

**INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF CHAMPAIGN,
ILLINOIS AND CHAMPAIGN COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE REGARDING THE USE OF
OPIOID SETTLEMENT FUNDS FOR THE PURCHASE OF AED FIRST RESPONDER
EQUIPMENT**

This AGREEMENT is entered into by and between the County of Champaign, Illinois ("County"); and the Champaign County Sheriff's Office ("Sheriff's Office"), hereinafter collectively referred to as "the Parties," regarding funding for first responder equipment effective on the last date signed by a Party hereto.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the County has received opioid settlement funds and desires to utilize those funds to support evidence-based and high-impact strategies in response to the opioid crisis, including public safety interventions; and

WHEREAS, the Champaign County Sheriff's Office provides law enforcement and emergency response services throughout Champaign County and is often among the first responders to arrive on scene for medical emergencies which may involve opioid-impacted individuals; and

WHEREAS, the Sheriff's Office seeks to purchase eight Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) to equip their remaining squad vehicles in its fleet; and

WHEREAS, AEDs assist first responders in providing immediate lifesaving intervention during cardiac arrest and other medical emergencies, including emergencies associated with opioid overdose and polysubstance use; and

WHEREAS, access to AEDs throughout the Sheriff's Office fleet will strengthen emergency response capacity, particularly in rural areas of Champaign County where transport times may be extended; and

WHEREAS, the County recognizes the importance of timely and effective first responder interventions in overdose scenarios and other medical emergencies and wishes to allocate a portion of its opioid settlement funds to support the Sheriff's Office's acquisition of these lifesaving devices; and

WHEREAS, such provision of opioid settlement funding shall be construed as a subaward, with Sheriff's Office as the subrecipient, and this Agreement construed as a subrecipient agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the mutual covenants hereafter set forth, the Parties agree as follows:

SECTION 1. PREAMBLE

The foregoing preambles are hereby incorporated into this Agreement as if fully restated in this Section 1.

SECTION 2. COUNTY agrees to the following:

1. COUNTY shall provide Sheriff's Office a one-time payment of \$17,489.40 in opioid settlement funding to assist with purchasing eight (8) Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) for Sheriff's Office squad vehicles to support Champaign County opioid-impacted individuals and communities. Sheriff's Office acknowledges that this is a one-time payment and that future funding must be formally requested.
2. COUNTY shall provide Sheriff's Office a copy of Final Distributor Settlement Agreement (Schedules A and B of Exhibit E of the Opioid Settlement Agreement, attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein as Attachment C and shall provide Sheriff's Office with updates as to any additional terms, conditions, or related communications from the Illinois Department of Human Services and by the Illinois Office of Opioid Settlement Administration.

SECTION 3. Sheriff's Office agrees to the following:

1. Sheriff's Office agrees to utilize the \$17,489.40 in opioid settlement funding from the County to purchase eight (8) Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) and related equipment necessary for their deployment and use.
2. Sheriff's Office agrees to comply with all applicable federal, state, and local statutes, rules, regulations, and guidelines governing the use, management, and reporting of opioid settlement funds, including all requirements set forth in Attachments C and D by the Illinois Department of Human Services and by the Illinois Office of Opioid Settlement Administration.
3. Sheriff's Office agrees to provide an update, as requested by the Opioid Settlement Task Force, for one year from the date the funds are disbursed; should the Task Force cease to exist, the reporting form shall be provided to the Champaign County Board Justice and Social Services Committee. The Champaign County Board or any of its committees may request an in-person review of the reporting form and

services provided by Sheriff's Office at any point during the year. The update should clarify how the approved equipment served opioid-impacted individuals, the effectiveness of the equipment, and any success stories and/or feedback. Proof of purchase must be provided upon request by Champaign County.

4. Sheriff's Office certifies that it is not debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment or permanent inclusion on the Illinois Stop Payment List, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in the award as set forth in Attachments C and D or in this Agreement by any federal department or agency, or by the State of Illinois.
5. Sheriff's Office will spend these allotted funds on the approved equipment within one (1) year of the date this Agreement takes effect.

SECTION 4. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. Compliance

Sheriff's Office shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws and regulations related to the approved use of opioid settlement funding.

2. Record-Keeping

Sheriff's Office shall maintain records of all purchases made with the provided funds for a minimum of three (3) years and shall make such records available to the County upon request. The County may conduct a financial or programmatic review to verify the appropriate use of provided funds.

3. Amendments

This AGREEMENT may be amended only by writing signed by both parties.

4. Duration; Termination

This AGREEMENT shall remain in effect for one year from the date of payment.

5. Repayment and Misuse of Funds

If Sheriff's Office is found to have used funds for unauthorized purposes or fails to provide the required report, the County reserves the right to take appropriate corrective action consistent with applicable law and County policy.
