Subject:	Memorandum: Closed minutes review policyproposal for discussion

For some time I have been thinking about a procedure to deal with the sizable number of closed session minutes for the County Board. Below are the guidelines that I am presenting to you at this time. With such guidelines in place, it will lead to a more orderly method of reviewing closed session minutes and a more orderly procedure to consider making the minutes public.

First, here is a brief description of the board's relevant duties under the OMA:

At least semi-annually the County Board must meet to review minutes of all closed meetings. The Board must determine and report in an open session that either (1) the need for confidentiality still exists or (2) that the minutes or portions thereof no longer require confidential treatment and are available for public inspection.

Minutes of meetings closed to the public shall be available only after the public body determines that it is no longer necessary to protect the public interest or the privacy of an individual by keeping them confidential.

Therefore the Board should determine either the need for confidentiality exists or that the minutes no longer require confidentiality. Therefore, the board should determine one way or the other; there is no default.

Proposed guidelines:

- 1. Health Insurance negotiations: open after 10
- Union Negotiations: open after 10
- Salary Schedules: open after 10

4. Personal matters (Discipline, performance, termination) concerning individual employees: remain closed until death, or 10 years after death, or forever.

- 5. Employment/hiring of specific employee: open after 20, unless still employed
- 6. Compensation of specific employee: open after 10, unless still employed
- Land transactions (Purchase/lease/sale): open after 10
- Litigation: per SA opinion
- 9. Exceptions: per SA opinion

I do not consider any of these guidelines set in stone, but I do feel that having guideslines is worthwhile.

RECOMMENDATIONS for SEMI-ANNUAL REVIEW of CLOSED SESSION MINUTES from TOM BETZ


All labor negotiations, regardless of age, should remain closed to avoid revealing management strategy;

Hiring and firing should be closed unless the person is deceased.

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Land purchases should be opened within five years of closing if not earlier so long as no deed issues remain.







TRICK-OR-TREAT HOURS

Halloween, October 31, 2011

Customarily, both the City of Urbana and the City of Champaign join with the Champaign County Board in setting aside trick-or-treat hours. The Champaign County Board has approved specific rules/guidelines/hours regarding trick-or-treat hours, and both Urbana and Champaign have agreed to the following schedule:

- ** Halloween/Trick-or-Treat will be held on October 31, regardless of what day of the week it is.
- ** If October 31 falls on a weekday (Monday through Friday), trick-or-treat hours will be 6:00 P.M. to 8:00 p.m.
- ** If October 31 falls on a weekend day (Saturday or Sunday), trick-or-treat hours will be 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.

Therefore, trick-or-treat hours for Halloween 2011 will be Monday, October 31, 2011, from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.
