Empowering Families Through Housing Innovation

In 2021, with the help of their support team, Sharon led the establishment of a successful, family-managed, 24/7 supported living home "model" for three women with disabilities.

In 2023, with the help of her team, the Creative Housing Network was established. A strategic planning summit spearheaded by this network of families and individuals with disabilities was held in May of 2024 in Springfield, IL. The **Engage IL Coalition** was a direct outcome of this summit. In addition, the key stakeholders in the Developmental Disability system, participants of the summit, identified goals to advance a person-centered system based on national best practice for sustainable, community-based supported living opportunities and full, meaningful lives for individuals with developmental disabilities in Illinois.

<u>Leading Systemic Change in Illinois</u>

In 2025, this tenacious group of families secured an infrastructure grant from the Coleman Foundation to establish a unified voice for individuals with disabilities and their families. The Engage IL Coalition is fiscally sponsored by TotalLink to Community, a 501c3 organization serving the same population. The mission established during the Springfield summit: To drive Illinois toward a person-centered service system based on national best practices with the ability to amplify the voices of those directly impacted, to identify critical gaps in the system, and to efficiently address equity, choice, and community living for all with systemic change.

- Group homes run by licensed providers
- Est annual cost: \$80 125K
- CILA providers are not accepting individuals with high medical or behavioral needs.

Home Based Program

- Stipend 3 times x Social Security \$34K/year
- Intended to provide funds to keep loved one at home until moving into CILA
- Not sufficient funds to create a personcentered self directed life.
- Over 80% of individuals are choosing Home-Based by default due to no other flexible options available.


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Persons in Service by Living Arrangement - June 2024

Q2 Please provide Gender of person on PUNS list:





Q4 Please provide Ethnicity of person on PUNS list:








Q7 How long have you been waiting on the PUNS list?


Q8 Which service category are you currently in on PUNS?

Q9 Where are you currently living?




Q13 Are you interested in support to find competitive employment opportunities?


Q14 Are you interested in volunteer opportunities?

Q19 What leisure activities do you currently enjoy taking part in? Select all that apply:







Q21 What areas would you benefit from support in? Select all that apply:




Q22 Are you currently on the waiting list for any of the above services?



Q25 Are you currently receiving case management services? If so, where from?




