A RESOLUTION PETITIONING THE CHAMPAIGN COUNTY BOARD FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE REPLACEMENT OF A BRIDGE AT 1000 EAST, TOLONO, ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, the Village of Tolono (the "Village") is a duly organized and validated existing non-home rule municipality created in accordance with the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970 and the laws of the State; and

WHEREAS, the President and Village Board of Trustees are committed to protecting the health, safety and welfare of the Village and its residents; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Tolono is responsible for the maintenance of roadways within the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Village Board has determined that it is critical that the 1000 East bridge be replaced; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to 605 ILCS 5/5-501, the Village has made the within finding that it qualifies for shared cost from Champaign County for the cost of the replacement, with Champaign County providing the box and the Village providing the rest, because the number of Village residents is less than 15,000, the cost of the project shall be at least .02% of the value of all of the taxable property in the Village, and the tax rate levied within the Village for the past two years has not been less than the maximum allowable tax rate for corporate purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Village believes that it has or will have adequate funds from its general funds and/or other funds to meet the Village's costs of the proposed 1000 East bridge replacement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF TOLONO, ILLINOIS AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>. Pursuant to 605 ILCS 5/5-501 and other applicable law, the Village of Tolono by its Board of Trustees hereby petitions the County of Champaign to share the cost of the replacement of 1000 East bridge.

<u>Section 2</u>. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect upon passage and approval, as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended.

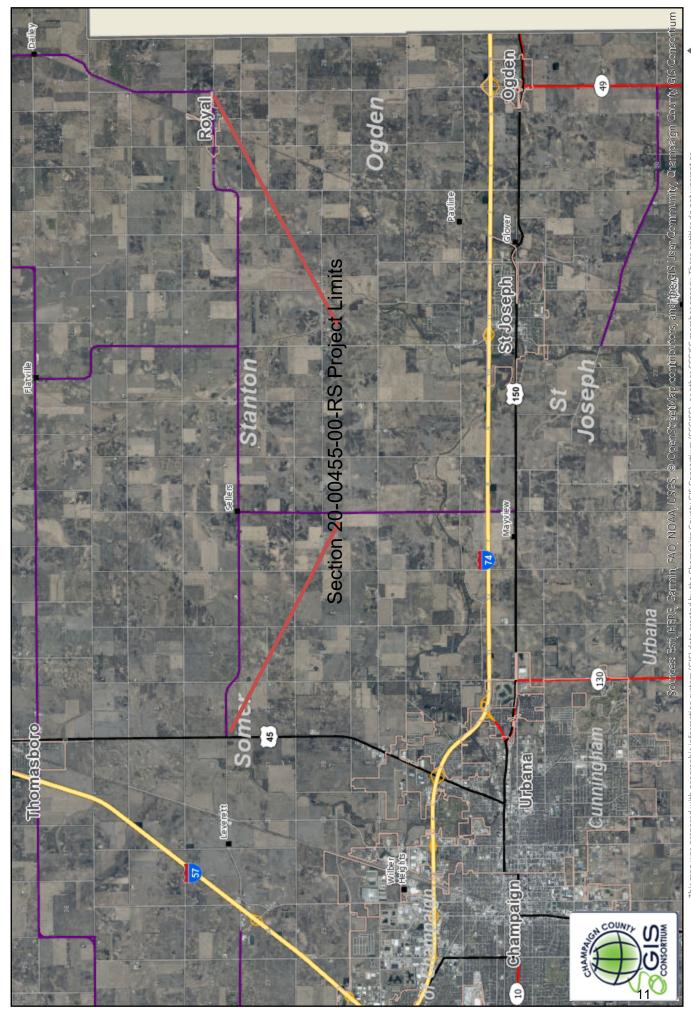

The County Board is statutorily required to determine the amount of compensation for the offices of County Clerk, Sheriff and Treasurer, pursuant to 55 ILCS 5/4-6001 and 4-6003, and the office of the County Executive, pursuant to 55 ILCS 5/2-5012, and to do so without regard to awards or stipends from State funds for those offices. Pursuant to 50 ILCS 145/2, the compensation for the offices of County Clerk, Sheriff, Treasurer and County Executive must be fixed at least 180 days before the term of office begins. In addition, the County Board must balance its duty to fairly and adequately compensate all elected officials with its duty to protect the public's tax dollars and provide County services effectively and efficiently.

Per County Board Resolution 2019-277, the salary schedule for the offices of County Clerk, Sheriff and Treasurer were grouped together, with the last 12-month period beginning 12/1/2021. Likewise, per County Board Resolution 10052, the salary schedule for the office of County Executive was placed on the same schedule, with the last 12-month period beginning 12/1/2021.

Data was recently collected from the Champaign County comparable counties, including Peoria County, McLean County, Rock Island County, Sangamon County and Madison County. Please see the attached data from comparable counties.

In order to reflect any changes to the FY2022 budget, a decision will need to be made by September 30, 2021. Additionally, in order to be in compliance with the 180-day requirement, a decision will need to be made by the April 2022 County Board meeting, at which time a budget amendment could be made to account for the FY2022 budget change.

RE: Recommendation for 2021 County Reapportionment Plan Revision

In June 2021, the Governor signed legislation which contains several election reforms, including Amendment 2, Division 2-3 of the Counties Code. These changes were enacted partially in response to the lateness of *Census 2020* data reporting. This amendment provides that the County Executive "may develop and present (or redevelop and present) to the Board by the third Wednesday in November after a federal decennial census year an apportionment plan and the Board shall conduct its public hearing as provided" for its consideration.

Prior to this change, the County Board adopted a reapportionment map that was based on estimated population data. Board members indicated a preference for this map having 2 majority minority districts, however a big weakness was a large range variance of over 17% between the lowest and highest district populations that could potentially lead to map challenges. Because this large variance was not corrected when the actual Census 2020 data were released, following the revision to state statute and one additional meeting with my advisory group, I am pleased to submit an additional reallocation plan with several improvements for the Board's consideration.

Equity Map Census 3 is based on the Plan 11 Equity Map previously adopted by the County Board, with adjustments made to redistribute the population according to actual census counts.

- 1. The number of majority minority districts increases from 2 (Districts 6 & 11) to 3 (Districts 6, 8 & 11).
- 2. Increasing the size of Districts 2, 4 and 5 to equalize population growth also results in decreasing the huge area of District 3 to a more reasonably compact area.
- 3. The overall population variance among districts improves from 15.03% to 6.71%, which is well within generally acceptable allowances of less than 10%.

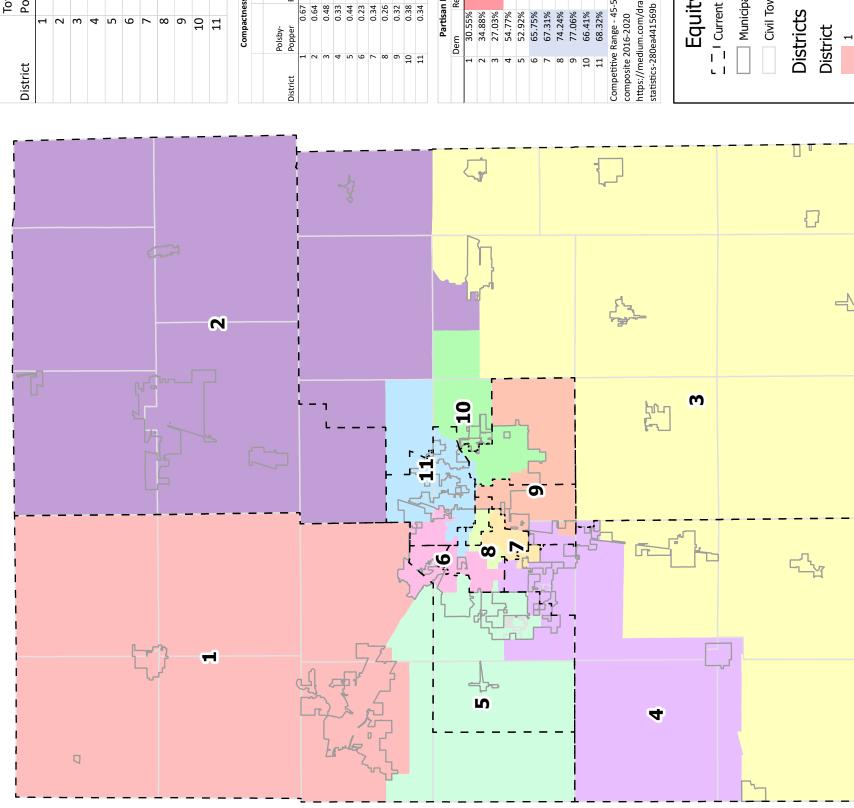
I recommend that the County Board adopt Equity Map Census 3 for its 2021 County Reapportionment Plan.

A public hearing must be held 6-21 days prior to the vote on map adoption. To meet the new deadline for the Clerk to submit the county map by the third Wednesday in November 2021, I would recommend the public hearing be set prior to the October 12th COW, with a vote at the October 21st board meeting on whether to adopt a revised map.

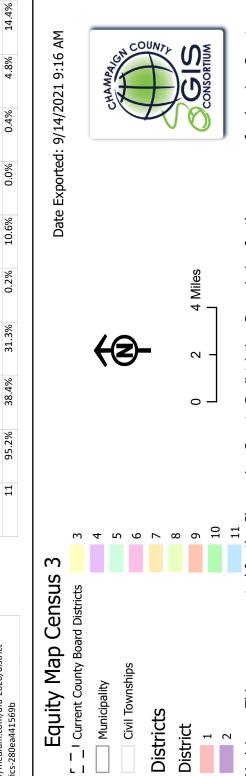

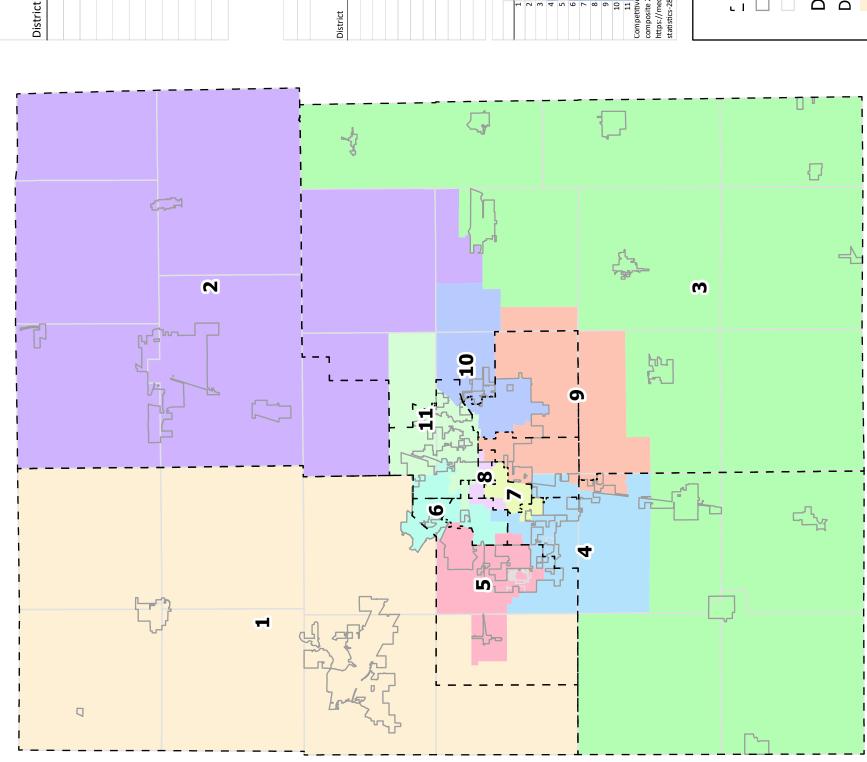

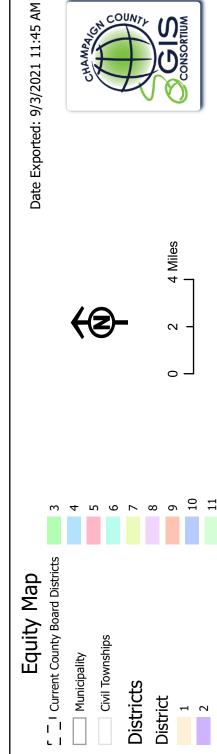
