


2014-2015 Gold Report Head Start Returning Children










*At this time, 94.40% of the HS children were complete or up to date on immunizations. Fourteen children had not been marked due to new enrollment. The family advocates have all been given reports to follow-up as needed.


*At this time, 91.31% of the HS children were complete, up to date, recently expired, or due for medical screenings. Up to Date means the children are complete, up to date for screenings or still within the 90 requirement period.



^{*}At this time, 87.94% of the EHS children were up to date on their immunizations. Fifteen children had not been marked in ChildPlus. Follow-up will be conducted during staff individual supervision meetings.

^{*}At this time, 68.35% of the EHS children were complete, up to date, and coming due for medical screenings; 31.66% were past due or incomplete. Twenty-six children were past due and thirty-seven were incomplete for medical screenings/exams.

^{*93.97%} of the EHS children had professional oral exams or oral screenings. 96.48% of the EHS children had preventive care (fluoride and/or preventive care). The percentages also include children who are newly enrolled and still within the 90 day requirement period.



*At this time, 58 children with diagnosed disabilities have been enrolled to date in Head Start and Early Head Start. (58/576; 10% funded enrollment)
