CHAMPAIGN COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH Monthly Meeting

November 27, 2006

Call to Order & Roll Call

The Board of Health of Champaign County held its monthly meeting on November 27, 2006 in meeting room two at Brookens Administrative Center, 1776 East Washington, Urbana. The meeting was called to order at 6:05 p.m. by Kim Winston. Upon roll call, the following board members were found to be present: Stan James, Susan Maurer, Julian Rappaport, Carrie Storrs and Kim Winston. The following members were absent: Nezar Kassem, Tom O'Rourke, John Peterson. Others present: Susan McGrath, Vito Palazzolo, Jan Anderson, Claudia Lenhoff, Lisa Bell.

Public Participation

There was no public participation.

Approval of Minutes – August 22, 2006 and September 26, 2006

MOTION by James to approve the minutes of August 22, 2006 and September 26, 2006; seconded by Storrs.

Mr. Rappaport stated he would like his comments from the September 26, 2006 meeting regarding Mr. Peterson's budget presentation included in those minutes.

Motion carried to approve the minutes of August 22, 2006 and the minutes of September 26, 2006, as amended.

Monthly Reports (October 2006) Champaign-Urbana Public Health District's Divisions

Ms. Winston stated this report is available on the website. Ms. Maurer asked about the 11 County visits for Home Health and how many staff are doing that. Mr. Palazzolo stated he has two staff members who are in home health care but they are not just doing those visits. There were about 26-30 County residents in that program with over 140 persons all together. Ms. Maurer asked what happened to the other County residents on the program because we are now down to 19. Mr. Palazzolo stated he is not sure of the specifics, they are not taking any new residents even though there have been requests. There have been no services terminated nor has there been any indication that will happen. He explained there was a resignation of the director in that program and they just hired a new one and they are working toward creating criteria. He stated they are evaluating what the program is, the needs of the program and what the costs are. They have noted there have been people on the program over 13 years and they need to determine what the real true role of the program is. He explained he has drastically reduced staff to two persons but kept the same visiting number and reminded the board that the CUPHD Board might say this is something they may not want to continue. Mr. Rappaport stated in their last budget they approved funds to hire a person, he asked what the plans are for that and how they, as a board, can be engaged in that. He stated he would like to know how to make this work better, increasing communication between the Board of Health and the CUPHD. He stated one of the things he had in mind when they decided to have an administrative person was to have that person track what comes out of the meetings; it would be their responsibility to not let things fall through the cracks because currently we don't know who is responsible for what.

Mr. Palazzolo stated if he had given this board the impression that the CUPHD board nor he is advocating the home health program go away, that is the wrong impression and there has been no decision made in that manner. They are reviewing the program to determine the best usage of their dollars and the CUPHD Board will determine if it is a need for the community that should be continued. He stated that the Board does not have a process to address these kinds of personnel issues and he is not sure whose responsibility it is to do that. He suggested they may need a job description for that position and if it is a county employee he believes it should go to the County Administrator or they could look at amending the contract with the CUPHD. He also stated there is another issue with the contract, a large part that has been mis-defined that states he is this boards administrator. Mr. Palazzolo stated the intent of him being the administrator for the board as compared to what the job has turned into and what is expected of him are drastically different. They are required by law to have an administrator and the initial contract was put together so it would cost the county minimal dollars to put programs together. He believes the contract needs to be addressed and cleared up so both boards understand what the relationship means. Mr. Rappaport stated our contract doesn't run out for two years so we are not required to renegotiate that contract but he agrees, we do need to clarify. Mr. Palazzolo stated he will be happy to be at any meeting to discuss the contract but the board needs to decide what they want from that position. Mr. James suggested we put this issue on the next agenda.

Mr. Rappaport stated, when discussing the administrative support, that they never discussed the duties of this position and the board should start thinking about the 10 hours this support provides and what else the duties could include. Ms. McGrath stated the County absorbed the cost of providing administrative help from July until December and at this point the board was to review what, if anything else, they wanted from the position.

Ms. Winston stated the board needs to review the contract, review the consultants report and the minutes from the training we had this summer. She suggested having a special meeting in December and a study session in early January.

Ms. McGrath explained that there ordinarily would not be a meeting in December but because of our fiscal year the board will need to approve the last two invoices from CUPHD at a meeting in December.

<u>CIDES</u>

Ms. Maurer pointed out that there are big numbers on this month's reports.

MOTION by Winston to receive and place on file the CUPHD monthly reports that are available on the website, and the CIDES report for October 2006; seconded by James. **Motion carried.**

Mr. Rappaport stated they should express some sort of thank you to the County Board for continuing this program.

Ms. Bell stated that she informed the County Board that it is because of what they all do together that creates situations like what we are in right now. They are seeing more kids now than they ever have before and they are doing it on the same amount of money they have for 5 years and a lot of it has to do with the generosity of providers. The impact they are making on the health and well-being of the county's children is huge. Mr. Rappaport stated he feels they should send a letter to these professional people who are contributing to this program and let them know it is noticed.

Ms. McGrath stated if Ms. Bell will provide the addresses they will get the letters out.

Correspondence & Communications

Ms. Winston stated the members received a FOIA request from a citizen. Mr. Bailey, who is requesting information as to whether there is a conflict of interest with several board members.

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Ms. McGrath stated it is up to the board as to how they would like to move forward from here, they are not commanded to do anything. Mr. James stated, without the people named in the document being present, they can just accept it and place it on file. Mr. Rappaport stated he is going to ask for a legal opinion about what constitutes a conflict of interest, with respect to this board, because most of the activities brought up in the packet have to do with members of this board and other roles to the CUPHD. Ms. McGrath stated this issue was raised in very similar form about 3 years ago and at that time the State's Attorney's office issued an informal opinion and brought it to the Board of Health; those materials, Mr. Bailey received in response to his FOIA request. She explained that because she is one of the people discussed in the correspondence, this is something the State's Attorney's office will have to decide on how they want to respond. Mr. Rappaport stated, as a county agency, they would like to ask the State's Attorney who they go to for legal advice. Ms. McGrath stated, by statute, the State's Attorney is their legal council. He stated in addition to just accepting this we are now going to ask the State's Attorney what our legal responsibilities are, suggesting a written request and requesting a response back on a date before our study session. Ms. McGrath stated County Administration will arrange to ask for that opinion as well as a clarification to the conflicts of interest.

Ms. Winston explained she received a letter from Carol Elliott, regarding comments made at the September meeting, which she feels is not an accurate reflection of what took place in that meeting. In general, her comments were that we all came to the agreement that Dr. Peterson could have used a better term, during his budget presentation, but he did qualify what he said with an explanation. She stated they voted for the budget and they would not have done that if they felt there was a problem with CUPHD. Mr. James stated that overall, everyone he has spoke with felt Dr. Peterson did a great job with the budget explanation. Dr. Rappaport stated he agrees that Dr. Peterson's presentation of the budget itself was extremely well done and represented the group accurately and clearly and he doesn't want to mix that up with the other issue. Ms. Storrs stated because there were people who were concerned about the comments and presented those concerns in writing to the board, they deserve a response in writing to clarify it was a regrettable use of words and it is not the intent of the board.

Ms. McGrath stated she would be happy to construct a response letter to Ms. Elliott, including comments stated at the September meeting. Ms. Winston reminded the committee that at the September meeting they stated they want to make sure their relationship with CUPHD is a good one and she expressed concern about Dr. Peterson's comments.

Mr. Palazzolo stated he is not asking for an apology but that type of comment is totally unnecessary and he doesn't want it to be continued. He feels it is insulting to he and his staff and makes the CUPHD look bad and gives the impression they are doing something with their books.

<u>Treasurers Report</u> Report from the Champaign County Auditor

Ms. McGrath reported there is no report from the Auditor's office this month.

Approval of Invoices submitted by CUPHD for 8/06 and 9/06

Ms. McGrath stated Dr. Peterson asked her to report to the board that he did have a chance to review the invoices submitted by the Public Health District for August and September and recommends their approval to the board.

Ms. Winston asked about the September invoice being almost double. Ms. Maurer stated there were three pay periods in September and there were also some issues about grant reimbursement.

MOTION by Ms. Maurer to approve payment of the August 2006 and September 2006 CUPHD invoices; seconded by Ms. Storrs. **Motion carried.**

Old Business Administrator's Report

Mr. Palazzolo reported that CUPHD has purchased a new building which they are very excited about. It is 100,000 square feet and is on Kenyon Road, just off of interstate 74. They are looking at the administrative office on Broadway and some staff from the Neil Street office to be moved in by early January. He explained they have a lot of new things being developed; with Health Care Consumers help they are looking at getting into some primary care with one of the local hospitals, they are looking at an eye glass program for people on Medicaid and they are looking at expanding to adult dental. They have hired a new dentist, a new IT employee, and a new HR director and they are still looking for a second dentist. He also explained that the board will be receiving another letter from the CUPHD board chairperson explaining at their last regular meeting there was a vote for him to look through all the programs that are currently being provided in the county. Their legal council made it clear if they are subsidizing county programs with CUPHD dollars, they cannot continue to do that; any program that is a county program that cannot be funded will be discontinued. As a result, they are going to look at programs being provided in the contract and what the costs of those are. He asked the board to also put the subcommittee back together to look at the contract and some of the issues that are in that contract. He reported that the CUPHD board approved, at their November meeting, to open up the Neil Street office one day a week on Tuesdays for the Christian Health Center to provide services.

Claudia Lenhoff stated that CUPHD is looking at what will happen if the County Board decided to not fund the child dental access program. The question was, if it would be possible to have that program, which serves county residents, continue to operate but as a program of CUPHD. If all of the money for that program comes from C-U tax payers but it only serves county residents, it could not continue. They are looking at long term stability for that program but the only way it could continue to operate would be if there was a funding component from the county; the only programs for the county that could not be subsidized by CUPHD would be those where there is no county money coming in.

Set meeting date for Ordinance Review Committee

Ms. McGrath stated the date of this meeting will depend upon when the committee sets their other meetings.

<u>New Business</u> Renewal of contract with CIDES

Ms. McGrath explained the contract is set to expire at the end of November and the County Board has approved its grant to the Board of health to allow that program to continue. Before the board tonight is the exact same contract as last year with CIDES, the only change she recommends is the paragraph that states if there are some changes with CIDES during the course of this contract year we could sit down and look at what would happen as a result of that change. The procedure would be that the Board of Health gives their approval of this contract and it would then go to the CUPHD board for their final approval. Ms. Lenhoff stated their attorney has not seen this but they are in agreement as far as where they want to go; she is worried that this board is not having a regular meeting again until January and she suggested just extending the current contract.

Ms. McGrath stated they can add approval of the contract to the short December agenda.

MOTION by Mr. James to extend the current CIDES contract until 12/19/2006 at which time a new contract will become effective; seconded by Ms. Storrs. **Motion** carried.

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Other Business

CHAMPAIGN COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH

STUDY SESSION

Tuesday, January 16, 2007

The Board of Health of Champaign County held a Study Session meeting on January 16, 2007 in meeting room 2 at Brookens Administrative Center at 1776 East Washington, Urbana. The meeting was called to order at 6:05 p.m. Upon roll call, the following board members were found to be present: Kim Winston, Susan Maurer, Carrie Storrs, Dr. Peterson, Stan James and Dr. Rappaport. Dr. Kassem and Dr. O'Rourke were absent. Others present were Susan McGrath, Claudia Lenhoff, Deb Fruitt, Julie Pride and Deb Busey.

Correspondence and Communications

Ms. McGrath explained that Peter Tracy was not available to attend the meeting on this date, but would provide a letter and information for the next regular meeting of the Board of Health, and would also attend the next meeting on January 30, 2007.

Study Session Discussion Items

- 1. **2006 Champaign County Community Health Plan** The board engaged in a discussion of the report, focusing on the key findings of the report, and the impact of those findings on the initiatives and plans to be adopted by the County Board of Health (hereinafter BOH). One item not mentioned in the report but believed to be critical by the BOH members was the lack of access to health care as a cause of health problems. BOH members discussed the need to identify the best use of the limited dollars to provide the most extensive level of services. Issues identified: focus on options for the delivery of services to those receiving home health care coordination with the Mental Health Board, RPC and Senior Services could relieve some of the burden on the BOH.
- 2. **Community Nursing Program -** Deb Fruitt and Julie Pride from CUPHD joined the BOH in its discussion at this point. Ms. Fruitt explained that there are a total of about 120 home health care recipients, and that 19 of those are in the County. The home nursing services is not currently accepting new clients, and is currently being assessed and re-evaluated; however current clients continue to receive the status quo in services no county residents have had their services discontinued.

The consensus of the BOH members is that the home nursing services program is a priority, but they lack necessary information regarding the

program. There was also agreement that if CUPHD were not to continue the home nursing services program, the BOH would continue the program through another provider. Susan Maurer stated that the BOH budgeted for a position for this program, which is something Deb Fruitt indicated is under consideration. The concept of using the BOH new position in a case coordinator capacity, to work towards an appropriate needs assessment and coordination of services to be provided to the residents of this program was discussed. The goal of the program is to take a comprehensive view of the needs of the clients, with the objective of avoiding or delaying institutional placement for those individuals.

Claudia Lenhoff was recognized and provided information about the Robert Wood Foundation and a model for setting up programs where the public health nurse trains lay people to look for health issues as they conduct home visits, and then call in health professionals when required.

As a result of the discussion, the BOH determined the following information would be requested from Vito Palazzolo for their next regularly scheduled meeting:

- a. Written report of the status of the Home Nursing Services Program for the period from October 2006 to December 2006, including:
 (a) number of clients served; (b) description of services provided, including a description of the staff time and position titles/qualifications of those providing the services; and (c) cost of the services provided.
- b. Short term plan for the County Board of Health's Home Nursing Services Program through the end of the 1st quarter of 2007, said report to include the current protocol for admission/discharge criteria for service.

BOH members agreed to Kim Winston sending a letter documenting this request to Vita Palazzolo, and to request he also attend the next BOH meeting. The members also agreed that Kim Winston should send a letter to Carol Elliott, Chair of the CUPHD Board, to request information regarding the CUPHD Board's sense of what issues exist between the two boards.

3. **Potential Joint Efforts with Champaign County Mental Health Board** – Board members discussed the value of working with the Mental Health Board, particularly as it might relate to the possibility of the development of a grant writing position to be jointly assigned to both the Mental Health Board and the BOH. The BOH agreed this item would be deferred until the regularly scheduled

January 30, 2007 BOH meeting so that Peter Tracy, Executive Director Champaign County Mental Health Board, could be present for the discussion.

4. Agency Staffing Needs & Potential Referendum November 2008 – These two items were discussed together as the issue of staffing is directly tied to the issue of funding which might be addressed by a November 2008 Referendum. One of the first steps in both processes is to document exactly where the BOH currently stands in terms of programming, and needs.

Claudia Lenhoff was asked to comment on the issue of a referendum. Ms. Lenhoff indicated that the Friends of Public Health would be in support of the general concept of a referendum regarding the funding of the BOH. She shared information regarding the work done by Illinois Health Care Consumers in the months leading up to the first referendum establishing the County Board of Health. She reminded members that coordinated leadership from both the County Board of Health and CUPHD Board would be instrumental in promoting and passing whatever referendum is deemed the most appropriate to be placed before the voters.

There was discussion about the approaches that could be taken – combining the two health districts into one with one property tax rate for all citizens of Champaign County; or increasing the property tax rate for the County Board of Health to be increased above the rate allowed currently under PTELL (tax caps). There was consensus among the members that regardless of which question is placed on the ballot, there is a substantial amount of work to be done to get the word out to the voters.

There was also discussion focusing on the administrative services required by the BOH, and the fact that currently the BOH does not really have an Administrator to rely on. The BOH currently uses Champaign County Administrative Services support staff for support functions – agendas, minutes, action reports, calendaring, etc., but in the long term will have a need for an Administrator to assist in the planning and development of programs to be offered by the BOH. This discussion led back to the earlier discussion of obtaining more documentation from the CUPHD Board regarding the relationship between the two boards.

Upcoming Meeting

The next regular, monthly meeting will be held on January 30, 2007 at 6:00 p.m. in Meeting Room 2, Brookens Administrative Center, 1776 East Washington, Urbana, IL.

Ms. Winston declared the meeting adjourned at 8:07 p.m.

On behalf of the Champaign County Board of Health, I wanted to acknowledge receipt of your letter dated November 20, 2006 and received by me on November 30, 2006. Unfortunately, I did not receive it in time for consideration by the Board of Health at its regular meeting on November 27, 2006. However, the text of your letter was transmitted to the Board members on December 1, 2006. In addition, I directed the Board's attorney, Susan W. McGrath, to contact the attorney for the District, Fred Grosser, to gather further information in order to provide you with an appropriate response to your communication.


Ms. McGrath and Mr. Grosser met on December 15, 2006 to discuss your letter. At that time, Ms. McGrath informed Mr. Grosser that the District had not provided to the Board an updated Appendix B at the beginning of the County's fiscal year, which commenced on December 1, 2006. In addition, she also informed Mr. Grosser that it had been the understanding of our Board based upon our conversations with Vito Palazzolo this summer that the monies appropriated by the Board of Health for the CUPHD contract were sufficient to cover not only the core services, but also all of the services which CUPHD provided during FY06. Until we receive Appendix B, it is impossible for us to respond to your letter, because we don't know what the cost of the mandatory services and the non-mandatory services are projected by CUPHD to be for FY07. Mr. Grosser said that he would discuss this matter with Mr. Palazzolo and yourself in more detail, and get back to us with a response. As of today, we have not received any response to these concerns.

In addition, when Mr. Palazzolo attended the Board of Health meeting on November 27, 2006, he told the Board that he no longer considered himself to be the Administrator of the County Board of Health except for the routine execution of documents form the State Department of Public Health. If that is the case, then the Board must consider what it needs to do to retain executive administrative staff. This unexpected turn of events will have an impact on the Board's budget, and will also affect our response to your letter. As of today, although this was requested by letter to Mr. Grosser on December 8, 2006, we have not received a written opinion from Mr. Grosser as to the basis for this decision. Again, this information would be most helpful in answering your letter.

I would appreciate the opportunity to meet with you and discuss your letter further, so that we can talk more about what concerns led to your letter, and what we can do to address them. If your schedule permits, I would like to meet with you next week. Thank you for your consideration of this request, and your anticipated assistance in helping us get the information we need to answer your letter.

* Research Overview

The Chronic Disease Self-Management Program is a workshop given two and a half hours, once a week, for six weeks, in community settings such as senior centers, churches, libraries and hospitals. People with different chronic health problems attend together. Workshops are facilitated by two trained leaders, one or both of whom are non-health professionals with a chronic diseases themselves.

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Subjects covered include: 1) techniques to deal with problems such as frustratifatigue, pain and isolation, 2) appropriate exercise for maintaining and improvir strength, flexibility, and endurance, 3) appropriate use of medications, 4) communicating effectively with family, friends, and health professionals, 5) nutrand, 6) how to evaluate new treatments.

Each participant in the workshop receives a copy of the companion book, *Livin*! *Healthy Life With Chronic Conditions, 2nd Edition*, and an audio relaxation tape for *Healing*.*

It is the process in which the program is taught that makes it effective. Classes highly participative, where mutual support and success build the participants' confidence in their ability to manage their health and maintain active and fulfillir

Does the Program replace existing programs and treatments?

The Self-Management Program will not conflict with existing programs or treatn designed to enhance regular treatment and disease-specific education such as Breathers, cardiac rehabilitation, or diabetes instruction. In addition, many peor more than one chronic condition. The program is especially helpful for these pe it gives them the skills to coordinate all the things needed to manage their healt well as to help them keep active in their lives.

How was the Program developed?

The Division of Family and Community Medicine in the <u>School of Medicine</u> at <u>S</u> <u>University</u> received a five year research grant from the federal <u>Agency for Heal</u> <u>Research and Policy</u> and the <u>State of California Tobacco-Related Diseases</u> offi purpose of the research was to develop and evaluate, through a randomized co trial, a community-based self-management program that assists people with ch illness. The study was completed in 1996.

The research project had several investigators: Halsted Holman, M.D., Stanford

Professor of Medicine; Kate Lorig, Dr.P.H., Stanford Professor of Medicine; Da Sobel, M.D., Regional Director of Patient Education for the Northern California <u>Permanente Medical Care Program</u>; Albert Bandura, Ph.D., Stanford Professor Psychology; and Byron Brown, Jr., Ph.D., Stanford Professor of Health Resear Policy. The Program was written by Dr. Lorig, Virginia González, M.P.H., and E Laurent, M.P.H., all of the Stanford Patient Education Research Center. Ms. Gc and Ms. Laurent also served as integral members of the research team.

The process of the program was based on the experience of the investigators ϵ others with self-efficacy, the confidence one has that he or she can master a ne or affect one's own health. The content of the workshop was the result of focus with people with chronic disease, in which the participants discussed which cor areas were the most important for them.

How was the Program evaluated?

Over 1,000 people with heart disease, lung disease, stroke or arthritis participa randomized, controlled test of the Program, and were followed for up to three y looked for changes in many areas: health status (disability, social/role limitatior and physical discomfort, energy/fatigue, shortness of breath, psychological wel being/distress, depression, health distress, self-rated general health), health ca utilization (visits to physicians, visits to emergency department, hospital stays, i nights in hospital), self-efficacy (confidence to perform self-management behav confidence to manage disease in general, confidence to achieve outcomes), ar management behaviors (exercise, cognitive symptom management, mental stromanagement/relaxation, use of community resources, communication with physican advance directives).**

What were the results?

Subjects who took the Program, when compared to those who did not, demons significant improvements in exercise, cognitive symptom management, commu with physicians, self-reported general health, health distress, fatigue, disability, social/role activities limitations. They also spent fewer days in the hospital, and was also a trend toward fewer outpatients visits and hospitalizations. These da cost to savings ratio of approximately 1:10. Many of these results persist for as three years.***

How can my facility offer the Program?

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RESOLUTION REGARDING DESIGNATION OF THE NATIONAL INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (NIMS) AS THE BASIS FOR ALL INCIDENT MANAGEMENT FOR CHAMPAIGN COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT

WHEREAS, the President in Homeland Security Directive (HSPD)-5 directed the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security to develop and administer a National Incident Management System (NIMS) which would provide a consistent nationwide approach for Federal, State, local, and tribal governments to work together more effectively and efficiently to prevent, prepare for, respond to and recover from domestic incidents, regardless of cause, size or complexity; and

WHEREAS, to facilitate the most efficient and effective incident management it is critical that Federal, State, local and tribal organizations utilize standardized terminology, standardized organizational structures, interoperable communications, consolidated action plans, unified command structures, uniform personnel qualifications standards, uniform standards for planning, training and exercising, comprehensive resource management, and designated incident facilities during emergencies or disasters; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary and desirable that the Champaign County Health Department and all personnel coordinate their efforts to effectively and efficiently provide the highest levels of incident management processes; and

WHEREAS, the NIMS standardized procedures for managing personnel, communications, facilities and resources will improve the Champaign County Health Department's ability to utilize federal funding to enhance local readiness, maintain first responder/employee safety, and streamline incident management processes;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Champaign County Board of Health designates the National Incident Management System (NIMS) as the Champaign County Health Department standard for incident management. FURTHER, the Champaign County Board of Health authorizes the Board President, Kimberly Winston, to execute whatever documents are necessary to implement the said designation.
