2020 Census timeline

- March 9, 2020 = Census form opened
- March 11, 2020 = WHO declares COVID-19 global pandemic
- July 31, 2020 = Original deadline to submit Census forms
- Summer/Fall 2020 = CCRPC and community partners perform inperson Census assistance
- Fall 2020 = Deadline to close Census form continually shifts
- October 15, 2020 = Final deadline to submit Census forms



2021 Census timeline

- Census geographic products will be released for Illinois = February
- Process Apportionment Counts
 - Original deadline: December 31, 2020
 - Estimated target: March 6-April 30, 2021
- Process Redistricting Data
 - Original deadline: March 31, 2021
 - Estimated target: Spring/Summer 2021



Census data processing

- Amount of time the Census Bureau has had to process decennial Census data:
 - 1990 = 21 weeks
 - 2000 = 26 weeks
 - 2010 = 21 weeks
 - 2020 = 11 weeks, if they were to have met the 12/31/2020 deadline



Hard to Count (HTC) Populations (including Champaign County percentages)

- 1. Under age 5 (6%)
- 2. Young and mobile = 15-24 year olds (27%)
- 3. Over age 85 (1.4%)
- Population with income below 100% of poverty level (21%)
- 5. Households receiving public assistance income
- 6. People of color
 - 1. Hispanic (6%)
 - 2. Black (14%)
 - 3. Asian (11%)

Hard to Count (HTC) Populations cont'd (including Champaign County percentages)

7. Foreign-born (12%)

- 46% entered the U.S. since 2010
- 71% entered the U.S. since 2000

8. Limited English speaking households (4%)


- 61% speak Asian and Pacific Islander languages
- 19% speak Spanish
- 9. Persons who moved from an outside county in the past year (12.3%)
- 10. Adults age 25+ who are not high school graduates (4%)
- 11. Persons age 16+ who are unemployed (6% of labor force)
- 12. Renter-occupied housing units (45% of households)

Hard to Count (HTC) Populations, cont'd (including Champaign County percentages)

- 13. Vacant housing units (10.3%)
- 14. Large/overcrowded households (5% of households)
- 15. Non-family households (49.5%)
- 16. Population without Internet Access (13.5% of households)
- 17. Population without Cell Phone Data Plan (21%)

2020 Self-Response Rates

- United States: 67%
- Illinois: 71.4%
 - #7 out of 50 states
- Champaign County: 68.6%
- Champaign: 64.9%
- Urbana: 67%
- Savoy: 71.6%
- Rantoul: 65.1%
- Mahomet: 81.4%
- St. Joseph: 85.2%



2020 Census considerations

- UIUC student confusion or lack of awareness about where to complete their Census forms.
- Confusion and lack of trust among foreign-born residents about completing Census form and citizenship question.
- COVID-19 delaying and preventing inperson Census taker visits.
- Even if these issues do not affect the quality of the 2020 Census data, the public may question the data validity.
- However, we must work with the data available.
