CHAMPAIGN COUNTY JAIL 2005 INSPECTION REPORT ADDENDUM

Criminal Justice Specialist Brad Besson inspected the Champaign County Jail on June 8, 2005. The entrance and exit interviews were conducted with Captain James Young. Program Coordinator Griffin provided additional comments.

IMPROVEMENTS SINCE LAST INSPECTION

- An ongoing remodeling project in the indoor recreation area is progressing ahead of schedule. A
 new basketball rim and backboard have been added. The final painting and installation of security
 equipment should be completed by mid-summer.
- 2. The University of Illinois is now coordinating volunteer assistance for the inmate library program. Both the college and private citizen groups have provided an allotment of new books. The volunteer groups have no access to the detainee population.
- 3. The downtown facility can now provide pre-trial, high risk and/or mental health initial pleadings via a closed circuit video loop system similar to the set-up at the South Leirman facility.
- 4. The Family Services Center of Champaign County now provides the "Grow Program". The program is designed to instruct detainees in such issues as anger management, social situational coping skills, resume assistance and job interview skills.
- 5. As required by Section 701.90, of the *Illinois County Jail Standards*, training in mental health issues and suicide prevention must be provided annually. Beginning June 20, 2005, HPL (Health Professionals Limited) began providing mental health training of staff and also began the assessment and treatment of detainees in need of mental health counseling. According to Jail Administrator Young, HPL has provided training and documentation. You are to be commended on your quick compliance to the standard

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. During the 2004 inspection of this facility, it was noted that funding had been secured to provide a fenced in evacuation/outdoor recreation area at the South Leirman annex. It is recommended that this addition be completed by the 2006 inspection.
- 2. The jail's operations manual should be reviewed to assure compliance with the new *Illinois County Jail Standards* effective October 1, 2004.
- 3. The structure of the downtown facility's roofline allows rain to leak into some of the cellblocks. Consideration should be given to that portion of the structure.

INSPECTOR'S COMMENTS

- 1. The population of the jail is split into two separate buildings. The downtown jail is the older of the two buildings. The South Leirman Street facility was built in 1995. The 18-bed dorm in the downtown facility was constructed prior to the 1988 standards and therefore does not comply.
- 2. The medical services are contracted through Health Professionals Limited (HPL). The medical unit is staffed with 5 registered nurses. HPL provides health services for the South Leirman facility and the juvenile detention center. HPL's doctor visits the facilities twice per week to follow up from sick call. The RNs conduct sick call daily.
- Both the downtown and South Leirman annex are equipped with closed circuit vidoe monitors to assist in pre-trial and high risk arrignment proceedings.
- 4. Food services are contracted through Aramark. Meals are cooked at the Leirman annex and transported to the downtown facility and the juvenile detention center. The kitchen is inspected by the Champaign County Health Department yearly
- 5. A fire safety officer has been appointed and coordinates with the Urbana Fire Department to conduct yearly tours and simulated fire
- 6. Visits are determined by pod and status. At least one visit is offered on a weekend day. General population detainees visit on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday.
- 7. Two full time mental health counselors are provided by the Mental Health Center of Champaign County. According to Jail Administrator Young, beginning June 20, 2005, HPL will be providing this service as well as a part time psychiatrist.
- 8. The program coordinator is in charge of detainee classification, special needs, AA/NA programs etc.
- 9. Parkland College provides literacy and GED preperation and testing.
- 10. Both indoor and outdoor recreation is available. Smoking is prohibited in the jail.
- 11. The jail was clean and the staff professional and attentive.
