ROSECANCE CHAMPAIGN COUNTY REENTRY PROGRAM

Rosecrance (RCI) Reentry Program focuses on reducing recidivisms. RCI Reentry Program provides intensive direct client and linkage services in the for all individuals currently or previously involved in the Criminal Justice System.

RCI Reentry Program establishes a non treatment plan for all referrals in one or all of the (7) identified needs (1) Community Resources (I.Ds, Birth Certificate, S.S Cards, etc.) (2) Education (3) Employment (4) Behavioral Health (MHS/SSA/MRT/Anger Management) (5) Health Insurance (6) Transportation (7) Housing.

RCI Reentry Program also facilitates the Champaign County Reentry Council bringing together all interested Reentry Programs, organizations and agencies to educate, establish, and implement systemic change within Champaign County to reduce recidivism by addressing the barriers that results into an individual to possibly reoffend.

RCI REENTRY PROGRAM BENEFITS

Champaign County Board funds a fully dedicated case manager and trained Mental Health Professional overseen by a Team Lead and Mental Health Director.

Ongoing Formation, Leadership and Organization of the Reentry Council

Internally partnerships with Mental Health & Substance Abuse services at Rosecrance

Externally partnerships for referral & linkage, i.e.: Champaign County Health Care Consumers, Champaign County Parole Office, Champaign County Jail, IDOC, etc.)

Data tracking, benchmarks and outcome measures

Continue to research Innovative ways to reach, connect with partners and individuals returning from incarceration.

2021 HIGHLIGHTED UPDATES

- IDOC has launched statewide pilot programs within facilities to assist current inmates in gathering official government documents & medical insurance updates upon release.
- Champaign County housing continues to be a barrier but strides have been made where Urbana & Champaign City Equity Offices are participates in the monthly reentry council. Future Plans are working to provide a process to educate and provide local landlords new laws & city ordinance updates as well as when they are violated.
- Transportation is a huge expense in reentry. Currently MTDs Leadership participates in monthly reentry council and willing to assist in providing solutions to the transportation barriers.
- New Criminal Justice Reform, Safety Act, & Cash Bail affects within Champaign County discussions address the how the Criminal Justice in general is responding to the criminal justice & reentry population

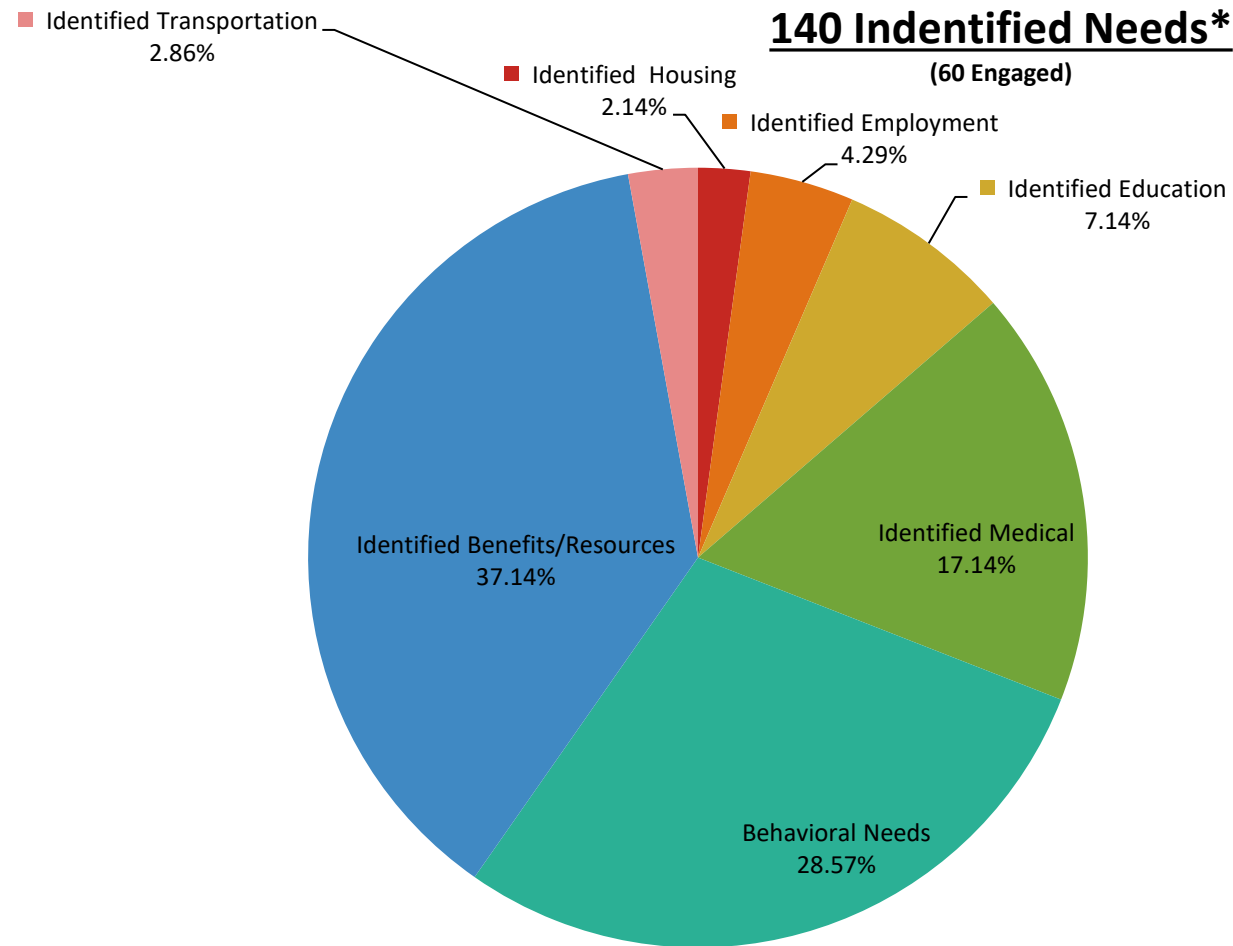
TRENDS

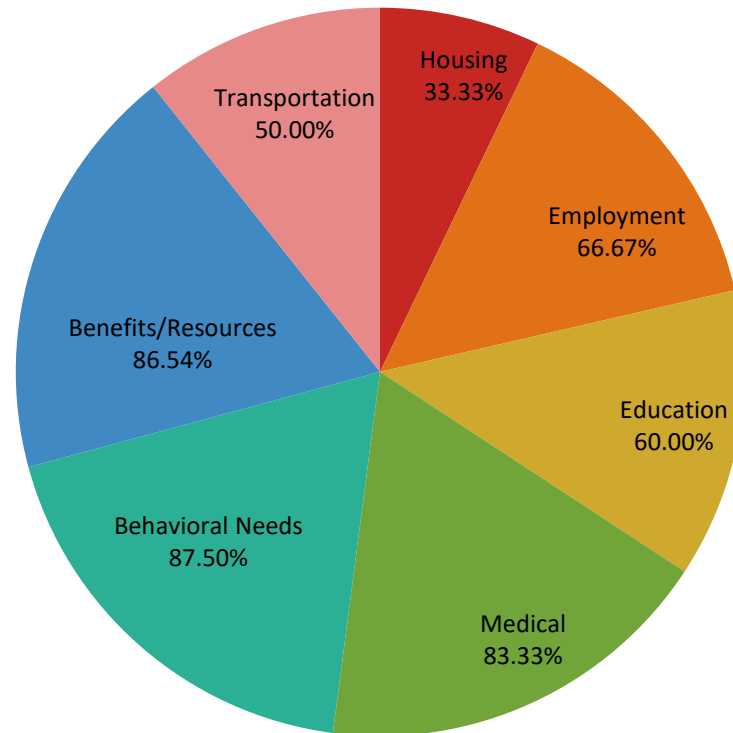
