Background

Due to the outbreak of Coronavirus disease (COVID-19), Governor JB Pritzker's Executive Order Number 7, effective March 16, 2020, required bars and restaurants to suspend on-premises consumption, but allowed delivery service, drive-through and curbside pick-up to continue. To most food establishments, this change in operations was very disruptive resulting in financial hardship.

In March 2020, the Champaign-Urbana Public Health District (CUPHD) Board of Health postponed food establishment health permit renewal billing (due April 30, 2020) and allowed for a temporary permit extension. In July 2020, the CUPHD Board approved reinstating the billing (starting August 2020) and reducing the amount of the annual health permit fee by 25%. This fee reduction approximately corresponds to the amount of time that food establishments were under this Executive Order until restaurants and bars were reopened under State of Illinois Phase 4 guidelines (June 26, 2020).

Invoices for the annual renewal of county food establishment health permits for FY2021 (calendar year 2021) will be ready to mail on October 31, 2020. The FY2021 annual budget process for the county health department and the county is now in progress. It seems it would take significant effort to make health department and county budget changes during the ongoing FY2021 budget process. Does this Board want to consider a similar fee reduction in the annual renewal fee for those food establishment that were operating in 2020 for FY2022?

Current annual renewal fees are Category I \$400, Category II \$300, and Category III \$150. The Champaign County Health Department collected about \$85,500 for FY2020 from the annual renewal of food establishment health permits. A 25% fee reduction would reduce the collected amount by \$21,375 and yield a revenue line of \$64,125 for FY2022.

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BOARD OF HEALTH

Fund 089-049

The Champaign County Board of Health is established by 55 ILCS 5/5-20 and consists of nine members, appointed by the County Board Chair to three-year, staggered terms. The Board is responsible for disease control and the physical and environmental health of County residents. This Board is supported through the Health Fund property tax levy; federal, state and local grants; and fees. The maximum rate for the Health Fund levy is \$0.10/\$100 assessed valuation. The current rate for the total Health levy is \$0.03/\$100 assessed valuation.

MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of the Champaign County Public Health Department is to promote health, prevent disease, and lessen the impact of illness through the effective use of community resources.

BUDGET HIGHLIGHTS

The Board of Health budget is dependent upon property taxes, permits, and federal and state grants for specific public health services. The property tax is estimated at this time because the total levy is not split between Champaign-Urbana Public Health District (CUPHD) and the Board of Health (BOH) until the County Clerk's Office provides the equalized assessed values (EAV) in May of the subsequent year. The historical percentage of the levy split is shown later in this document.

The Board of Health enters into a contract with the CUPHD to provide public health services throughout the County. The Board of Health has annually awarded a grant in the amount of \$45,000 to the Smile Healthy child dental access program. Allocation of the \$45,000 is included in this budget in the child dental access program line item.

In 2020, the Sixth Judicial Circuit Court ruled regarding the Carle Foundation property tax exemption case for parcels in Carle's main campus for tax years 2005-2011. The Board of Health's portion of the court ordered refund was \$54,388, plus \$420 in post-judgement interest. Based on the advice of the County's outside auditor, the refund was treated as a revenue reduction and post-judgement interest costs were treated as expenditures. Reserve fund balance totaling \$33,165 was released to be applied towards the judgement. It should be noted that potential liability involving other hospital property tax exemption disputes is not included in the amounts reflected above.

The projected FY2020 budget reflects the addition of IDPH COVID-19 Crisis grant funding and DCEO COVID-19 CURE grant funding. The projected revenue to expenditure deficit in FY2020 is the result of the Carle ruling, the early receipt of IDPH Health Protection grant funding in FY2019 for FY2020 expenditures, and the potential draw on fund balance of \$15,000 if necessary. At the time of budget preparation, it was not expected that an additional draw on fund balance would be necessary for COVID related expenditures due to the receipt of grant funding.

The FY2021 budget includes the continuation of IDPH COVID-19 Crisis grant funding, appropriation for Smile Healthy, the Board of Health's allocation of costs for the County's Enterprise Resource Planning software to be implemented in FY2021, and emergency fund appropriation of \$15,000. The Board of Health recognizes there may be occasions where they request CUPHD to provide services above and beyond the scope of the contract. Any request for emergency services covered by this fund would require authorization of the County Board of Health's Chair.

SmileHealthy, a Program of Promise Healthcare Child Dental Access Program Champaign County Board of Health Fiscal Year 2021 Program Narrative and Budget

SmileHealthy will provide comprehensive dental care for income eligible county children in a number of different ways to maximize the number of children we can reach:

- dental home through our dental center and Urbana School Health Center dental clinic
- mobile dental exam, hygiene and sealant clinics
- mobile restorative care clinics
- education programs from individual and family counseling to day care providers to full school assemblies.
- comprehensive specialty care for children

In Fiscal Year 2021 with the Board of Health Grant we expect to serve over 1500 low income county children unique to this grant. Plus we will reach at least 2000 additional county residents through our education and outreach efforts.

SmileHealthy is proposing a program for the coming year that can accomplish significant care and prevention within the Champaign County Board of Health's Budget. We are requesting \$50,000.

Programs and services listed below may be possible only through the support of Board of Health funding, providing services to county children that might otherwise go without.

Child Dental Access Program - Dental Center Staff & Volunteer Dentists

SmileHealthy will offer clinic days each month to income eligible children with our staff and volunteer providers throughout the county and at our dental center to create a dental home for those who might otherwise go without. **750 dental visits**

<u>Sealant Dental Clinic Program – Staff and Volunteer Providers</u>

This program provides comprehensive preventive services to children of <u>all grades</u> through high school at school during the school day. The program in addition to providing an important public health service to the children served, assists schools with state requirements to have a dental exam on all kindergarteners, second graders and sixth graders. **150 children seen**

The Sealant program is regulated by the Illinois Department of Public Health Division of Oral Health and the Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services.

Dental Health Education

Educational programs include offering and coordinating full school assemblies on oral health care, speaking in classrooms, organizing an educational outreach program to day care providers and small groups like girl scouts, individual and family counseling, media events, community fairs and festivals and the ADA's Give Kids a Smile with the Illini Dental Society & C-UPHD.

We provide a new toothbrush to everyone seen in all of our programs including most educational events. Usually we provide a kit that includes a toothbrush, toothpaste and floss. These kits are very popular and may be the only dental supplies some children receive. We have repeatedly heard of children in homes with no toothbrushes or only one old one to share. This is an important part of our public health mission to improve oral health care.
