**Re:** Annual Rural Transit Service Report for Fiscal Year 2017

**Requested Action:** Review and approve to be placed on file, the Champaign County Rural Transportation Annual Service Report, including ridership and statistics for areas served in FY17 ending June 30, 2017.

**Background:** Each quarter the Champaign County Rural Transit Advisory Group (RTAG) reviews a report covering transportation services provided by the Champaign County Area Rural Transit System (C-CARTS), which is operated by the Champaign-Urbana Mass Transit District (CUMTD). Per adopted RTAG bylaws, these quarterly reports are compiled at the end of each fiscal year and presented to the County Board. The attached annual report was prepared by Champaign County's Program Compliance Oversight Monitor (PCOM), and approved by the RTAG. The attached report details rural public transportation services in Champaign County during State Fiscal Year 2017 (July 1, 2016 to June 30, 2017). An archive of quarterly reports can be found on the C-CARTS website, <a href="http://c-carts.com/">http://c-carts.com/</a>.

### **Notable Events:**

- November 7, 2016 Deviated-Fixed Route, The Eagle Express, began service in Rantoul.
- December 14, 2016 C69, a 2016 14-passenger bus was totaled in an accident.
- December 15, 2016 FY2017 Section 5311 Grant Agreement was fully executed by IDOT, for \$153,871 in Federal funding.
- December 16, 2016 FY2017 Downstate Operating Assistance Program (DOAP) Grant Agreement was fully executed by IDOT, for \$768,800 in State funding.
- May 1, 2017 C-CARTS implemented minor changes to the Eagle Express schedule, based on information collected during the first five months of service.
- May 31, 2017 CCRPC staff submitted the 2017 Consolidated Vehicle Procurement (CVP) application to IDOT, requesting one medium-duty bus to replace C69 which was totaled.
- June 13, 2017 CCRPC staff submitted disposition paperwork to IDOT, asking for C54 and C56 (two medium-duty buses), and C57 (a minivan) to be transferred to a public transit agency or non-profit in need.
- June 22, 2017 The Champaign County Board approved an updated Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) and Vehicle Lease Agreement between Champaign County and CUMTD.
- June 2017 CCRPC and CUMTD staff became involved in the Macoupin County Public Transportation group procurement for Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) software.

The annual report below covers the last completed IDOT grant year – Fiscal Year 2017 from July 1st, 2016 to June 30th, 2017.

<u>Transit Service</u> – The table below reflects C-CARTS trips per quarter for FY17\*:

- Trip type indicates the purpose of each trip. Note: Trips to return home are classified by the trip's purpose preceding it. For example, if a rider goes to a doctor, then afterwards to a grocery store before returning home; the first trip would be medical and the return trip would be shopping.
- Trips are one-way rides, counted each time an individual rider enters and exits a vehicle. A round-trip would count as two trips.
- Days are the number of business days (normally M-F, except on Federal holidays and closures due to inclement weather) operated during the month.
- Average Trips is the total trips divided by total number of operating days.
- Accessible services include the number of trips requiring ADA Lift equipment to be used, and trips provided to older adults 60+ years of age.
- Denials are counted when a rider requests a trip that could not be accommodated.
  - \*Beginning November 7, 2016 these numbers only reflect demand-response service, as these details are not tracked on the deviated-fixed route.

**Requested Action:** Approve Request for Budget Amendment for State Capital Grant No. CAP-14-1060-ILL, Contract No. 4490.

**Background:** This capital grant was executed November 6, 2014, with a budget of \$15,780.00 for the purchase of five computers, five desks, and five chairs. After the purchase of two computers and two chairs, the grant balance is \$13,044.75. This project was placed on hold due to the State Budget Impasse. Champaign County received notice on August 31, 2017 that the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) authorized these funds to be unfrozen.

On November 9, 2017, IDOT indicated that an additional \$134,825.00 in banked start-up funds was available to the County, and that these funds could be added to the existing capital grant. These additional funds will completely cover the cost of Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) software. After the purchase of ITS, the remaining funds will be utilized for the following additional projects, which are described in detail with justification in the attached request to IDOT:

- Bicycle racks for all C-CARTS vehicles
- Advertisement racks for all C-CARTS vehicles
- Two computers and two desks
- Lockers for C-CARTS' operators

Upon approval from the County Board, CCRPC staff will submit the request to IDOT. Once the budget amendment is approved by IDOT, Champaign County will be able to purchase ITS and implement the other projects as described.

Dear Mr. Iacullo,

Champaign County received notice on August 31, 2017 that the Illinois Department of Transportation has authorized implementation of capital projects for which grants were previously placed on hold due to the state's financial situation. Champaign County's State Capital Grant (Grant No. CAP-14-1060-ILL, Contract No. 4490) was executed by IDOT November 6, 2014 for the purchase of five computers, five desks, and five chairs. The approved budget for the five computers, five desks, and five chairs was \$15,780.00. After the purchase of two computers and two chairs, the grant balance is \$13,044.75.

On November 9, 2017, IDOT indicated that an additional \$134,825.00 was available to be added to the budget for this grant. This letter serves to request a budget amendment and corresponding scope amendment for this state capital grant.

Over the past seven months, Champaign County has participated in the Macoupin County Public Transportation Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) software group-procurement process, which is currently in the pre-award concurrence stage. Due to the efficiency and cost-savings associated with this software, Champaign County believes that ITS is the most valuable and responsible use of these state funds. The total anticipated cost of this project is \$97,000.00.

Additional funds will be utilized for the following projects:

• Bicycle racks for Champaign County's rural transit vehicles (14 total). Bike racks not only increase bus usage, they also integrate bikes and public transportation opening up rural transit to a new demographic of riders. The total anticipated cost of this project is \$20,000.00.

- Advertisement racks for Champaign County's rural transit vehicles (14 total). Under the FAST Act, advertising revenue is eligible as local match. These racks will allow Champaign County to advertise and earn additional local match. The anticipated cost of this project is \$3,500.00.
- Two computers and two desks, which will allow rural transit operators to access Champaign-Urbana Mass Transit District's (rural transit operator) intranet to request time off, view schedules and other work-related information, work email, and communication from CUMTD. This project is estimated to cost \$2,900.00.
- Lockers for Champaign County rural transit operators. Many operators bring seat cushions, uniform jackets, and other items to work and currently lack a space to store these items when not in use. Having a space for personal belongings during their shift will be a significant improvement. The anticipated cost of this project is \$1,500.00.

A detailed revised budget reflecting these changes is attached.

**Requested Action:** Approve Resolution Authorizing Execution of FY2018 Downstate Operating Assistance Program (DOAP) Grant Agreement – Grant No. OP-18-26-IL, Agreement No. 4834 (18-1141-5158).

**Background:** On April 20, 2017, the Champaign County Board authorized the application for rural public transportation funding with Resolution #9923. Champaign County submitted separate applications to the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) for state and federal funding for FY2018 on March 31, 2017. On November 21, 2017 CCRPC staff received the Downstate Operating Assistance Program (DOAP) grant agreement for Champaign County's partial execution.

The amount of this grant agreement is \$566,385.00.





#### **RESOLUTION NO. 10217**

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING EXECUTION AND AMENDMENT OF DOWNSTATE OPERATING ASSISTANCE GRANT AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, the provision of public transportation service is essential to the people of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the Downstate Public Transportation Act (30 ILCS 740/2-1 et seq.) ("Act") authorizes the State of Illinois, acting by and through the Illinois Department of Transportation, to provide grants and make funds available to assist in the development and operation of public transportation systems; and

WHEREAS, grants for said funds will impose certain obligations upon the recipient, including provision by it of the local share of funds necessary to cover costs not covered by funds provided under the Downstate Public Transportation Act.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE County Board OF Champaign County:

Section 1. That Champaign County enter into a Downstate Public Transportation Operating Assistance Agreement ("Agreement") with the State of Illinois and amend such Agreement, if necessary, for fiscal year 2018 in order to obtain grant assistance under the provisions of the Act.

Section 2. That the County Administrator of Champaign County is hereby authorized and directed to execute the Agreement or its amendment(s) on behalf of Champaign County for such assistance for fiscal year 2018.

Section 3. That the County Administrator of Champaign County is hereby authorized to provide such information and file such documents as may be required to perform the Agreement and to request and receive the grant funding for fiscal year 2018.

Section 4. That while participating in said operating assistance program Champaign County shall provide all required local matching funds.

#### **OPINION OF COUNSEL**

I, the undersigned, am an attorney licensed by and duly admitted to practice law in the State of Illinois and am counsel and attorney for the Champaign County ("Grantee"). In this capacity, my opinion has been requested regarding the eligibility of the Grantee for grant assistance under the provisions of the Downstate Public Transportation Act, 30 ILCS 740/2-1 et seq. ("Act"). I have also reviewed the Downstate Operating Assistance Grant Agreement, Agreement No. 4834 (18-1141-5158), Grant No. OP- 18 - 26-IL ("Agreement") tendered by the State of Illinois ("State") to the Grantee, and I hereby find the following:

- 1. The Grantee is an eligible "Participant" as defined in the Act.
- 2. There are no provisions in the Grantee's charter, by-laws, or in the laws or rules of the State of Illinois, United States of America, or any unit of local government that preclude or prohibit the Grantee from entering into such Agreement.
- 3. The Grantee is fully empowered and authorized to enter into the Agreement and that Agreement, when executed by both parties, will be legally binding upon the Grantee and its successors and assigns.
- 4. I have no knowledge of any pending or threatened litigation, in either Federal or State court, which would adversely affect the Agreement or prevent the Grantee from contracting with the State for the purpose of receiving a Downstate Operating Assistance Grant.

Based on the foregoing, I am of the opinion that the Grantee is an eligible Participant under the provisions of the Act, and that it is fully empowered and authorized to accept the grant from the State.

# STATE OF ILLINOIS DRUG FREE WORKPLACE CERTIFICATION

This certification is required by the Drug Free Workplace Act (30 ILCS 580/1 et seq.). The Drug Free Workplace Act, effective January 1, 1992, requires that no grantee or contractor shall receive a grant or be considered for the purposes of being awarded a contract for the procurement of any property or services from the State unless that grantee or contractor has certified to the State that the grantee or contractor will provide a drug free workplace. False certification or violation of the certification may result in sanctions including, but not limited to, suspension of contract or grant payments, termination of the contract or grant and debarment of contracting or grant opportunities with the State for at least one (1) year but not more than five (5) years.

For the purpose of this certification, "grantee" or "contractor" means a corporation, partnership, or other entity with twenty-five (25) or more employees at the time of issuing the grant, or a department, division, or other unit thereof, directly responsible for the specific performance under a contract or grant of \$5,000 or more from the State.

Grantee certifies and agrees that it will provide a drug free workplace by:

- (a) Publishing a statement:
  - (1) Notifying employees that the unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensing, possession or use of a controlled substance, including cannabis, is prohibited in the Grantee's workplace.
  - (2) Specifying the actions that will be taken against employees for violations of such prohibition.
  - (3) Notifying the employee that, as a condition of employment on such contract or grant, the employee will:
    - (A) abide by the terms of the statement; and
    - (B) notify the employer of any criminal drug statute conviction for a violation occurring in the workplace no later than five (5) days after such conviction.
- (b) Establishing a drug free awareness program to inform employees about:

- (e) Imposing a sanction on, or requiring the satisfactory participation in a drug abuse assistance or rehabilitation program by, any employee who is so convicted, as required by Section 5 of the Drug Free Workplace Act.
- (f) Assisting employees in selecting a course of action in the event drug counseling, treatment, and rehabilitation is required and indicating that a trained referral team is in place.
- (g) Making a good faith effort to continue to maintain a drug free workplace through implementation of the Drug Free Workplace Act.
