May 21, 1991 solely because such LOTS were created in violation of the *Illinois Plat Act* or *Champaign County Subdivision Regulations* provided that such LOTS conform to all other applicable regulations and standards of this ordinance and the creation of such LOTS did not violate any applicable municipal SUBDIVISION ordinance in effect at the time such LOTS were created.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING APPLICATION FOR PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE UNDER SECTION 5311 OF THE FEDERAL TRANSIT ACT OF 1991, AS AMENDED (49 U.S.C. § 5311).

WHEREAS, the provision of public transit service is essential to the transportation of persons in the non-urbanized area; and

WHEREAS, Section 5311 of the Federal Transit Act of 1991, as amended (49 U.S.C. \$ 5311), makes funds available to help offset certain operating deficits and administrative expenses of a system providing public transit service in non-urbanized areas; and

WHEREAS, grants for said funds will impose certain obligations upon the recipient, including the provision by it of the local share of funds necessary to cover costs not covered by funds provided under Section 53ll of the Federal Transit Act of 1991, as amended (49 U.S.C. § 53ll).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY the Champaign County Board:

Section 1. That an application be made to the Division of Public and Intermodal Transportation, Department of Transportation, State of Illinois, for a financial assistance grant under Section 5311 of the Federal Transit Act of 1991, as amended (49 U.S.C. § 5311), for the purpose of off-setting a portion of the Public Transportation Program operating deficits of County of Champaign.

Section 2. That while participating in said operating assistance programs the <u>CRIS Rural Mass Transit</u> <u>District</u> will seek available state and federal grants as well as other revenue for all required provide local matching funds.

Section 3. That <u>County Administrator</u> of the <u>County of Champaign</u> is hereby authorized and directed to execute and file on behalf of the <u>County of Champaign</u> such application.

Section 4. That the <u>County Administrator</u> of the <u>County of Champaign</u> is authorized to furnish such additional information as may be required by the Division of Public and Intermodal Transportation and the Federal Transit Administration in connection with the aforesaid application for said grant.

Section 5. SPECIAL SECTION 5333(b) WARRANTY FOR APPLICATION TO THE SMALL URBAN AND RURAL PROGRAM

The following language shall be made part of the contract of assistance with the State or other public body charged with allocation and administration of funds provided under 49 U.S.C. Section 5311:

A. General application

The Public Body ("COUNTY OF CHAMPAIGN") agrees that, in the absence of waiver by the Department of Labor, the terms and conditions of this warranty, as set forth below, shall apply for the protection of the transportation related employees of any employer providing transportation services assisted by the Project ("Recipient"), and the transportation related employees of any other surface public transportation providers in the transportation service area of the Project.

The Public Body shall provide to the Department of Labor and maintain at all times during the Project an accurate, up-to-date listing of all existing transportation providers which are eligible Recipients of transportation assistance funded by the Project, in the transportation service area of the Project, and any labor organizations representing the employees of such providers.

Certification by the Public Body to the Department of Labor that the designated Recipients have indicated in writing acceptance of the terms and conditions of the warranty arrangement will be sufficient to permit the flow of Section 5311 funding in the absence of a finding of non-compliance by the Department of Labor.

B. Standard Terms and Conditions

(1) The Project shall be carried out in such a manner and upon such terms and conditions as will not adversely affect employees of the Recipient and of any other surface public transportation provider in the transportation service area of the Project. It shall be an obligation of the Recipient and any other legally responsible party designated by the Public Body to assure that any and all transportation services assisted by the Project are contracted for and operated in such a manner that they do not impair the rights and interests of affected employees. The term "Project," as used herein, shall not be limited to the particular facility, service or operation assisted by Federal funds, but shall include any changes, whether organizational, or otherwise, which are a result of the assistance provided. The phrase "as a result of the Project," shall when used in this arrangement, include events related to the Project occurring in anticipation of, during, and subsequent to the Project and any program of efficiencies or economies related thereto; provided, however, that volume rises and falls of business, or changes in volume and character of employment brought about by causes other than the Project (including any economies or efficiencies unrelated to the Project) are not within the purview of this arrangement.

An employee covered by this arrangement, who is not dismissed, displaced or otherwise worsened in his position with regard to his employment as a result of the Project, but who is dismissed, displaced or otherwise worsened solely because of the total or partial termination of the Project, discontinuance of Project services, or exhaustion of Project funding shall not be deemed eligible for a dismissal or displacement allowance within the meaning of paragraphs (6) and (7) of the Model agreement or applicable provisions of substitute comparable arrangements.

(2) (a) Where employees of a Recipient are represented for collective bargaining purposes, all Project services provided by that Recipient shall be provided under and in accordance with any collective bargaining agreement applicable to such employees which is then in effect.

- (2) (b) The Recipient or legally responsible party shall provide to all affected employees sixty (60) days' notice of intended actions which may result in displacements or dismissals or rearrangements of the working forces. In the case of employees represented by a union, such notice shall be provided by certified mail through their representatives. The notice shall contain a full and adequate statement of the proposed changes, and an estimate of the number of employees affected by the intended changes, and the number and classifications of any jobs in the Recipient's employment available to be filled by such affected employees.
- (2) (c) The procedures of this subparagraph shall apply to cases where notices involve employees represented by a union for collective bargaining purposes. At the request of either the Recipient or the representatives of such employees negotiations for the purposes of reaching agreement with respect to the applications of the terms and conditions of this arrangement shall commence immediately. If no agreement is reached within twenty (20) days from the commencement of negotiations, any party to the dispute may submit the matter to dispute settlement procedures in accordance with paragraph (4) of this warranty. The foregoing procedures shall be complied with and carried out prior to the institution of the intended action.
- (3) For the purpose of providing the statutory required protections including those specifically mandated by 49 U.S.C. Section 5333(b)l, the public Body will assure as a condition of the release of funds that the Recipient agrees to be bound by the terms and conditions of the National (Model) Section 5333(b) Agreement executed July 23, 1975, identified below, provided that other comparable arrangements may be substituted therefor, if approved by the Secretary of Labor and certified for inclusion in these conditions.
- (4) Any dispute or controversy arising regarding the application, interpretation, or enforcement of any of the provisions of this arrangement which cannot be settled by and between the parties at interest within thirty (30) days after the dispute or controversy first arises, may be referred by any such party to any final and binding disputes settlement procedure acceptable to the parties, or in the event they cannot agree upon such procedure, to the Department of Labor or an impartial third party designated by the Department of Labor for final and binding determination. The compensation and expenses of the impartial third party, and any other jointly incurred expenses, shall be borne equally by the parties to the proceeding and all other expenses shall be paid by the party incurring them. In the event of any dispute as to whether or not a particular employee was affected by the Project, it shall be his obligation to identify the Project and specify the pertinent facts of the Project relied upon. It shall then be the burden of either the Recipient or other party legally responsible for the application of these conditions to prove that factors other than the Project affected the employees. The claiming employee shall prevail if it is established that the Project had an effect upon the employee even if other factors may also have affected the employee.
- (5) The Recipient or other legally responsible party designated by the Public Body will be financially responsible for the application of these conditions and will make the necessary arrangements so that any employee covered by these arrangements, or the union representative of such employee, may file claim of violation of these arrangements with the Recipient within sixty (60) days of the date he is terminated or laid off as a result of the Project, or within eighteen (18) months of the date his position with respect to his employment is otherwise worsened as a result of the Project. In the latter case, if the events giving rise to the claim have occurred over an extended period, the 18-month limitation shall be measured from the last such event. No benefits shall be payable for any period prior to six (6) months from the date of the filing of any claim.
- (6) Nothing in this arrangement shall be construed as depriving any employee of any rights or benefits which such employee may have under existing employment or collective bargaining

agreements, nor shall this arrangement be deemed a waiver of any rights or any union or of any represented employee derived from any other agreement or provision of federal, state or local law.

- (7) In the event any employee covered by these arrangements is terminated or laid off as a result of the Project, he shall be granted priority of employment or reemployment to fill any vacant position within the control of the Recipient for which he is, or by training or retraining within a reasonable period, can become qualified. In the event training or retraining is required by such employment or reemployment, the Recipient or other legally responsible party designated by the Public Body shall provide or provide for such training or retraining at no cost to the employee.
- (8) The Recipient will post, in a prominent and accessible place, a notice stating that the Recipient has received federal assistance under 49 U.S.C. Chapter 53 and has agreed to comply with the provisions of 49 U.S.C. Section 5333(b). This notice shall also specify the terms and conditions set forth herein for the protection of employees. The Recipient shall maintain and keep on file all relevant books and records in sufficient detail as to provide the basic information necessary to the proper application, administration, and enforcement of these arrangements and to the proper determination of any claims arising thereunder.
- (9) Any labor organization which is the collective bargaining representative of employees covered by these arrangements, may become a party to these arrangements by serving written notice of its desire to do so upon the Recipient and the Department of Labor. In the event of any disagreement that such labor organization represents covered employees, or is otherwise eligible to become a party to these arrangements, as applied to the Project, the dispute as to whether such organization shall participate shall be determined by the Secretary of Labor.
- (10) In the event the Project is approved for assistance under 49 U.S.C. Chapter 53, the foregoing terms and conditions shall be made part of the contract of assistance between the federal government and the Public Body or Recipient of federal funds; provided, however, that this arrangement shall not merge into the contract of assistance, but shall be independently binding and enforceable by an upon the parties thereto, and by any covered employee or his representative, in accordance with its terms, nor shall any other employee protective agreement merge into this arrangement, but each shall be independently binding and enforceable by and upon the parties thereto, in accordance with its terms.

C. Waiver

As part of the grant approval process, either the Recipient or other legally responsible party designated by the Public Body may in writing seek from the Secretary of Labor a waiver of the statutory required protections. The Secretary will waive these protections in cases, where at the time of the requested waiver, the Secretary determines that there are no employees of the Recipient or of any other surface public transportation providers in the transportation service area who could be potentially affected by the Project. A 30-day notice of proposed waiver will be given by the Department of Labor and in the absence of timely objection, the waiver will become final at the end of the 30-day notice period. In the event of timely objection, the Department of Labor will review the matter and determine whether a waiver shall be granted. In the absence of waiver, these protections shall apply to the Project.

ISuch protective arrangements shall include, without being limited to, such provisions as may be necessary for (1) the preservation of rights, privileges, and benefits (including continuation of pension rights and benefits) under existing collective bargaining agreements or otherwise; (2) the continuation of collective bargaining rights; (3) the protection of individual employees against a worsening of their positions with respect to their employment; (4) assurances of employment to

employees of acquired mass transportation systems and priority of reemployment of employees terminated or laid off; and (5) paid training and retraining programs. Such arrangements shall include provisions protecting individual employees against a worsening of their positions with respect to their employments which shall in no event provide benefits less than those established pursuant to 49 U.S.C. Section 11347 [the codified citation of Section 5(2)(f) of the Act of February 4, 1887 (24 Stat. 379), as amended]. Return to original reference point.

2 For purposes of this warranty agreement, paragraphs (1); (2); (5); (15); (22); (23); (24); (26); (27); (28); and (29) of the Model Section 5333(b) Agreement, executed July 23, 1975 are to be omitted.
