# ORDINANCE NO. 2018-3 ORDINANCE AMENDING ZONING ORDINANCE FOR A ZONING MAP AMENDMENT ON CERTAIN PROPERTY

#### 905-AM-18

WHEREAS, the Champaign County Zoning Board of Appeals held a public hearing, made a formal recommendation for approval, and forwarded to this Board Zoning Case 905-AM-18;

WHEREAS, the Champaign County Board believes it is for the best interests of the County and for the public good and welfare to amend the Champaign County Zoning Ordinance in a manner hereinafter provided;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Champaign County Board, Champaign County, Illinois, as follows:

1. That Resolution No. 971, *The Zoning Ordinance of the County of Champaign, Illinois*, be amended by reclassifying from AG-2 Agriculture and B-3 Highway Business Zoning District to the B-4 General Business Zoning District in order to establish and operate a business office on the following described real estate:

The North 213.33 feet of the Southeast Quarter of Section 33, Township 20 North, Range 9 East of the Third Principal Meridian, lying East of the Right of Way Line on the East Side of State Highway US 45, except the East 819.64 feet thereof, with an address of 3310 North Cunningham Avenue, Urbana, Illinois.

- 2. That the reclassification of the above described real estate be subject to the following conditions:
  - A. The owners of the subject property hereby recognize and provide for the right of agricultural activities to continue on adjacent land consistent with the Right to Farm Resolution 3425 (see attached).
  - B. A complete Stormwater Drainage Plan that conforms to the requirements of the Stormwater Management and Erosion Control Ordinance shall be submitted and approved as part of the Zoning Use Permit application for construction and all required certifications shall be submitted after construction prior to issuance of the Zoning Compliance Certificate.
- 3. That the boundary lines of the Zoning Map be changed in accordance with the provisions hereof

## Reentry Program – Final Report March 1, 2017 – June 30, 2018

This past year has seen a number of activities and changes to Rosecrance Central Illinois' (RCI) Reentry Program, which supports adults returning to Champaign County from incarceration and has been funded by the Champaign County Board since early 2014. Progress has been made, such as closer collaboration with the Champaign County Housing Authority, yet challenges remain. The following report details this information, as well as data, for this past year.

#### **Activities**

The Reentry Council has met 11 times during this program year (March 1, 2017 – February 28, 2018).

With the resignation of Ed Bland, Executive Director of the HACC, the Reentry Council approached Interim Director, Cindi Herrera, with requests for closer collaboration. Ms. Herrera was agreeable to the request and assigned an HACC representative to the Council. In addition, Ms. Herrera welcomed the concept of a pilot reentry program, and review of the agency's policies and practices based on HUD's recently released guidance around the topic of access to public housing for persons with criminal backgrounds. We hope to work with the new Executive Director, David Northern, to further the progress made.

Rosecrance staff, including the Reentry Case Manager, took part in the Resource Fair that accompanied the annual Expungement and Sealing Summit. Reentry staff has developed a Reentry Resource Guide, detailing various available and accessible resources to address common needs of the reentry population. The Guide is kept as a living document, to which changes are made that reflect shifting resources in the community.

The Council of State Governments Justice Center released a Housing Needs and Risks Screening Questionnaire. The questionnaire was provided to the Council for review and guided a number of discussions at monthly meetings. The Council determined that while housing is a need identified by the Program, there has not been discernment between housing needs and homelessness. As such, the Council agreed that this would be an important distinction to make going forward. In light of this, the Reentry Case Manager began screening clients with the Questionnaire. It has since been determined that the questionnaire requires refinement to improve the questions and their sequence.

Program staff attended a presentation by the Corporation of Supportive Housing's Senior Program Manager, John Fallon. Mr. Fallon spoke about the work involved in developing housing for populations with special needs, particularly in communities where such an undertaking has proven difficult. Of note, when asked, Mr. Fallon suggested pursuing a reentry housing pilot for a target population specific to adults with behavioral health needs returning from incarceration, as opposed to a reentry housing pilot for the general reentry population due to the lack of support typically expressed for such efforts.

Reentry staff and Council members were involved in the work conducted by the Crisis Response Planning Committee (CRPC) on the Justice and Mental Health Collaboration Program (JMHCP)

planning grant. The CRPC's recommendations speak to local reentry needs, particularly the following:

- 1. Establish a Behavioral Health and Justice Coordinating Council (BHJCC) to oversee all CJ/BH activities
- 2. Implement risk-needs-responsivity (RNR) screening at earliest point in the CJ process, to inform decisions throughout the system and levels of service provision
- 3. Enhance reentry services specifically for the population with mental illness or cooccurring mental health and substance use disorders
- 4. Ensure adequate resources and facilities for community behavioral health providers working in the jail

The establishment of a BHJCC would involve convening an additional justice-focused group, with particular regard for persons with behavioral health needs who are involved in the criminal justice system – beyond initial contact with law enforcement. The County's JMHCP implementation grant application, which would have provided support for a BHJCC, was not successful. The Reentry Council supports an expansion of the group focus to include the justice-involved population with behavioral health needs, as well as Intercept 3 (jail).

Implementing Risk, Needs, Responsivity (RNR) assessment provides a consistent methodology for assessing and determining appropriate levels of service for individuals. This would, in turn, augment the recidivism data collected by the Program for both the engaged and non-engaged populations from the jail.

Enhancing reentry services for persons with behavioral health needs aligns with the views of the Reentry Council, as does ensuring adequate resources and facilities for program providers in the jail.

## Other Funding Opportunities

Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority released a Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) for a Residential Substance Abuse Treatment Program that could be based in the jail. A summary of the NOFO was provided to the Council, which determined that the feasibility of meeting the NOFO requirements was unlikely.

A grant to the U.S. Department of Justice Request for Proposals (RFP) for a Second Chance Act Comprehensive Community-Based Adult Reentry Program was submitted. The RFP involved a number of mandatory requirements, including in-reach to correctional facilities, Memorandums of Understanding with correctional agencies, and the use of a validated RNR assessment. The RFP was not successful and, based on the grants awarded in this category, it is staff's interpretation that reviewers supported program serving more generalized populations.

## **Program Changes**

In June 2017, Matt Chouinard, the Reentry Case Manager since June 2015, resigned from the position. Reentry case management duties were covered by the Criminal Justice Team Leader until the position was filled. And, in July 2017, Anitra Nance accepted the Reentry Case Manager position.

Ms. Nance came to the Reentry Program from RCI's Parenting with Love and Limits Program, and has extensive experience in client engagement and outreach. Prior to the elimination of case management services in the Reentry Program, Ms. Nance proved to be great asset to the Reentry Program.

In mid-December, the Reentry Program shifted to a "Contact and Refer" format, for persons released on Parole to Champaign County. The Criminal Justice Liaison continues to receive weekly release lists from IDOC Parole, and contact IDOC releases through a mailing and a phone call. In the initial phone call, the Liaison screens individuals to determine identified needs.

- For persons with no behavioral health concern, who identify other needs, the Liaison provides referral information to various community resources over the phone, via email and/or postal mail.
- For persons that need only a Substance Abuse Assessment, as part of his/her stipulations from the Parole Review Board, he/she will be referred to walk in hours at RCI's Walnut St. location. Or, for those wanting to set an appointment, they are referred to RCI's Substance Abuse Services Clinical Coordinator.
- Persons who communicate a behavioral health (BH) concern (Mental Health, Substance
  Abuse or Co-occurring Disorders) are referred to a Master's-level Social Work Intern, for
  further assessment and resource referral.
  - o If a mental health treatment need is detected, the Intern will link the individual to additional RCI case management services and, if needed, psychiatric services at Promise Healthcare. The Intern will also provide additional referral information to community resources for other identified needs.
  - o If a substance use treatment need is detected, the Intern will link the individual to additional RCI substance use treatment services. The Intern will also provide additional referral information to community resources for other identified needs.
  - o If a BH need is not detected, the Intern will provide referral information to community resources for other identified needs, and send a letter to the individual's Parole Agent stating that further treatment needs were not indicated.

Identified needs and linkage data, to the extent possible, is collected and reported.

The purpose in modifying the Program was to address its fast-approaching termination date of February 28, 2018. The amendment to the one-year contract, to extend an additional four months to June 30, 2018, enhances coordination of services for individuals with behavioral health needs returning to Champaign County from incarceration, in addition to aligning the contract year with RCI's fiscal year, which runs July 1 – June 30.

In March 2018, IDOC Parole informed the Program that they may no longer be able to share the list of people releasing from IDOC to the community. A final decision regarding this development is awaited. In addition, the Program Coordinator position was vacated. Since that time, various Rosecrance staff contributed to activities as the Program's conclusion approached.

At the June 21, 2018 County Board meeting, the Board voted to extend the Reentry Program contract with Rosecrance for an additional year. As a result, Rosecrance will reinstate reentry case management services, formalize the Reentry Council via the execution of bylaws, election of a Chair, and formation of an executive committee, and continue to provide administrative support to the Council.

## The Year in Numbers

The chart on the following page indicates the number of people served by the program this past year, as well as their identified needs and linkage information. It must be noted that linkage information is much more difficult to collect due to the change in program format, to the contact and refer method, as linkage information was previously collected during ongoing case management sessions. As such, it is expected that more linkage to community resources occurred in January and February 2018 than has been confirmed and illustrated in the chart.

## **Engaged Population**

Recidivism data detailed in the following charts focuses on the first three yearly cohorts of the Reentry Program, as well as the fourth cohort which was truncated by changes made to the program's format that eliminated case management services as of December 10, 2017.

During the time that Reentry Case Management Services were implemented at Rosecrance Central Illinois (June 1, 2014 - December 9, 2017), 330 service plans were completed. Seven of these were for duplicate participants, resulting in 323 unduplicated participants having engaged in the Reentry Case Management services.

The following information categorizes the variations of program engagement and recidivism data for those who chose to engage in reentry case management services.

## Definitions

- Recidivism A new judgment within three years of release
- Service Plan A list of goals with numerous areas of support for which clients desire linkage or assistance obtaining (Areas of support include: state identification, housing, employment, education, medical coverage and care, benefits/entitlements, transportation, BH assessments & treatment)
- Service Plan Completion Status The degree to which a client achieved his or her stated goals before discharging from the program \*There are three completion statuses, for which definitions follow.
  - o Successful Met all goals of the service plan
  - o Partial Completion Met some goals of the service plan
  - o Unsuccessful Met no goals of the service plan
- Success No new judgment within three years of release, and linkage to community resources and support

## Non-Engaged Population

Since Reentry Services were implemented on June 1, 2014, a total of **847** unduplicated people have been contacted (42 duplicate contacts = 889 total contacts). Of those, **600** unduplicated people agreed to be screened (27 duplicate screens = 627 total screens) for the Reentry Program.

Recidivism data detailed in the following charts focuses on the first three yearly cohorts of those persons contacted and screened by the Reentry Program, but who did not engage in services through the Program. These cohorts total **460** individuals.

In addition to the individuals for whom recidivism has been calculated, as illustrated in the previous charts, recidivism data has been calculated for the 27 released individuals who have received the recently re-formatted Contact and Refer reentry services. In addition to the N being miniscule, this group has been released for a short period of time, between December 10, 2017 and February 28, 2018. At this time, no one in the group has received a new judgment. However, one individual does have a pending charge.

## Conclusion

A number of changes have occurred in Rosecrance Central Illinois' (RCI) Reentry Program this past year. With the anticipated conclusion of the County's reentry grant at the end of June, reentry program staff left and were reassigned as the end of the Program drew near.

At the June 21, 2018 County Board meeting, the Board voted to extend the Reentry Program contract with Rosecrance for an additional year. As a result, Rosecrance will reinstate reentry case management services, formalize the Reentry Council via the execution of bylaws, election of a Chair, and formation of an executive committee, and continue to provide administrative support to the Council.

It remains the view of the Reentry Council that more resources are needed in Champaign County to better support the successful transition of citizens returning here from incarceration. With recent leadership changes at the Champaign County Housing Authority, it appears that housing options, perhaps the most critical need faced, for the reentry population, will be increased.

As reentry case management is a vital component of success for all persons returning from incarceration, willing to engage in supportive services - particularly those with behavioral health needs, it is the hope of the Council that all supportive resources will become sustainable. On-going, reliable support for releasing individuals will offer the best opportunity to formerly-incarcerated people to establish productive lives that will serve the betterment of themselves, their families, and the Champaign County community.

# VIOLENT CRIME VICTIMS ASSISTANCE PROGRAM GRANT AGREEMENT Grant 19-0410

This agreement, made this	day of	, 2018, by and between the
State of Illinois represented by the Attorney	General of the	e State of Illinois, hereinafter referred
to as Administrator, and Champaign County	, an Illinois go	overnmental entity hereinafter referred
to as Grantee, witnesseth:		

WHEREAS, sections 6 and 7 of the Violent Crime Victims Assistance Act (725 ILCS 240/6, 7) authorize the Administrator to designate as victim and witness assistance centers, any public or private nonprofit agencies, and to award grants to such agencies for the establishment and operation of such centers pursuant to the Violent Crime Victims Assistance Act (725 ILCS 240/1 et seq.); and

WHEREAS, the Administrator has promulgated rules to implement the provisions of the Violent Crime Victims Assistance Act, which are codified at Title 89 of the Illinois Administrative Code, Part 1100 (hereafter referred to as the "Rules"); and including procedures for the designation and funding of victim and witness assistance centers; and

WHEREAS, Grantee has submitted to the Administrator a grant proposal dated, January 29, 2018, together with plans and specifications for the development and operation of a victim and witness assistance center in the County(ies) of Champaign, State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the grant proposal is acceptable to the Administrator and appears to comport with the standards, procedures, and objectives of the Violent Crime Victims Assistance Act and the rules implementing said Act; and

WHEREAS, the Administrator desires that Grantee perform services as hereinafter set forth in accordance with the terms and conditions hereinafter provided;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to and for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of the Violent Crime Victims Assistance Act, and in consideration of Grantee's representations contained in its grant proposal dated January 29, 2018, and of the benefits to accrue to the People of the State of Illinois from the accomplishment of the project detailed in said grant proposal, the parties hereto mutually promise and agree as follows:

- 1. TERM. The term of this Agreement is for a period of twelve (12) months, commencing July 1, 2018, and ending June 30, 2019, unless sooner terminated as herein provided.
- 2. PROVISION OF SERVICES AND GRANT ADMINISTRATION. Grantee agrees as follows:
  - (a) Grantee shall operate a program in accordance with "Program Description B" and "Clients Served C" of the application submitted to the Administrator;
  - (b) Grantee shall use \$31,000.00 of grant funds toward the salary and \$0.00 of grant funds toward the benefits for the Victim Witness Advocate who works 37.5 hours per week and will devote 17 hours per week performing direct services.
  - (c) Direct services to victims and witnesses of violent crimes include, but are not limited to: notification regarding status of the case and dates of court proceedings, information about the criminal justice system, information about constitutional rights set forth in Article 1, section 8(a) of the Illinois Constitution, information about statutory rights set forth in the Rights of Crime Victims and Witnesses Act (725 ILCS 120/1 et.seq.), assistance with completion and filing of the written notice of victim's assertion of rights, restitution, assistance with statements at sentencing, assistance with employers, assistance with return of property, court advocacy, emotional support, information about crime victim compensation and the Automated Victim Notification system, cooperation with the Administrator's staff in the Crime Victim Services unit to seek restitution for awards made by the crime victim compensation program, and networking with community groups, social service agencies, and law enforcement organizations that provide additional services for crime victims. Networking and case review meetings shall not exceed 10% of the required VCVA funded hours. Direct services do not include: supervision of staff, administration of the program, development of the program, fundraising, outreach or education:
  - (d) Grantee shall maintain time and attendance records for funded staff reflecting the dates and hours providing direct services set forth in paragraph 2(b) and (c);
  - (e) Grantee shall have funded staff complete one Administrator-sponsored training during the term of the grant as follows:
    - (i) Grantee shall have funded staff complete the basic 40-hour Illinois Victim Assistance Academy, if the funded staff has not completed a basic Academy and the basic Academy is offered during the term of the grant;

- (ii) If funded staff has completed the basic Academy but has not attended the Advanced Illinois Victim Assistance Academy, Grantee shall have funded staff apply to attend the Advanced Academy, if it is offered during the term of the grant;
- (iii) If funded staff has completed the basic 40-hour Illinois Victim Assistance Academy and does not attend the Advanced Illinois Victim Assistance Academy during the term of the grant, Grantee shall have funded staff complete any other Administrator-sponsored training during the term of the grant when available;
- (f) Grantee shall maintain an accounting system in accordance with Section 1100.200 of the Rules;
- (g) Grantee shall submit to the Administrator financial and activity reports each quarter covering the previous three (3) month period. Such reports shall be on forms specified by the Administrator. All reporting forms must be received by the Administrator no later than fifteen (15) days following the end of the reporting period. Such reports shall contain the information required by Section 1100.270(a) and (b) of the Rules. Failure to comply with the deadlines for filing reports may result in the delay of payment, the withholding or suspension of the distribution of funds, or the termination of this Agreement.
- (h) Grantee shall provide information regarding the Illinois Crime Victims
  Compensation program to all clients who have been victims of violent
  crime. To that end, Grantee shall maintain a supply of current materials,
  including, but not limited to, Crime Victims Compensation applications
  and Instruction Sheets, and Crime Victims Compensation FAQ sheets.
  Grantee shall attend Administrator-sponsored trainings regarding the
  Crime Victims Compensation program as requested by the Administrator.
  Grantee shall submit to the Administrator data substantiating Grantee's
  compliance with this subsection on Grantee's quarterly activity reports;
- (i) Grantee shall permit agents of the Administrator to inspect the financial records of Grantee as they relate to this Agreement; and
- (j) Grantee shall permit agents of the Administrator to enter the premises of Grantee to observe the operation of Grantee's program. The Administrator shall give Grantee reasonable notice of intent to enter for purposes of observing, and such observation shall not unreasonably interfere with the conduct of Grantee in the providing of its services.
- 3. GRANT AWARD. Administrator agrees to contribute and provide financial support from the Violent Crimes Victims Assistance Fund to Grantee in the

amount of \$31,000.00 Grantee agrees to use such funds solely for the provision of services as specified in paragraph 2 of this Agreement and strictly in accordance with the project budget, which is attached hereto, marked as "Exhibit A," and by reference incorporated herein, unless Grantee has otherwise modified the program or provision of services, in accordance with paragraph 4 of this Grant Agreement. Administrator shall complete processing for payment of 25 percent of said grant award within 45 days of the execution of this Grant Agreement. The remaining, unpaid balance of said grant award shall be processed for payment in three (3) equal installments within 30 days after the end of each subsequent calendar quarter, provided that the Grantee has complied with quarterly reporting requirements as required under paragraph 2 of this Grant Agreement, on the conditions that sufficient funds have been deposited into the Violent Crimes Victims Assistance Fund and that such funds have been appropriated for the purposes of this Grant Agreement by the General Assembly of the State of Illinois and are available to the Administrator for disbursement for purposes of this Grant Agreement. The Administrator may delay the distribution of funds if a quarterly report reflects that the Grantee has unexpended funds at the end of the quarter, resulting from a failure to obtain approval for the modification of services, including personnel, or to provide the services specified in the Grant Agreement.

- 4. MODIFICATION OF PROGRAM. Grantee shall not change, modify, revise, alter, amend, or delete any part of the services it has agreed to provide or change, alter, or extend the time constraints for the provision of such services as provided herein unless it shall have first obtained the written consent for such change, modification, revision, alteration, amendment, deletion, or extension from the Administrator. Furthermore, unless Grantee obtains the prior written consent of the Administrator, Grantee shall not do or cause to be done any of the following:
  - (a) Incur any expense or financial obligation from the grant award except as authorized by and provided in paragraph 2 and the project budget, which is attached hereto, marked as "Exhibit A," and by reference incorporated herein;
  - (b) Incur expenses or financial obligations from such grant award in any line item category of such project budget in excess of the amount provided in such line item category; or
  - (c) Transfer any money from one line item category of such project budget to another line item category of such project budget except that a total amount of less than \$1,000 may be transferred within the budget without prior consent if done in accordance with the requirements and restrictions of the applicable Quarterly Report Instructions.
- 5. ASSIGNMENT. Grantee shall make no assignment of this Agreement or of any right accruing under this Agreement or of any monies granted to Grantee pursuant to this Agreement without the written consent of the Administrator.

6. TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT. This Agreement may be terminated and canceled for cause by the Administrator, by giving written notice to Grantee thirty (30) days in advance of such termination and cancellation, delivered by certified mail, return receipt requested, to Grantee as hereinafter provided. In the event that this Agreement is terminated prior to the expiration date, Grantee shall promptly return to Administrator all unexpended or lapsed funds, as provided in the rules promulgated by the Administrator for the implementation of the Violent Crime Victims Assistance Fund.

# EXPENDITURE OF GRANT FUNDS.

- (a) All grant funds awarded hereunder shall be expended within the term of this Grant Agreement. Any grant funds not expended or legally obligated by the end of the term of this Grant Agreement must be returned to the Administrator within forty-five (45) days after the end of the term of this Grant Agreement. This Grant Agreement is subject to the Illinois Grant Funds Recovery Act (30 ILCS 705/1 et seq.), as now or hereafter amended; and all the terms, conditions, and provisions of the Illinois Grant Funds Recovery Act apply to this Grant Agreement and are made a part of this Grant Agreement the same as though they were expressly incorporated and included herein.
- (b) Grantee agrees that neither it nor its employees shall:
  - 1) knowingly use grant funds, or good or services purchased with grant funds, to engage, either directly or indirectly, in a prohibited political activity; or
  - 2) be knowingly compensated from grant funds for time spent engaging in a prohibited political activity (30 ILCS 705/4.3).

For purposes of this paragraph, "prohibited political activity" has the meaning established in Section 1-5 of the State Officials and Employees Ethics Act (5 ILCS 430/1-5). Grantee acknowledges that a knowing violation of this paragraph is a business offense and that Grantee may be fined up to \$5,000.

- 8. SEVERABILITY. This Agreement and all provisions hereof are intended to be whole and entire, and no provision or any part hereof is intended to be severable. This Agreement contains all the terms and conditions agreed upon by the parties hereto, and no other Agreements, oral or otherwise, regarding the subject matter of the Agreement, shall be deemed to exist or bind any party hereto.
- 9. PERSONNEL. Grantee shall appoint, assign, and commit the following named person or persons to perform the services to be provided by Grantee:

# Susan Chapin, Victim Witness Advocate

If for any reason Grantee finds it necessary or desirable to substitute, add, or subtract personnel to perform its services under this Agreement, Grantee shall submit a written notice to Administrator within ten (10) days of the personnel substitution, addition, or subtraction. Such notice shall be submitted on a form prescribed by the Administrator. Any substitutions or additional personnel must meet the qualifications of the written job description on file with the current application. Failure to timely provide notice may result in the delay of payment, the withholding or suspension of the distribution of funds, or the termination of this Agreement.

- 10. CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION STATUS. Grantee certifies that it is not a charitable organization subject to Illinois' Charitable Trust Act (760 ILCS 55/1 et seq.) and the Solicitation For Charity Act (225 ILCS 460/0.01 et seq.), and, if subject to either of these Acts, that all appropriate registration materials and annual reports have been filed with the Attorney General's Charitable Trust Bureau. Grantee, if subject to either of these Acts, agrees to notify the Administrator of the filing of appropriate registration materials and annual reports with the Attorney General's Charitable Trust Bureau that occurs after the date of this Agreement. Failure to timely submit all appropriate materials and reports to the Charitable Trust Bureau may result in the delay of payment, the withholding or suspension of the distribution of funds, or the termination of this Agreement.
- 11. CONFLICT OF INTEREST. Grantee agrees to comply with the provisions of the Illinois Procurement Code prohibiting conflicts of interest (30 ILCS 500/50-13) and the Attorney General's rules relating to ethics (44 Ill. Adm. Code §§1300.5013 through 1300.5035); and all the terms, conditions, and provisions of those sections apply to this Agreement and are made a part of this Agreement the same as though they were incorporated and included herein.

# 12. DISCRIMINATION.

- (a) The provisions of Public Works Employment Discrimination Act (775 ILCS 10/0.01 *et seq.*) are applicable to this contract.
- (b) Grantee hereby agrees to:
  - Refrain from unlawful discrimination and discrimination based on citizenship status in employment and undertake affirmative action to assure equality of employment opportunity and eliminate the effects of past discrimination;

- Comply with the procedures and requirements of the regulations of the Department of Human Rights concerning equal employment opportunities and affirmative action; and
- 3) Provide such information, with respect to its employees and applicants for employment, and assistance as the Department of Human Rights may reasonably request. 775 ILCS 5/2-105.
- (c) The Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. §12101 et seq.) and the regulations promulgated thereunder (28 C.F.R.§35.130), hereinafter collectively referred to as the "ADA," prohibit discrimination against persons with disabilities by the State, whether directly or through contractual arrangements, in the provision of any aid, benefit, or service. As a condition to this Grant Agreement, Grantee certifies that services, programs, activities provided under this Grant Agreement are and will continue to be in compliance with the ADA.
- 13. SEXUAL HARASSMENT POLICIES. Grantee agrees to establish and maintain written sexual harassment policies that shall include, at a minimum, the following information: (i) the illegality of sexual harassment; (ii) the definition of "sexual harassment" under State law; (iii) a description of sexual harassment, utilizing examples; (iv) the grantee's internal complaint process including penalties; (v) the legal recourse, investigative and complaint process available through the Department of Human Rights and the Human Rights Commission; (vi) directions on how to contact the Department of Human Rights and the Human Rights Commission; and (vii) protection against retaliation as provided by section 6-101 of the Illinois Human Rights Act (775 ILCS 5/6-101).
- 14. IMMIGRATION REFORM AND CONTROL ACT OF 1986. Grantee hereby certifies that, to the extent applicable to this Agreement, Grantee has complied with the provisions and requirements of the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986 (Public Law 99-603, effective November 6, 1986).
- 15. BRIBERY. Grantee hereby certifies that neither it nor any of its authorized agents has been convicted or made an admission as a matter of record of having bribed or attempted to bribe an officer or employee of any federal, State, or local governmental entity. 30 ILCS 500/50-5. Grantee acknowledges that the Administrator may declare this contract void if this certification is false.
- 16. FELONY CONVICTION. Grantee certifies that it is not barred from being awarded a contract or subcontract under Section 50-10 of the Illinois Procurement Code (30 ILCS 500/50-10), which prohibits a person or business convicted of a felony from doing business with the State of Illinois or any State agency from the date of conviction until five (5) years after the completion of the sentence for that felony, unless the person(s) held responsible by a prosecutorial office for the facts upon which the conviction was based has no involvement with the business.

Grantee acknowledges that the Administrator may declare this contract void if this certification is false.

- 17. SARBANES-OXLEY ACT. Grantee certifies that it is not barred from being awarded a contract under Section 50-10.5 of the Illinois Procurement Code (30 ILCS 500/50-10.5), which prohibits a business from bidding on or entering into a contract or subcontract under the Code, if the business or any officer, director, partner, or other managerial agent of the business has been convicted of a felony under the Sarbanes-Oxley Act of 2002 (15 U.S.C. §7201 et seq.) or a Class 3 or Class 2 felony under the Illinois Securities Law of 1953 (815 ILCS 5/1 et seq.) for a period of five (5) years prior to the date of the bid or contract. Grantee acknowledges that the Administrator shall declare this contract void if this certification is false.
- 18. NON-ASSISTANCE CERTIFICATION. Grantee certifies that it is not barred from being awarded a contract under Section 50-10.5(e) of the Illinois Procurement Code (30 ILCS 500/50-10.5(e)), which prohibits a person or business from bidding on or entering into a contract with the State if the person or business:
  - (a) assisted the State or the Administrator in determining whether there is a need for the contract except as part of a response to a publicly issued request for information; or
  - (b) assisted the State or the Administrator by reviewing, drafting, or preparing any invitation for bids, a request for proposal, or request for information or provided similar assistance, except as part of a publicly issued opportunity to review drafts of all or part of these documents.

For purposes of this Certification, "business" includes all individuals with whom a business is affiliated, including, but not limited to, any officer, agent, employee, consultant, independent contractor, director, partner, manager, or shareholder of business.

- 19. DEBT DELINQUENCY. Grantee certifies that neither it nor any of its affiliates is barred from entering into a contract or subcontract under Section 50-11 of the Procurement Code (30 ILCS 500/50-11), which prohibits any person who knows or should know that he or she or any affiliate is delinquent in the payment of any debt to the State from entering into a contract with a State agency, unless that person or affiliate of that person, has entered into a deferred payment plan to pay off the debt. # ISSUES REPORT – MAINTAINING OR ELIMINATING THE OFFICE OF ELECTED RECORDER IN CHAMPAIGN COUNTY UPDATED JULY 10, 2018

#### **STATUTORY AUTHORITY:**

The Illinois Constitution – Article VII, Section 4(c) provides the following authority regarding elected county offices:

Each county shall elect a sheriff, county clerk and treasurer and may elect or appoint a coroner, recorder, assessor, auditory and such other officers as provided by law or by county ordinance. Except as changed pursuant to this Section, elected county officers shall be elected for terms of four years at general elections as provided by law. Any office may be created or eliminated and the terms of office and manner of selection changed by county-wide referendum. Offices other than sheriff, county clerk and treasurer may be eliminated and the terms of office and manner of selection changed by law. Offices other than sheriff, county clerk, treasurer, coroner, recorder, assessor and auditor may be eliminated and the terms of office and manner of selection changed by county ordinance.

The Illinois Compiled Statutes – 10 ILCS 5/28-7 – provides the process for implementing a recommendation under Illinois Constitution Article VII, Section 4(c):

Sec. 28-7. In any case in which Article VII or paragraph (a) of Section 5 of the Transition Schedule of the Constitution authorizes any action to be taken by or with respect to any unit of local government, as defined in Section 1 of Article VII of the Constitution, by or subject to approval by referendum, any such public question shall be initiated in accordance with this Section.

Any such public question may be initiated by the governing body of the unit of local government by resolution or by the filing with the clerk or secretary of the governmental unit of a petition signed by a number of qualified electors equal to or greater than at least 8% of the total votes cast for candidates for Governor in the preceding gubernatorial election, requesting the submission of the proposal for such action to the voters of the governmental unit at a regular election.

The Illinois Compiled Statutes – 55 ILCS 5/3 – provides the statutory authority for the office of Recorder, and also establishes that in counties having a population of less than 60,000 where there is not an elected Recorder, those duties are placed with the Office of the County Clerk:

Sec. 3-5001. County clerk as recorder; election of recorder. The county clerk in counties having a population of less than 60,000 inhabitants shall be the recorder in his county. In counties having a population of 60,000 or more inhabitants, there shall be elected a recorder, as provided by law, who shall hold his office until his successor is qualified. If the population of any county in which a recorder has been elected decreases to less than 60,000, the voters of that county shall continue to elect a recorder if the county board adopts a resolution to continue the office of an elected recorder.

#### RECENT CHANGES by COUNTIES

Of the eleven counties with population over 60,000 with combined functions of the elected office of Recorder and County Clerk, six have made that transition in recent years. In all six examples, the elimination of the position was to generate savings for the taxpayers while continuing to

provide the same levels of service through the consolidation of functions under the County Clerk. The six counties are:

#### POTENTIAL OUTCOMES of ELIMINATION

As reported to the Champaign County Board in 2015 when the Board last reviewed this issue, it is anticipated that Champaign County could also experience financial savings if the Recorder position is eliminated. The current staffing budget for the Recorder's Office is 5.5 FTE positions. Based on the volume of business managed by the Recorder's Office, the elimination of the elected Recorder would likely not change the need for the total number of FTE positions; however, the assignment of management responsibility to a position similar to that of the Chief Deputy Recorder, under the supervision of the County Clerk, could be achieved. The budgetary difference is then tied to the difference between the salary of the elected Recorder and that of a line staff position – anticipated to generate annual savings of approximately \$60,000.

The other potential benefit is in bringing the oversight of the clerical support positions of County Clerk and Recorder under the direction of one official. This creates the opportunity for cross training of all staff, resulting in the flexibility to move staff from one function to another depending on current demand.

As documented in a study conducted by Winnebago County in October 2017, the County Clerk and Recorder share common duties as "the collection, maintenance and retrieval of important records". The elimination of the elected Recorder position and placing the administrative functions and responsibilities under the authority of the elected County Clerk is a responsible form of management that works in over 85% of the counties of the State of Illinois.

Pius,

The several questions we've addressed from the conversations with you and Deb on Monday morning, and what we were able to put together in response:

Can the CB set up the office as a stand-alone office not under County Clerk? Answer: No it couldn't be stand alone. (See AG Opinion 1126 – Piatt County attempted to eliminate office of coroner and then set up "death investigator" with some duties, appointed leader, two year terms.) This was not constitutional because coroner [same as recorder] was set up by constitution and CB has no authority by law elsewhere to create a position with those constitutional duties.

But according to AG Opinion S-1127, while the County Code provision which establishes that the county clerk is the recorder in counties under 60,000 – that does not mean the Clerk automatically would assume the duties of Recorder in Champaign County due to our population size. Now that doesn't mean that transfer of duties doesn't make the most logical sense because of their similar statutory duties and this statutory structure in smaller counties, but what the AG's Opinion states is that the question needs to be clear what office would assume the duties. The COW agenda packet shows that the question posed is that Clerk's Office would do that, which is fine and acceptable for the Board to put forth as the referendum question, but its not accurate to say only the Clerk's office could do this based on the County Code.

Can this happen in 2018 and not 2020, as currently drafted? The rules on timing involve that the same referendum may not be provided more than once in any 23-month period and then must go on the ballot at the general, regular, or special election no later than at least 78 days after the adoption of the resolution placing it on the ballot. AG Opinion S-508 states that the Constitutional convention discussed the power to vest elimination by referendum is without limitation; and that when that office is abolished, all rights to that office cease. In that Opinion the office could be eliminated at the same election where someone was going to be elected as recorder, and the office could still cease immediately without having to pay the newly elected official for 4-years, etc.

In somewhat "non-legal" research, Winnebego County did a pretty in depth consolidation study in October 2017 before putting the question on the March 2018 primary ballot. In that study, the timelines of all the other counties that have undertaken consolidations are included. In each, the year of the referendum and the year of consolidation differ, but McClean County voted on the question in 2012 and eliminated in 2013, which couldn't have been the end of a recorder's term. In all of this "quick non-legal research" it appears that the consolidations make the end of the current recorder's term the time put forth on the referendum – which is probably a "best practice" without black and white legal support – and affords office holders and/or candidates the opportunity to build platforms on the substance of the issues and for transition plans to be made.

Please note that these responses are framed through the questions posed. Let me know if you need more legal research from our office.

**WHEREAS**, after the said hearing, the Circuit Court shall approve the appointment of those election judges where no cause for non-approval was shown; and

**WHEREAS**, the Chairs of the two major Champaign County party central committees have submitted a certified list of candidates for election judges with the Champaign County Clerk and the Champaign County Board for approval;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Champaign County Board approves the certified list of candidates for election judges submitted by the Champaign County Democratic Party and the Republican Party Central Committees; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the County Board certify that the certified list submitted by the Champaign County Democratic Party and Champaign County Republican Party Central Committees are the proper ratio of candidates to serve as election judges in each election precinct from the certified list as submitted, and

Final ADA Report to the Department of Justice

As required by the terms of its Settlement Agreement under the Americans with Disabilities Act, the County submitted its final report to the Department of Justice (DOJ) on July 10, 2018. Comprehensive spreadsheets and Certifications prepared by the County's Independent Licensed Architect were delivered by mail. With the exception of Attachment K, which comprises the Sheriff's Office and downtown Correctional Center, the County has complied with the remedial actions required by DOJ.

The downtown facilities cited in Attachment K are rated as "poor" in the County's 2015 Facilities Condition Assessment and in addition to the access issues named by DOJ, they require a significant investment in maintenance and upgrades. A November 2017 building report completed by Bailey Edward documents a 0-5 year investment of \$2.9 million, and a 5-25 year investment of \$8.8 million. The Department of Justice recognizes the County Facilities Committee will commence discussions regarding a plan for the downtown facilities in August 2018. In June, Ms. Ogden spoke with Mediation Program Officer Dana Jackson who suggested that upon submission of the County's final report, the Department would not extend the Settlement Agreement; however, the County has an obligation to ensure the facilities are in compliance with ADA Standards if it continues to occupy the space.

County Administration wishes to thank Department Heads, Elected Officials and Staff for the significant amount of effort and collaboration that went towards achieving the requirements of the three-year Settlement Agreement. Moving forward it is important for the County to take a proactive approach to ensure compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act. The County maintains a webpage which provides its notice under the ADA, grievance procedures, instructions for requesting reasonable accommodations, and contact information for the County's ADA Coordinators. Employee resources include training videos and the County's Serving People with Disabilities Handbook.

#### **NOTIFICATION**

The posted Notice is refreshed when contact information changes, last occurring on 3/13/2018. A current copy of the County's written procedures are included with this submission.

#### ADA COORDINATOR

Champaign County notified the Department of Justice of the planned change in one of its ADA Coordinators on 3/13/2018. As required by the agreement the County's web site and posted notices were updated to reflect this change.

### INDEPENDENT LICENSED ARCHITECT (ILA)

ILA reports from Bailey Edward will be submitted via mail in disk format as requested by the Department of Justice.

#### GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE

The posted Grievance Procedures are refreshed when contact information changes, last occurring on 3/13/2018.

#### GENERAL EFFECTIVE COMMUNICATION PROVISIONS

Administrative Services maintains current lists of qualified sign language and oral interpreters, qualified readers, real-time transcription services and vendors able to put documents in Braille. Procedures and time frames for fulfilling requests are outlined in Champaign County's Serving People with Disabilities Handbook, which was revised 6/22/2018. Employees receive Illinois Relay Services Training when applicable, and a record of employees who have completed the Illinois Relay training between 6/28/2017 and 6/14/2018 is included with this report.

#### LAW ENFORCEMENT AND EFFECTIVE COMMUNICATION

The Champaign County Sheriff's Office maintains a list of oral and sign language interpreters, and utilizes Sorenson Video Relay Service in order to provide effective communication 24/7. TTYs and videophones are located in the Sheriff's Office, Downtown Jail and Satellite Jail. Sheriff's Office policy allows persons with disabilities an extended time to utilize a TTY, videophone, and relay service, and will make reasonable efforts to provide the preferred communication device.

### **EMPLOYMENT**

Champaign County's personnel policies comply with the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission regulations implementing title I of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990. Additional guidance is provided regarding hiring, interviewing, and employment in the County's Serving People with Disabilities Handbook. A record of employees who have completed the Supervisor training between 6/28/2017 and 6/14/18 is included with this report.

#### POLLING PLACES

Voter registration materials are available in alternate formats including Braille, large print, audio format and accessible electronic format. Poll worker training is conducted prior to each election and includes information on assisting voters who require aid, curbside voting, Voter Assistance Terminal (VAT), polling place accessibility and the rights of people with disabilities. The County Clerk offered curbside voting on demand at all voting locations for the March 20, 2018, General Primary election. The County Clerk will implement temporary remedies such that polling places are accessible on Election Day by providing curbside voting on demand at all polling places.

#### EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT PROCEDURES AND POLICIES

Champaign County's Emergency Operations Plan (EOP) implements Chapter 7 of the Department of Justice's *ADA Best Practices Tool Kit for State and Local Government* to address the ADA obligations of emergency management, including planning, preparedness, evacuation, shelters, medical and social services, lodging and housing programs, recovery, and rebuilding. The EOP was approved by the Illinois Emergency Management Agency on May 10, 2017.

#### **SIDEWALKS**

The ILA Certification related to County highways, sidewalks and curb ramps is being submitted by mail. Forty-four sidewalk ramps were inspected at sixteen roadway intersections, with thirty-four of the ramps meeting ADA regulations. Due do existing conditions not anticipated in the original design, eight of the ramps were significantly improved; however, not fully compliant with all applicable ADA accessibility regulations. In some instances, existing roadway gutters have a deeper than normal flow line, and fully-compliant access could not be achieved without inhibiting the flow of storm water. Based on the inspection report, the not fully compliant ramps appear to meet the spirit and intent of ADA regulations. Full documentation explaining the reasons for the inability to be in full compliance will be submitted by the ILA. The County respectfully requests a variance from the Department of Justice for the eight ramps that are referenced in the report.

The ILA identified two non-compliant ramps determined to be required for crossing a township road and not required for the adjacent county highway. The sidewalks were constructed by the subdivision developer along a township road, which is perpendicular to the County highway. There are no crosswalks on the highway, nor receiving pedestrian sidewalks on the other side of the highway. The United States Access Board Technical requirements as written in R204.3 say in part, "The pedestrian access route shall connect departure and arrival sidewalks." The lack of crosswalks and receiving sidewalks places pedestrians onto a County highway with no means to safely exit the roadway. Therefore, the curb ramps leading to the County highway were removed.

#### WEB-BASED SERVICES AND PROGRAMS

As previously reported, Champaign County's Independent Consultant Tim Offenstein, has reviewed the County's website and deemed it compliant with WCAG 2.0 Level A & AA guidelines. The Circuit Clerk's website evaluation was completed by Mr. Offenstein on 8/23/17. The majority

of the issues initially identified have been corrected with the exception of some non-critical issues for services provided by a third-party site.

AppliTrack, the County's online application program, implemented a Web Accessibility Policy and is committed to maintaining and improving compliance with regulations such as sections 504 & 508 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA). Accessibility compliance is achieved by using the World Wide Web Consortium's (W3C's) WCAG 2.0 Level AA and WAIARIA 1.0 guidelines. A review by the County's Independent Consultant conducted on March 20, 2018, identified the site as almost completely accessible. AppliTrack has been notified of the issues that require further attention.

The annual distribution of the Accessibility Policy occurred on 2/28/2018. Notification of accessibility requirements was provided to third party sites and the County continues to encourage full compliance. Ongoing development is being run through automated WCAG evaluators including <a href="https://validator.w3.org/">https://validator.w3.org/</a>.

The County's Information Technology department worked with PACE of Central Illinois to arrange for individuals with different disabilities to test the County's webpages for ease of use and accessibility barriers.

#### NEW CONSTRUCTION, ALTERATIONS, AND PHYSICAL CHANGES TO FACILITIES

ILA reports are being submitted by mail in disk format as requested by the Department of Justice. With the exception of Attachment K, the comprehensive reports document the remedial actions taken by the County to remedy the access issues required by the Department in newly constructed facilities, altered facilities, and programs housed in other facilities.

In August 2018, the County Facilities Committee will commence discussions regarding a plan for the Sheriff's Office and downtown Correctional Center cited in Attachment K. In addition to the access issues, the facilities require a significant investment in maintenance, repairs, upgrades, and replacement. The County recognizes its obligation to bring the facilities into compliance with ADA Standards if it continues to occupy the space.

#### PROGRAM MODIFICATIONS

The architect's report for facilities listed in Attachment L including certifications documenting compliance, access issues that have been remediated, comments and photographs is submitted with this report. The Champaign County Regional Planning Commission was successful in finding an alternate location for the Urbana Head Start facility, formerly located at 108 S. Webber Street, which had multiple access issues identified in Attachment L. The program relocated to 1603 E. Mumford Drive in March 2017.

The Commission received a Pre-School for All Expansion Grant in May 2018. The grant includes

funding for ADA compliant parking lots, ramps and sidewalks at the Rantoul and Savoy locations. An advertisement for bids is posted on the County's website <a href="http://www.co.champaign.il.us/bid">http://www.co.champaign.il.us/bid</a> documents/2018/ITB2018-RP1 Partial Renovation of the Head Start (Early Childhood) Facilities/Partial%20Renovation%20of%20Head%20Start%20(Early%20Childhood)%20Facilities%20Bid%20Document.pdf. The bid opening is scheduled for August 2, 2018, with ADA alterations to be completed no later than November 30, 2018.

#### MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Champaign County's annual written report summarizing its actions pursuant to the Settlement Agreement is hereby submitted. The County continues to train employees on the requirements of the ADA and appropriate ways of serving people with disabilities. A record of employees trained between 6/28/2017 and 6/14/2018 is included with this report.

#### Response to Item 43:

Champaign County Highway Department provided inspection reports for 44 non-compliant ramp locations. All ramps received improvements in Spring 2018, and were reviewed by Bailey Edward's consulting civil engineer. The full report is attached electronically. Thirty-four of the ramps achieved full compliance, eight ramps were significantly improved however are not completely compliant. Two ramps were determined to be required for crossing a township road and not required for the adjacent county highway. Of the eight ramps which were not able to fully comply with ADA requirements, existing site topography and structures (gutters) constrained full compliance. Modifications of the gutters would inhibit storm water drainage. Champaign County respectfully requests a variance for these locations.


