

WHEREAS, The County Board of Champaign County concurs in the action recommended by the Committee;



ORDINANCE NO. 2019-1

ORDINANCE GRANTING A SPECIAL USE PERMIT IN ZONING CASE 898-S-18 "PRAIRIE SOLAR 1" UTILITY-SCALE PV SOLAR FARM

WHEREAS, the Champaign County Zoning Board of Appeals held a public hearing, made a formal recommendation for approval, and forwarded to this Board Zoning Case Number 898-S-18;

WHEREAS, the Champaign County Board finds that the Zoning Board of Appeals followed proper procedures and its Finding of Fact is supported by the manifest weight of evidence cited in the Summary of Evidence; and

WHEREAS, the Finding of Fact forwarded by the Zoning Board of Appeals demonstrates compliance of the petition in Zoning Case 898-S-18 with the criteria contained in Section 9.1.11 B. of the *Champaign County Zoning Ordinance*.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Champaign County Board, Champaign County, Illinois, as follows:

- 1. That the Summary of Evidence, Documents of Record, Finding of Fact, and Final Determination forwarded by the Champaign County Zoning Board of Appeals in Zoning Case 898-S-18 are hereby endorsed and adopted, and incorporated herein by reference.
- 2. That a Special Use Permit is hereby granted to BayWa r.e. Development LLC and the participating landowners listed in Attachment A for a utility-scale PV Solar Farm with a total nameplate capacity of 150 megawatts (MW), including access roads and wiring, in the AG-1 and AG-2 Agriculture Zoning Districts, with a fenced solar farm area of approximately 1,191 acres on a total of approximately 1,609 acres in Sidney Township in Sections 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 22 and 23 of Township 18 North, Range 10 East of the 3rd Principal Meridian, with land exceptions as described in Attachment A and including specific waivers of standard conditions and special conditions of approval as listed in this Ordinance.
- 3. That the granting of the Special Use Permit in Zoning Case 898-S-18 include the following waivers of standard conditions:
 - Part A: A waiver for a distance of 1,175 feet between a PV Solar Farm and the CR Conservation Recreation Zoning District in lieu of the minimum required one-half mile (2,640 feet), per Section 6.1.5 B.(2)b.

- Part B: A waiver for not providing a Decommissioning and Site Reclamation Plan that includes cost estimates prepared by an Illinois Licensed Professional Engineer prior to consideration of the Special Use Permit by the Board, per Section 6.1.1 A.3.
- Part C: A waiver for not entering into a Roadway Upgrade and Maintenance Agreement with the relevant local highway authority prior to consideration of the Special Use Permit by the Board, per Section 6.1.5 G.
- 4. That the granting of the Special Use Permit in Zoning Case 898-S-18 include the following special conditions of approval:
 - A. The approved site plan consists of the following documents:
 - Sheets 1 through 9 of the Site Plan received November 13, 2018.
 - Sheets 10 through 12 of the Site Plan received October 24, 2018.
 - Sheet L1 Landscape Plan received November 15, 2018.
 - B. The Zoning Administrator shall not authorize a Zoning Use Permit Application or issue a Zoning Compliance Certificate on the subject property until the lighting specifications in Paragraph 6.1.2.A. of the Zoning Ordinance have been met.
 - C. The Zoning Administrator shall not issue a Zoning Compliance Certificate for the proposed PV SOLAR FARM until the petitioner has demonstrated that the proposed Special Use complies with the Illinois Accessibility Code, if necessary.
 - D. The Zoning Administrator shall not authorize a Zoning Use Permit until the petitioner submits a copy of an executed Agricultural Impact Mitigation Agreement with the Illinois Department of Agriculture per the requirements established in Paragraph 6.1.5 R. of the Zoning Ordinance.
 - E. A signed Decommissioning and Site Reclamation Plan that has been approved by ELUC is required at the time of application for a Zoning Use Permit that complies with Section 6.1.1 A. and Section 6.1.5 Q. of the Zoning Ordinance, including a decommissioning cost estimate prepared by an Illinois Professional Engineer.
 - F. Roadway Upgrade and Maintenance Agreements signed by the County Highway Engineer, Sidney Township Highway Commissioner, and approved by the Environment and Land Use Committee, shall be submitted at the time of application for a Zoning Use Permit.
 - G. The following submittals are required prior to the approval of any Zoning Use Permit for a PV SOLAR FARM:
 - 1. Documentation of the solar module's unlimited 10-year warranty and the 25-year limited power warranty.

- 2. A Storm Water Management Plan which conforms to the Champaign County Storm Water Management and Erosion Control Ordinance.
- 3. Certification by an Illinois Professional Engineer that any relocation of drainage district tile conforms to the Champaign County Storm Water Management and Erosion Control Ordinance.
- 4. A Crossing Agreement with the relevant Drainage District(s) for any solar farm construction that intrudes on any easement or right of way for drainage district ditch or tile, per 6.1.5 E.(5).
- 5. An irrevocable letter of credit to be drawn upon a federally insured financial institution with a minimum acceptable long term corporate debt (credit) rating of the proposed financial institution shall be a rating of "A" by S&P or a rating of "A2" by Moody's within 200 miles of Urbana or reasonable anticipated travel costs shall be added to the amount of the letter of credit.
- 6. A permanent soil erosion and sedimentation plan for the PV SOLAR FARM including any access road that conforms to the relevant Natural Resources Conservation Service guidelines and that is prepared by an Illinois Licensed Professional Engineer.
- 7. Documentation regarding the seed to be used for the vegetative ground cover planting, per 6.1.5 F.(9).
- 8. A Transportation Impact Analysis provided by the applicant that is mutually acceptable to the Applicant and the County Engineer and State's Attorney; or Township Highway Commissioner; or municipality where relevant, as required by 6.1.5 G. 2.
- 9. The telephone number for the complaint hotline required by 6.1.5 S.
- 10. Any updates to the approved Site Plan from Case 898-S-18 per the Site Plan requirements provided in Section 6.1.5 U.1.c.
- H. The petitioner shall install sound reduction kits from the inverter manufacturer to each of the inverters in the solar farm so that operational sound levels for the duration of the solar farm will be less than 39 dBA at all existing residential lots within 1,500 feet of the project site and 39 dBA shall be the sound level that shall be enforced by Champaign County subject to the relevant standards of the Illinois Pollution Control Board and Illinois Environmental Protection Agency.
- I. A Zoning Compliance Certificate shall be required for the PV SOLAR FARM prior to going into commercial production of energy. Approval of a Zoning Compliance Certificate shall require the following:
 - 1. An as-built site plan of the PV SOLAR FARM including structures,

property lines (including identification of adjoining properties), as-built separations, public access road and turnout locations, substation(s), electrical cabling from the PV SOLAR FARM to the substations(s), and layout of all structures within the geographical boundaries of any applicable setback.

- 2. As-built documentation of all permanent soil erosion and sedimentation improvements for all PV SOLAR FARM including any access road prepared by an Illinois Licensed Professional Engineer.
- 3. A noise study to verify that the required sound reduction kits for all inverters result in less than 39 dBA noise level at all existing residential lots within 1500 feet of the project site.
- 4. An executed interconnection agreement with the appropriate electric utility as required by Section 6.1.5 B.(3)b.
- J. The Applicant or Owner or Operator of the PV SOLAR FARM shall comply with the following specific requirements that apply even after the PV SOLAR FARM goes into commercial operation:
 - 1. Maintain the required visual screening for the perpetuity of the Special Use Permit.
 - 2. Cooperate with local Fire Protection District to develop the District's emergency response plan as required by 6.1.5 H.(2).
 - 3. Cooperate fully with Champaign County and in resolving any noise complaints including reimbursing Champaign County any costs for the services of a qualified noise consultant pursuant to any proven violation of the I.P.C.B. noise regulations as required by 6.1.5 I.(4).
 - 4. Maintain a current general liability policy as required by 6.1.5 O.
 - 5. Submit annual summary of operation and maintenance reports to the Environment and Land Use Committee as required by 6.1.5 P.(1)a.
 - 6. Maintain compliance with the approved Decommissioning and Site Reclamation Plan including financial assurances.
 - 7. Submit to the Zoning Administrator copies of all complaints to the telephone hotline on a monthly basis and take all necessary actions to resolve all legitimate complaints as required by 6.1.5 S.
- K. The petitioner will consult with all land owners and residents (both participating and non-participating in the solar farm project) whose residences

are within 1,000 feet of the solar farm regarding the types of plantings to be used in the required vegetative screening to be planted along the nearest solar farm fence line to the residence to minimize harm to existing residential landscaping and the Environment and Land Use Committee shall approve the proposed screening prior to the approval of the Zoning Use Permit.

- L. Within the boundary of the solar farm, the petitioner shall replace the main tile for the Drainage District Number 1 of the Town of Sidney and no Zoning Compliance Certificate shall be authorized by the Zoning Administrator until written acceptance of the replaced main tile has been received from the Drainage District Number 1 of the Town of Sidney and all required "as-built" drawings showing the location of the main drainage tile within the boundary of the solar farm have been filed with the Illinois Department of Agriculture and the Champaign County Soil and Water Conservation District.
- M. Within the boundary of the solar farm, the petitioner shall replace all privately owned underground drainage tile that are identified and encountered, consistent with the "like kind" replacement proposed in the cover letter from Huddleston McBride Land Drainage of Rochelle, Illinois, that was received October 24, 2018, and with the petitioner's testimony regarding pattern tiling and consistent with both the Champaign County Storm Water Management and Erosion Control Ordinance and with the Agriculture Impact Mitigation Agreement and no Zoning Compliance Certificate shall be authorized by the Zoning Administrator until all required "as-built" drawings showing the location of all drainage tile within the boundary of the solar farm have been filed with the Illinois Department of Agriculture and the Champaign County Soil and Water Conservation District.
- N. The petitioner shall maintain the privately owned underground drainage tiles within the boundary of the solar farm for the lifetime of the special use permit including any repairs that may be necessary for up to one year after decommissioning and site reclamation.

AN ORDINANCE providing for the issuance of a \$1,980,400 Taxable General Obligation Promissory Note, Series 2019, of The County of Champaign, Illinois, for the purpose of financing certain outstanding operating expenses relating to said County's nursing home, providing for the security for and payment of said note, and authorizing the sale of said note to

WHEREAS, The County of Champaign, Illinois (the "County"), is a duly organized and existing unit of local government created and existing under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois, and is now operating under the provisions of the Counties Code of the State of Illinois, as amended (the "Counties Code"); and

WHEREAS, the County, pursuant to Section 5-1135 of the Counties Code, may borrow money for any corporate purpose from any bank or other financial institution provided such money shall be repaid within 2 years from the time the money is borrowed; and

WHEREAS, the County Board of the County (the "County Board") has considered the needs of the County and has determined and does hereby determine that it is advisable, necessary, and in the best interests of the County to finance certain outstanding operating expenses relating to the County's nursing home (the "Financing"), the payment of said expenses being a lawful corporate purpose of the County; and

WHEREAS, the estimated cost to the County of the Financing to be payable out of the original proceeds of the Note as provided in this Ordinance is the aggregate sum of not less than \$1,980,400; and

WHEREAS, while there are sufficient reserve funds on deposit, there are insufficient funds on hand and available to pay the costs of the Financing, and it is necessary for that purpose that a sum to pay such costs be borrowed at this time; and, in evidence of such indebtedness, a general

obligation promissory note of the County be issued in the principal amount of \$1,980,400 (the "Note") and that such indebtedness be incurred and the Note be issued as described below:

Now Therefore Be It Ordained by the County Board of The County of Champaign, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. Incorporation of Preambles. The County Board hereby finds that all of the recitals contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are true, correct, and complete and does incorporate them into this Ordinance by this reference.

Section 2. Determination to Issue Note. It is necessary and in the best interests of the County and for the public health, safety, welfare, and convenience to provide for the Financing, to pay all related costs and expenses incidental thereto, and to borrow money and issue the Note for such purpose. It is hereby found and determined that such borrowing of money is for a proper public purpose or purposes and is in the public interest, and is authorized by Section 5-1135 of the Counties Code.

The outstanding principal amount of the Note shall bear interest from time to time from the later of its Dated Date as herein provided or from the most recent interest payment date to which interest has been paid or duly provided for, until the full principal amount of such Note is paid or duly provided for, such interest (computed upon the basis of a 360-day year of twelve

Section 4. Execution; Authentication. The Note shall be executed on behalf of the County by manual or facsimile signature of the County Executive of the County (the "County Executive") and attested by the manual or facsimile signature its County Clerk (the "County Clerk") and shall have impressed or imprinted thereon the corporate seal or facsimile thereof of the County. In case any such officer whose signature shall appear on the Note shall cease to be such officer before the delivery of the Note, such signature shall nevertheless be valid and sufficient for all purposes, the same as if such officer had remained in office until delivery. The Note shall have thereon a certificate of authentication, substantially in the form hereinafter set forth, duly executed by the Note Registrar as authenticating agent of the County for the Note and showing the date of authentication. The Note shall not be valid or obligatory for any purpose or be entitled to any security or benefit under this Ordinance unless and until such certificate of authentication shall have been duly executed by the Note Registrar by manual signature, and such certificate of authentication upon the Note shall be conclusive evidence that the Note has been authenticated and delivered under this Ordinance.

Section 5. Optional Redemption and Prepayment. The Note is subject to redemption and prepayment prior to maturity at the option of the County on and after ninety (90) days from the Dated Date, from any available funds, in part or in whole on any date, at the prepayment price of par plus accrued interest to the date fixed for redemption.

Section 6. Redemption Procedure. The County shall, at least 5 days prior to a redemption and prepayment date (unless a shorter time period shall be satisfactory to the Note Registrar), notify the Note Registrar of such redemption date and of the principal amount of the Note to be redeemed. Unless waived by the owner of the Note, official notice of any such redemption and prepayment shall be given by the Note Registrar on behalf of the County by mailing the redemption notice by regular mail not less than 5 days and not more than 30 days prior to the date fixed for redemption to the registered owner of the Note at the address shown on the Note Register or at such other address for notice as is furnished in writing by the registered owner to the Note Registrar. Notices of redemption and prepayment shall include at least the following information: the date of redemption and prepayment; the redemption and prepayment price; a statement that the Note or portion thereof, shall become due and payable on the redemption date and shall thereupon cease to bear interest; and the place where the Note or portion thereof shall be surrendered for redemption and prepayment (the designated office of the Note Registrar).

Notice of redemption and prepayment having been given as aforesaid, the Note or portion thereof shall, on the redemption date, become due and payable at the redemption price therein specified, and from and after such redemption date (unless the County shall default in the payment of the redemption price) the Note or portion thereof shall cease to bear interest. Notice having been properly given, failure of the registered owner of the Note to receive such notice shall not be deemed to invalidate, limit or delay the effect of the notice or action described in the notice. Such

notice may be waived in writing by the registered owner of the Note, either before or after the event, and such waiver shall be the equivalent of such notice.

Upon surrender of such Note or portion thereof for redemption and prepayment in accordance with notice, the Note or portion thereof shall be paid and redeemed by the Note Registrar at the redemption price. If the Note or portion thereof shall not be so paid upon surrender, the principal amount thereof due shall, until paid or duly provided for, continue to bear interest from the redemption date at the rate borne by the Note or portion thereof.

Section 7. Registration of the Note; Person Treated as Owner. The County shall cause a book (the "Note Register") for the registration and for the transfer of the Note as provided in this Ordinance to be kept at the designated office of the Note Registrar, which shall be the registrar of the County for the Note. The Note may be transferred, but only in the manner, subject to the limitations, and upon payment of the charges as set forth in this Ordinance. Upon surrender for transfer of the Note at the designated office of the Note Registrar, duly endorsed by or accompanied by a written instrument or instruments of transfer in form satisfactory to the Note Registrar and duly executed by the registered owner or an attorney for such owner duly authorized in writing, the County shall execute and the Note Registrar shall authenticate, date, and deliver in the name of the transferee, a new fully registered Note of like tenor. The execution by the County of any fully registered Note shall constitute full and due authorization of such Note, and the Note Registrar shall thereby be authorized to authenticate, date, and deliver such Note. The person in whose name the Note shall be registered shall be deemed and regarded as the absolute owner thereof for all purposes, and payment of the principal of or interest on the Note shall be made only to or upon the order of the registered owner thereof or his or her legal representative. All such payments shall be valid and effectual to satisfy and discharge the liability upon the Note to the extent of the sum or sums so paid. No service charge shall be made to any registered owner of the

Note for any transfer of the Note, but the County or the Note Registrar may require payment of a sum sufficient to cover any tax or other governmental charge that may be imposed in connection with any such transfer.

Section 8. Form of Note. The Note shall be in substantially the form set forth as Exhibit A, attached hereto and made a part hereof.

Section 9. Security; Payment. The obligation to make the payments due under the Note shall be a lawful direct general obligation of the County payable from the general funds of the County and such other sources of payment as are otherwise lawfully available. There is no statutory authority for the Levy of a separate tax in addition to other taxes of the County or the Levy of a special tax unlimited as to rate or amount to pay any of the Amounts due hereunder.

- Section 11. Creation of Funds and Appropriations. Funds are established and Note proceeds and other funds of the County are hereby appropriated as follows:
 - A. Any amounts designated from time to time to pay the Note are hereby ordered to be deposited into the "General Corporate Fund Debt Service" of the County (the "Debt Service Fund"). The County shall segregate such amounts within a dedicated subaccount of the Debt Service Fund.
 - B. The principal proceeds of the Note shall be deposited into the general corporate fund of the County.
 - C. Funds on deposit in the Note Fund may be invested at the direction of the Treasurer of the County in any lawful manner.
- Section 12. Pertaining to the Note Registrar. If requested by the Note Registrar, either the County Executive or the Treasurer of the County is authorized to execute the Note Registrar's standard form of agreement with respect to the obligations and duties of such parties hereunder. Subject to modification by the express terms of any such agreement, the Note Registrar agrees as follows:
 - A. to act as registrar, authenticating agent, paying agent, and transfer agent as provided herein;
 - B. to maintain a list of the Note owners as set forth herein and to furnish such list to the County upon request, but otherwise to keep such list confidential to the fullest extent permitted by law;
 - C. to give notice of prepayment of the Note or portion thereof as provided herein;
 - D. to cancel and/or destroy any Note which has been prepaid, paid at maturity or submitted for transfer; and

E. to furnish the County at least annually an audit confirmation of amounts paid, amounts outstanding, and payments made with respect to the Notes.

The County Clerk is hereby directed to file a copy of this Ordinance with the Note Registrar.
