The grant application was approved in January of 2022, and the remaining board resolution is necessary to get the grant under contract.

Provide a detailed project description (500 - 2000 characters)

The Champaign County Area Rural Transit System (C-CARTS) would benefit greatly from two replacement medium-duty buses. At present, five C-CARTS vehicles have surpassed the useful life in terms of mileage with an additional two buses projected to reach the replacement benchmark before fiscal year 2023. The current C-CARTS fleet consists of all sues total and of those buses five are over the current recommended and CVP milage replacement cap. Obtaining two replacement buses would greatly reduce C-CARTS maintenance burden in addition to providing the rural areas of Champaign County with up-to-date vehicles. C-CARTS overides deviated fixed-route and demand-response services to rural Champaign County residents. C-CARTS operates a deviated fixed-route in Rantoul from 6am to 9am and 3pm to 6pm. In between those times, C-CARTS provides demand-response services in Rantoul. C-CARTS serves demand-response services from 6am to 6pm for all of rural Champaign County as well. In 2020, CARTS served 34,246 trips, an increase of four percent from the previous year even through the COVID pandemic. In addition, C-CARTS holds a contract with the Village of Rantoul in which it provides a deviated fixed route transport around Rantoul and into the Champaign-Urbana urbanized area. The number of rides this system provides yearly is approximately 21,000 and is continuing to grow. When demand-response ridership is included, the number of rides increases to approximately 31,000. The Rantoul service covered approximately 154, 425 miles in Fiscal Year 2020. If a single bus is dedicated to this route, the bus will reach is useful life for milage in less than 2 years. Due to COVID oscial distancing requirements. C-CARTS is sent a second overflow bus during peak hours to ensure continued reliable service at the cost of increasing milage and wear on the vehicle. Thus, there is a high need to replace more buses before the end of fiscal year 2022.

Project Status / Readiness – Describe project planning or development efforts completed to prepare your project for rapid implementation

C-CARTS consistently monitors and updates its vehicle use information. As of the end o FY21, 8.3 percent of C-CARTS vehicles had reached their Useful Life Benchmark (ULB) and 3-4 vehicles were set to be replaced using CVP funding. Vehicle Identification Numbers (VIN) are tracked in conjunction with all ULB data so that the agency is aware of the condition and specific needs of each individual vehicle. Since specific vehicle needs have already been determined, C-CARTS will be able to rapidly replace two vehicles once the grant is awarded.
