#### MEETING MINUTES

Subject to Approval

- I. Call to Order Ms. Gisondi called the meeting to order at 3:05 p.m.
- II. Roll Call the roll was taken by sign in sheet
- III. Audience Participation None
- IV. Approval of Agenda

Mr. Montgomery motioned to approve the agenda. Ms. Sleeth seconded, and the motion carried unanimously. V. Approval of Minutes

Mr. Montgomery motioned to approve the RTAG minutes from the June 11, 2018 meeting. Ms. Sleeth seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

- VI. New Business
  - A. Approval of C-CARTS FY18 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter (April June) Service & Fiscal Reports

Ms. Gisondi provided the following comments on the reports:

- Total trips have increased.
- Daily average has remained at 113.
- Employment has moved up to the top trip type as opposed to medical.
- 8 percent decrease in lift use compared to this time last year but no identifiable reason for the decrease.
- Senior trips are now approximately half of the total ridership.
- Trips per miles have dropped which impacts efficiency in a positive way.
- Mr. Montgomery commented on the denials. Mr. Bargmann gave an example of a rider that calls to reserve rides for the whole month. There are certain times of the day that is busy and the time that the rider needed was not available.
- The fiscal report was discussed. The remaining funds after Quarter Four is at 33 percent.
- B. Approval of Alternate Members

Ms. Sleeth nominated Shirley Evans as an alternate for St. Joseph representation. Mr. Esry seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

C. Update on Vehicles

Ms. Gisondi provided the following highlights:

- Each year C-CARTS has the opportunity to submit an application for a Consolidated Vehicle Procurement with IDOT which provides vehicles for the services.
- Last year, an application was submitted for two super-medium duty vehicles and one medium duty vehicle. The reason there was a delay in the medium duty was because the contract was changed between IDOT and the manufacturers.
- It was decided it would be more beneficial to stay with medium duty vehicles that hold 14 passengers for the Rantoul Service. A driver would have to obtain a CDL license for the 26 passenger vehicle, which would impact pay rates due to the license requirement.
- D. Update on State Capital Grant Procurement (Grant No. CAP-14-1060-ILL, Contract No. 4490)
  Ms. Gisondi commented that C-CARTS did receive the ITS procurement and has submitted a requisition to IDOT. Below is the projected timeline:
  - August September:
    - o Obtain quotes for lockers, workspaces, computers and monitors
    - o Approximate requisition total: \$5,800
  - November December:
    - o Purchase approximately 22 benches for bus stops in the Village of Rantoul
    - o Approximate requisition total: \$19,800
  - Mr. Bargmann commented that the staff has had 4 training sessions on the tablet. In September, there will be an on-site visit for 4-5 days to get ready for active service. The staff will then begin to show the bus operators what the system looks like and the interaction with the system. So far, the feedback has been positive.
- E. Presentation on FY18 C-CARTS Data
  - FY18 ridership total was 26,134 versus 21,037 in FY17.
  - April was the only month that the Deviated-Fixed route ridership surpassed the Demand Response route ridership.
  - FY18 fare box revenue total was \$60,709.16 versus \$51,595.44 in FY17.
  - FY18 service hours total was 17,083 versus 17,367 in FY17.
  - FY18 denial total was 586 versus 1,055 in FY17.
- F. Update on Rantoul Service & Outreach Efforts

Ms. Gisondi provided the following highlights:

- April ridership 935
- May ridership 751
- June ridership 742 versus 390 in June 2017
- The new contract in year one will allow a 1 percent increase and year two, another 1 percent increase

- Trips are one-way rides, counted each time an individual rider enters and exits a vehicle. A round-trip would count as two trips.
- Days are the number of business days (normally M-F, except on Federal holidays and closures due to inclement weather) operated during the month.
- Average Trips is the total trips divided by total number of operating days.
- Accessible services include the number of trips requiring ADA Lift equipment to be used, and trips provided to older adults 60+ years of age.

#### AN AGREEMENT REGARDING EXPANDING SERVICES OF THE RANTOUL TRANSPORTATION SERVICE <u>PROGRAM ("C-CARTS")</u>

WHEREAS, the County of Champaign (hereafter simply "COUNTY") was awarded a Downstate Operating Assistance and FTA Section 5311 Combined Grant for rural public transportation; and

WHEREAS, the COUNTY and the Champaign-Urbana Mass Transit District (hereafter simply "MTD"), entered into an Intergovernmental Agreement (hereafter simply "IGA") dated September 17, 2015, to provide rural public transportation; and

WHEREAS, in the IGA, MTD was named as the designated provider of rural public transportation to operate a separate transportation service program to be known as "C-CARTS", and those COUNTY vehicles formerly used by the prior rural transportation provider known as CRIS, were leased to MTD; and

WHEREAS, in the IGA, the Champaign County Regional Planning Commission ("RPC"), and the Rural Transit Advisory Group ("RTAG") were delegated oversight and coordination authority relating to the provision of rural public transportation service; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Rantoul (hereafter simply "RANTOUL") has proposed that the C-CARTS service be provided to RANTOUL; and RPC, RTAG and MTD have all agreed to such proposal and desire to set forth their agreement in writing.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1) RTAG and RPC hereby approve of the changes herein regarding rural public transportation services to be provided in the Village of Rantoul by MTD as set forth in the IGA.
- 2) The term of this agreement shall be two (2) years from the date of execution by RANTOUL set forth in the signature block for the Village of Rantoul.
- 3) (a) RANTOUL agrees to make monthly payments, following the schedule below, directly to Champaign-Urbana Mass Transit District at 1101 E. University Avenue, Urbana, Illinois, for each full month of transportation services provided to RANTOUL as set forth in this agreement.

(b) The monthly payments due hereunder shall be paid on or before the 10<sup>th</sup> day of each month following the month in which the transit services were provided.

(c) The parties agree to apportion the monthly payment due hereunder for any month in which the transportation services are provided for only a portion of the month.

- (d) Fares collected are not a credit against the monthly payments due hereunder.
- 4) (a) In the event of any changes affecting MTD's ability to provide service, contact shall be made with RANTOUL's Village Administrator. In the event of emergency changes in service conditions in the Village of Rantoul, RANTOUL shall contact the MTD Operations Department (Drew Bargmann, Randy Fouts, or Tracey Pettigrew).

(b) On a monthly basis, MTD shall provide RANTOUL reporting on route ridership, service hours, and service mileage.

5) MTD is offering access to open-door deviated-fixed route service (Attachment A) to the general public for a common fare. MTD will consult with RANTOUL on service changes. MTD as the operator for C-CARTS will adhere to the federal regulations regarding publicly offered route service. Nothing in this agreement shall be construed to limit MTD's obligations to follow those regulations.

Route performance will be assessed with RANTOUL on an annual basis.

- 6) Any of the parties may terminate this Agreement in ninety (90) days written notice to the other parties. MTD may suspend its service under this Agreement if RANTOUL fails to make timely payments as set forth in paragraph 3 above.
- 7) The parties acknowledge that nothing in this agreement creates a joint venture or other business relationship among/between the parties other than those specifically set forth herein.
- 8) Notices provided for shall be deemed given when mailed by certified mail to the parties at their address given below in their signature block:
